



Foundation Announces Awards

♦ The Pi Kappa Alpha Memorial Foundation Trustees, immediately after their annual spring meeting, announced the establishment of additional awards. Two will be presented through Southwestern-at-Memphis College, and five will go to the chapter in each region of the United States which shows greatest improvement in scholastic average.

The Summey Award is a \$100.00 grant to an incoming male Freshman student at Southwestern-at-Memphis College. The selection will be made by the Faculty Committee on Admissions and Student Aid, and will be based on Christian character, good citizenship, academic accomplishment, and need. A similar award, named in honor of President Emeritus Dr. Charles E. Diehl, will be presented to a female first-year student.

Dr. George Summey, in 1869, was the first initiate of Beta Chapter at Davidson College, Davidson, North Carolina. He became a powerful leader in the South as a Presbyterian minister and author. He served as President of Southwestern Presbyterian University, Clarksville, Tennessee, which subsequently became Southwestern-at-Memphis. He continued his interest in and work for the Fraternity throughout his 101 years of life.

The friendship and interest of Dr. Summey, coupled with that of Dr. Charles E. Diehl, the then president, was instrumental in the donation to the Memorial Foundation of the property on which the Memorial Headquarters was erected. The outstanding character of these two Christian gentlemen is worthy of emulation by all who benefit by these awards.

The trustees are developing a program which will stimulate better scholarship on the part of the fraternity chapters. As part of this, they are giving \$50.00 contributions to the chapter in each of the five regions of the United States which shows the most improvement in this area each year. The money will be used to purchase books for the chapter library.

National Educational Advisor Dean Ted Biddle of the University of Pittsburgh, announces the 1957 winners (based on the 1955-56 academic year) as follows:

Region I (Ohio-East)—Beta-Epsilon, Western Reserve, Cleveland, Ohio, 29.84% Improvement.

Sigma, Bradley University, Peoria, Illinois, 14.74% Improvement.

Region III (Southwest)—Xi, University of South Carolina, Columbia, S. C., 11.37% Improvement.

Region IV (Mid-South)—Alpha-Pi, Howard College, Birmingham, Alabama, 14.84% Improvement.

Region V (West)—Gamma-Kappa, Montana State College, Bozeman, Montana, 12.90% Improvement.

Christofferson Scholarship Established

♦ The trustees of the Pi Kappa Alpha Memorial Foundation have announced the establishment of the "John Mouns Christofferson Scholarship" in honor of John Christofferson, who had a fatal heart attack November 14, 1952, while a student member of Gamma Chapter at the College of William and Mary.

John was an extremely popular student on campus and in the fraternity. His death came as quite a shock to his many friends. Gamma Chapter made the initial contribution to the Memorial

Foundation toward the scholarship and the trustees have earmarked additional funds. Details of the award and its terms are being worked out in conjunction with John's parents, Dr. and Mrs. E. A. Christofferson, 630 North Elmwood, Oak Park, Illinois. Dr. Christofferson is a prominent surgeon and John was taking pre-medical work preparatory for a medical career. The award will likely be for a scholarship in the pre-medical field.


While still a boy, John developed a rheumatic heart condition. In his junior year in high school he enrolled in Southern Arizona School for Boys, a fine preparatory school in Tucson, Arizona. Dr. Russell B. Fairgrieve, Headmaster, writes that John was a "quiet, competent chap who never pushed himself forward, but was always on hand when a job needed doing." An able student, he won scholarship recognition in both his junior and senior years. At commencement, he was awarded the Bausch and Lomb Science Medal as the senior who, in the estimation of the faculty, had shown the most promise in science during his prep school career.

He entered the College of William and Mary, Williamsburg, Virginia, in the fall of 1950 on a scholarship earned through his academic work. He accepted a bid to the Pi Kappa Alpha Fraternity and became one of its most loyal and ardent members. His sudden death was a shock to his many friends in the fraternity and on campus. Dean Farrar stated, "John represented in an unusually fine way the American college fraternity man."

It is hoped that others will likewise be interested in contributing to this fund, which will serve as a living memorial and will be of benefit through the years to other worthy college men preparing themselves for the medical profession.




John M. Christofferson

The Cover

Our front cover unveils the outstanding chapter house being erected for Alpha-Eta Chapter at the University of Florida by its alumni through their house corporation. It is located on University Avenue directly across from the campus. The Gainesville architectural firm has provided a 21,000 square foot fraternity house which accommodates a maximum of seventy men. One hundred can be seated comfortably in the dining room, and the social areas will handle as many as four hundred people. The brick exterior walls, aluminum awning windows, and concrete construction all insure safety and low maintenance expense. The total project including land value and furnishings will exceed \$250,000.

The construction of this house has been made possible through the diligent labors of the house corporation officers through the years such as William Graham and others. Current house corporation officers are: President John H. Hintz, Secretary-Treasurer William N. Long, Directors Charles T. Boyd, Dan C. Labry, Dr. Neal Powell. Chairman of the Fund Raising is Al Rogero, 301 South Missouri Avenue, Clearwater, Fla.

Our back cover carries the new home of Gamma-Tau Chapter at Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute, Troy, New York. It will provide sleeping accommodations for sixty-five men. It is unique in its ar-

angement. There are three dormitory sections plus a utility unit housing the heating and bath facilities. The present house will be used for dining and social areas. This portion ultimately will be replaced by new construction. The building is located on a beautiful, large wooded lot. The total project has a value of \$160,000. House corporation personnel are: President George Shako, Vice President Lewis Coonley, Treasurer William De Mers, Jr., Secretary Robert D. 
**Alpha-Rho, Ohio State University








Delta-Zeta, Memphis State University, Memphis, Tenn.

Alpha-Omega Dream Coming True

◆ "Twas down in Old Virginny where PiKA began"—and it's out in Manhattan, Kansas where one of its flourishing chapters, Alpha-Omega of Kansas State College, currently is planning a fine new chapter home to house sixty-five men.

Just as our national fraternity takes pride in its founders and its many years of tradition and accomplishment, so too does Alpha-Omega look back with pride and fond memories, and looks forward with determination and ambition.

The present house at 331 N. 17th street has been home to over 350 PiKAs since the days of World War I. The house was substantially enlarged in the middle twenties, and since that time has housed thirty-nine men. Alpha-Omega, like many other chapters, began to bulge at the seams after World War II and the Korean fracas ended, and the chapter now runs from fifty-five to sixty-five men, with a good many having to live outside the house.

Realizing the weaknesses in this situation, both actives and alumni began to

stir restlessly and to do something about it some six or seven years ago. For the last four years the actives have been assessing themselves a "head tax" of \$3 per month per man toward a new house. A continuous campaign by mail was launched by the Pi Kappa Alpha Association, the official alumni body of Alpha-Omega, about three years ago—with fair results. Three beautiful lots, forming one big tract, were purchased about two blocks west of the main campus. These lots are fully paid for and it is for this site that Brother Art Scott has designed our new "dream home."


But it must be more than a dream, so the alumni began this spring to gear up much more intensively in their drive for funds. Brother Fred Huey, a Manhattan resident, was secured for a minimum of two months to contact in person every PiKA in Kansas and in the immediate surrounding states. Through this effort, it is hoped that contracts can be let in the next few months and that the men of Alpha-Omega can occupy their new home at the start of school in September, 1958.

How did this tall tree grow from a tiny acorn? Well, let's refer to the records of Ward S. Gates, chapter secretary, in those distant but ever-bright days of 1913. Thirteen close friends organized the Phi Gamma Theta fraternity February 18,


1911. A house was rented the following fall. They were admitted to the Panhellenic Council in the spring of 1913 and immediately devoted all of their energies to petitioning Pi Kappa Alpha. Several of the members had friends in Pi Kappa Alpha, so "knowing of her aristocratic position and high ideals they urged the brothers to petition this Noble Southern Order." After a period of feverish activity and inspection by the powers that be, a charter was granted to Alpha-Omega Chapter June 14, 1913. Pi Kappa Alpha was the third national fraternity on the Kansas State College campus.

In a recent communication the Executive Secretary had the following to say: "Alpha-Omega Chapter had men of character and leadership as its charter members. Successive generations of college members have upheld the high standards of the chapter's founders. It has been consistently one of the steady, dependable chapters in Pi Kappa Alpha. It will be most fitting to see the completion of your beautiful new chapter house as a result of your fine work through the years."

Of such are fine dreams made. But the actives of Alpha-Omega and the more than 400 alumni of this sturdy chapter have vowed that the dream must become a reality, and that a new chapter home must and will be built very soon.







♦ In a spring meeting two years ago a group of Pi Kappa Alpha fraternity brothers of Beta-Omicron comprising the new house committee met with the chapter housing corporation and with Brother J. Phil Burns, a prominent alumnus and outstanding fund raiser in the state of Oklahoma, for the purpose of starting a fund-raising campaign for a new chapter house needed greatly by Beta-Omicron. Brother Burns enthusiastically agreed to set up and assist in carrying out such a campaign; however, he was involved in several other campaigns at that time and was not able to start on ours until this last year.

In the spring of 1956 Brother Burns again met with the corporation and at this meeting outlined his entire campaign. His plans were received with enthusiasm and were adopted. At this meet-

ing arrangements were made to compile and print a brochure; to engage the architectural firms of Baily, Bozalis, and Associates (John Bozalis, Beta-Lambda) and Valburg, Palmer, and Valburg (Bob and Julian Valburg, Beta-Omicron) for the purpose of beginning work on the preliminary plans for the new house; to complete the legal steps necessary in setting up the Beta-Omicron Foundation and to register it with the Department of Internal Revenue so that donations would be tax deductible; to print and issue for sale \$75,000 worth of 3% debenture bonds; and to have the chapter compile an accurate and complete mailing list.

In another meeting that spring the members of the corporation met with the architects and discussed what the chapter wanted and needed in the new house. By September all of the preliminary objectives had been accomplished. J. F. Malone designed and Henry C. Jones printed the beautiful and inspiring new house brochure. Under the legal counsel of T. R. Benedum the Beta-Omicron Foundation was established. Seventy-five thousand dollars worth of bonds, a question and answer pamphlet, and all other necessary literature had been printed. Trustees and governors for the campaign's districts had been selected and approved.

The campaign was now ready to roll.

On November 1, 1956 the kick-off dinner took place in the plush Beacon Club in Oklahoma City. The program for the campaign was thoroughly explained at the dinner, which was completely paid for by Brother Burns.

We are deeply indebted to Brother Burns, without whose zealous energies, resourcefulness, ingenuity, and financial support the campaign could not have been successfully completed. It is because of men like him and Joe C. Scott, J. F. Malone, D. H. Grisso, Pat Pugh, the members of the Beta-Omicron Foundation, the district governors and trustees, and all those who gave so freely of their time and money that construction will soon begin on Beta-Omicron's new chapter house.

The house, which will be located in O. U.'s new fraternity and sorority district, will be a modern ranch-style home costing around \$200,000. It will house seventy-two men and will provide a suite of rooms for the housemother. The two-man rooms will feature built-in furniture and room-wide closets and windows. There will be a sun deck, large patio, and a basement club room for relaxation and recreation. Also included in the house will be a study hall and a business office for the chapter. Since the lot on which we are building is one of the largest on the campus, more than adequate parking facilities will be available.

Brotherhood International

♦ When the Hungarian revolt began in the latter part of last year, it became necessary for many Hungarian college students to flee their native land and seek refuge in other countries. Having accepted several thousand of these refugees, the United States government was faced with the problem of placing them in universities throughout the nation. In helping to alleviate this problem, the University of Oklahoma working through the foreign students board and the Interfraternity Council agreed to establish scholarships as far as tuition was concerned.

It was necessary, however, to find some means of providing room and board for these students. The call for help went out through the Interfraternity Council, and naturally Beta-Omicron of Pi Kappa Alpha was one of the first to volunteer. These students, for whom several fraternities are providing homes, had been carefully screened and were purported to be of the best character. All of these students had completed what is known in Hungary as the "gymnasium," an institution which is approximately equivalent to an American junior college. The main barrier to a continuance of their educa-

tion in this country lay in the fact that having lived behind the iron curtain, they knew little, if any, English. For this reason they were to enroll in fifteen hours of concentrated English, three hours of lecture and twelve hours of laboratory.

It was not without certain misgivings that several of the brothers went to the Oklahoma City airport to meet the plane which was bringing us a Hungarian college student, a young man who had been raised in an environment so foreign from ours, who spoke none of our language, and about whom we knew practically

nothing. Actually we were more afraid of what we might do to him than of what he might do to us. To take anyone who knew very little of the American way of life and nothing of American college life and place him within the fraternal confines of a typical Pi Kappa Alpha house would be, to say the least, a tremendous change.

Upon their arrival at the airport in Oklahoma City, the students were met by Dr. Stephen F. Borhegyi, a Hungarian-speaking member of the University of Oklahoma faculty, who introduced them to the representatives of the various fraternities. It was at this time that we first met Istvan Kuhn, a twenty-six year old civil engineering student from Budapest, Hungary.

Fortunately, one of our pledges spoke a remarkable amount of Hungarian and

thus was able to converse with him. Istvan is a very pleasant fellow who has adapted himself very well to college life here at the University of Oklahoma. When not studying, he can usually be found in front of our television set. In order to supplement his rather inadequate wardrobe, the Pi Kappa Alpha Scholarship Foundation through its administrator, Dr. Thurman White, Dean of the University of Oklahoma Extension Division, presented Istvan with a seventy-five dollar check.

The members and pledges of Beta-Omicron are very proud of our part in helping Istvan toward the completion of his education, and we feel that our lives have been made fuller and our knowledge broadened through our association with him.

February 10th. *The Daily Oklahoman*, *The Norman Transcript*, and other state newspapers carried articles describing the project and lauding the chapter and the pledge class for their work. Perhaps the most outstanding publicity derived from this undertaking was a resolution passed by the state senate commending our chapter for these services rendered a state institution.

We feel that the project was very successful and intend to continue this policy in the future. In addition to the publicity we received, we feel that the chapter benefited in several ways: the internal organization of our pledge class was strengthened; the members and pledges, through working together for a worthy cause, were brought much closer together; and the actives and pledges collectively and individually have the satisfaction of a job well done.

Beta-Omicron Stages First Awards Dinner



Florida's Finest — One of IKA's Best

♦ The cover picture of this issue shows the largest, finest and most costly fraternity house ever built on the University of Florida campus in Gainesville.

Target date for the completion of the \$220,000 house is October 1, 1957.

Construction of the house, north of the University campus, culminates planning begun after World War II by the Alpha-Eta House Corporation, composed of alumni and the SMC of the chapter.

In 1918 Alpha-Eta built its present house, located directly across from the University campus. It was the first fraternity house ever constructed at the University of Florida, after the University moved from Lake City to Gainesville in 1904, the year Alpha-Eta was founded. Since then Alpha-Eta has initiated over 1,100 brothers into Pi Kappa Alpha.

The new house will accommodate seventy-two men, with eighteen two-man rooms and four three-man rooms on the second floor and a dormitory type room, capable of housing twenty-four men.

Total area of the house is 21,370 square feet. A basement recreation floor accounts for 2,640 square feet, with the first floor totaling 8,100 square feet. The first floor includes a foyer and hall, housemother's suite, library, a 2,500 square foot living room, dining room and kitchen and storage room. The dining room has a capacity of from 300 to 400.

The building is designed in modified

Georgian Colonial with brick exterior walls, built-up white gravel roof and aluminum awning windows.

Furnishings expense for the house will amount to \$17,000.

An alumni fund raising campaign is headed by Al Rogero, Clearwater insurance man, who was a star football player for the University. He is a member of the Florida State Road Board, high appointive position in state government.


The construction is being financed through alumni funds, from the sale of the present property, and assistance from our National Office. The property was sold in the fall of 1956 for \$135,000.


Funds are being raised from the

alumni and parents of the active chapter through the issuance of debenture bonds. These bonds may be endorsed to the House Corporation if the bondholders wish to contribute funds. 

♦ Beta-Mu Chapter at the University of Texas, after only four years in a brand new house, has fulfilled its dreams with the opening of a new wing containing 6,000 square feet. This addition has put the home of Pi Kappa Alpha, already an Austin showplace, even further above any other fraternity house at the University of Texas.

The completed house contains 39 rooms, is valued at just under \$200,000, and is completely air conditioned. It houses 38 of the 105 active members in two-man rooms designed with center storage walls which allow for late studying without disturbing the sleeping roommate.

There is a completely new recreation and music room, library and chapter

room paneled in Filipino mahogany, basement pool room and storage room, and two patios. The old dining room and kitchen were doubled in size and a chapter office was added. The house also includes a living room and a two-room apartment for the housemother.

A small, roofed, garden-type patio on the north side of the house is separated from the recreation and dining rooms by sliding glass doors. The south patio is a completely walled terrace opening onto both the music and dining rooms.

The entire downstairs of the house and the two patios are designed to be used for social affairs by opening the large sliding doors between the rooms. Parties given for the Zeta Tau Alpha, Chi Omega, Delta Delta Delta, Alpha Delta Pi, Alpha Phi and other sororities have proven the value of the well-designed entertainment areas.

The beautiful new house made a pleasant backdrop for the Pi Kappa Alpha entry in the University's annual Aggie Sign Contest. The 20 foot tall longhorn steer of papier-mache was dressed in a football uniform and leaning on a crutch. While blood was being pumped into the steer's left arm, the right foot was pushing an Aggie's head down into an open grave. Complete with moving parts and specially recorded music, the sign gave Beta-Mu its third consecutive first place trophy in the highly competitive contest.


Founders' Day gave many of the alums from all over the state their first chance to see the newly enlarged chapter house. A focal point of interest to all was the complete set of pictures of past SMC's which has been placed on the library walls. The beautifully painted fraternity crest on the living room wall was also admired by visiting alumni and their wives as they toured the house during a dance given in their honor.

At a meeting during Founders' Day, the newly organized Garnet and Gold Educational Trust evaluated the results of the summer campaign to raise \$85,000 to be invested by the tax-free organization. Income from the investments will be used to give scholarships to University students.



Richmond Chapter Builds Lodge

◆ Fifty years of work were climaxed last September when Omicron moved into its new lodge. The ground breaking for Omicron's lodge, the newest house on fraternity row, took place in April of 1956. Built at a cost of \$25,000, it is located at Number Six College Road. The following excerpt from the May 24 issue of *The Collegian*, campus newspaper, explains the brothers' and the University's pride in Omicron's new lodge: "Last year the fifth lodge was completed and there is no one on campus who can deny that the last lodge is superior in facilities and appearances to the others."

The building fund was begun in 1907, but it fell behind expectations until 1953. In 1953 the fund drive was intensified and \$4,000 was collected that year. In 1955 Brothers T. Carter Coates and Nazem Abraham met with Mike West, Temple Broaddus, and Paul Byrne to coordinate a new building fund program. Under the leadership of this committee, nearly \$7,000 was solicited or pledged for Omicron's building fund.

The chapter then secured a \$7,500 loan from the University of Richmond. This left a deficit of \$5,000 which was filled when ten alumni signed a note for the remaining amount. The committee then proceeded to draw up plans and secure a contractor. The corner lot on the south side of fraternity row was secured from the University and the ground breaking ceremonies were held on April 7, 1956. The lodge was completed by the beginning of the 1956-57 term, and it was for-

mally dedicated during the Homecoming celebration in October.

The diligent work and contributions of the alumni under the leadership of William Bagby, Guy Borkey, Temple Broaddus, treasurer of the House Corporation; Dr. William Fitzhugh, Moses D. Nunnally, Jr., Ashton Patterson, president of the House Corporation; Clinton Shephard, and Mike West made the lodge a reality. The active brothers are deeply indebted to the support of the alumni who have given Omicron the best chapter house on the campus.

Wofford College Provides New Lodge System

◆ During the last weekend of April, Nu Chapter climaxed six years of active membership with the Fraternity on the Wofford campus. Nu Chapter was established in 1891 but fraternities were banished by an act of the State Legislature in 1906. Not until 1951 did the chapter once again renew the charter on the Wofford campus.

During the year 1951, the fraternities on the Wofford campus were housed in miscellaneous dormitories and buildings. Some were located in army barracks that were built for emergency housing during the second World War. With these conditions existing, accommodations were bad.

From 1951 until September 1956, Nu Chapter had occupied the second floor

of the Kappa Sigma House. The house was on one electrical circuit, and often the lights would go out because of the overload of power. This was very disconcerting, especially at night.

The chapter was paying \$35.00 per month to the Kappa Sigmas, who were adding \$5.00 to this in order to pay for the house. In the meantime, many ideas were discussed about accommodations for the Wofford fraternities. One idea was that of building small lodges on the campus.

In 1955 Doctor Robert A. Brent, then dean of students, encouraged the idea of building these lodges. The Board of Trustees, during spring semester of 1954-55, decided the idea was sound. Several local firms placed their bids for the construction of the lodges. The lowest bid for each of seven lodges was \$14,500.00. Mr. John Curry, Superintendent of Ground and Buildings for Wofford, estimated his maintenance crew would be able to complete the construction of the lodges for \$10,700.00. This was approximately \$4,000.00 less than the bid from the local contractors.

Each of the lodges was to have a living room, a chapter room, which also serves as a den, bedroom accommodation for two men, kitchen facilities and two bathrooms. The architectural style chosen was that of the colonial motif and interiors complete with pine paneling and ceramic tile showers. Construction was begun in the spring of 1955, and the lodges were ready for occupancy in the fall of 1956.

The lodges are centrally located on the campus between the Science Hall and the Library. They are arranged in a horseshoe formation with approximately half an acre of trees and lawn in front of the group. The "Pikas," along with the other fraternities, held open house in the fall to present to the faculty, administration and friends the newly furnished lodges.

Mr. Curry and a crew of ten men com-





Fraternity Sections in University Facilities





Wake Forest Builds Fraternity Sections

♦ When Wake Forest College moved from its old site in 1956 to the new campus, the 123-year-old institution acquired a \$20 million home, finest in its history. The move also provided the ten fraternity chapters at Wake Forest with their finest quarters.

Chapter housing became an integral part of a philosophy aimed at making the entire student body a well-knit family.

Dominating the campus is Wait Chapel, center of religious activities. At the opposite end of a plaza area headed by the Chapel is Reynolda Hall, where administrative and student offices are located along with dining facilities and a few classrooms.

Between these massive buildings lie four dormitories which house 1,500 men. It is in these dorms that the fraternity


chapters are housed, housed in a manner which doesn't threaten the individuality or closeness of any particular fraternity group.

The dormitories are U-shaped. Fraternities are housed at the ends of the U's and at corners at the "bottoms" of the U's.

At ground level each fraternity has a spacious chapter room, game room with inset cooking facilities containing a stove and refrigerator, an office and powder room. All living quarters are on higher levels. Rooms to accommodate the entire chapter membership are provided immediately above and adjacent to the chapter and game rooms, chapters with larger memberships simply acquiring more suites along the "U."

The Gamma-Phi Chapter quarters are among the handsomest on the campus. Aided by an interior decorator, the members have created a tasteful, pleasant atmosphere. One of the items that catches your eye as you enter is a well-filled trophy case.

The following social fraternities are represented in this unique housing arrangement: Alpha Sigma Phi, Delta Sigma Phi, Kappa Alpha, Kappa Sigma, Lambda Chi Alpha, Pi Kappa Alpha, Sigma Chi, Sigma Phi Epsilon, Sigma Pi and Theta Chi.







Aims of American Education

Editor's Note: This article appeared in a recent issue of The Circle of Omicron Delta Kappa. Brother Tolley is an alumnus of Alpha-Chi Chapter at Syracuse University.

◆ In a recent report by Dr. William P. Tolley, Allegheny O Δ K, chancellor of Syracuse University, to the Board of Trustees, he discusses certain differences in the educational systems of the United States and other countries.

The first distinguishing mark cited is American education's interest in the individual, whether he be gifted, of average intelligence, or handicapped. The second is a concern for democratic ideals and social justice, especially the accent given in American education to human values. "The charge is sometimes made," he points out, "that we have a materialistic, Godless culture, interested only in gadgets and comic books. However, our foreign students, particularly those from Asia, are the first to remind us that ours is a culture extraordinarily sensitive to human needs and social justice."

The third distinguishing mark of American education discussed by Dr. Tolley is its attention to social change. He considers a point of strength rather than weakness the criticism that American education is "too responsive to community and national needs" and "our desire to keep up with the times instead of the timeless."

The concern for improving methods of teaching and ways of learning is the fourth distinguishing mark of American education noted by Dr. Tolley. "This divine discontent," he believes, "is one of the reasons why American professional schools . . . are the best in the world."

Other characteristics of American education listed by Dr. Tolley are the adult education movement which he calls "one of the wonders of our time"; decentralized citizen control of education, which he believes to be the "key . . . to our flexibility and strength"; the developing partnership between industry and education; the growth in research; and the

blending of vocational and general education, "which we tend to take for granted but which is one of the signal differences between our system of education and that of most other countries." He believes this feature of American education "has saved us from the course of intellectual snobbery and the peculiar form of academic other-worldliness that makes the elite of other lands so isolated from sweat and dirt and human problems."

Dr. Tolley concludes: ". . . we should bring the energy and strength of the American schools to backward areas on every continent through carefully planned long range programs adequately financed. This is not to say that we should impose our culture on the rest of the world. This is not to encourage a feeling of arrogance, conceit, or undue national pride. But if we desire a world free and at peace, the best elements of American education must be shared with all who need and want them. And we must help to pay the bill."

Maxwell, Head of American Bar Association, Named IIKA "Man of the Year"

♦ As head of what has been termed "the most powerful professional association in America," David F. Maxwell, BII, Philadelphia lawyer and civic leader, was named "Man of the Year" by Pi Kappa Alpha when he was selected as the 1957 recipient of the National Achievement Award.

Brother Maxwell is currently President of the American Bar Association.

Presentation of the award was made at a Philadelphia Alumni Association dinner, at Beta-Pi Chapter house at the University of Pennsylvania.

Brother Maxwell, a charter member of Beta-Pi, was born and educated in Philadelphia and holds a long list of honors gathered in his native city. In addition, he has held increasingly responsible posts in the American Bar Association over the past 25 years, culminating in his election to the presidency of that influential group in 1956.

Presentation of the National Achievement Award, originated and donated by the Chicago Alumni Association, and now awarded through the national fraternity, was made in absentia by David C. Powers, Z, Chairman of *The Shield and Diamond Endowment Fund*, and awards committee member, of New York City. Brother Maxwell was confined to his home by illness, but accepted the award later from the hands of W. Craig Armington, BII, president of the Delaware Valley Alumni Association.

In making the National Achievement

Award presentation, Brother Powers gave a brief review of recent IIKA accomplishments, and paid tribute to Brother Maxwell, long an active alumnus of the fraternity in Philadelphia. He cited Brother Maxwell's record of service to the American Bar Association as a member of numerous committees, as Pennsylvania delegate from 1944 to 1952, as Chairman of the Rules and Calendar Committee in 1952, and as Chairman of the House of Delegates from 1952 to 1954.

He has been a member of the National Conference of Lawyers and Representatives of the Trust Division of the American Bankers Association since 1951 and has served on the Editorial Board of the *American Bar Journal* for several years.

In addition, Brother Maxwell has been active in the Philadelphia Bar Association as Chairman of the Unauthorized Practice of Law Committee and member of the Board of Governors.

Among many civic services, he was a member of the task force on legal services and procedure of the Hoover Commission on the Reorganization of the Executive Branch of the Government. He is a past president of the Kiwanis Club of Philadelphia and also a member of the Board of Directors of the Philadelphia Civic Grand Opera Company.

At the University of Pennsylvania, he was president of the Class of 1921 of the Wharton School, and was Editor of the

Pennsylvania Law Review for two years, culminating in his graduation from law school in 1924.

Memberships include Beta Gamma Sigma, St. Andrew's Society, Caveat Club, Bachelors Barge Club and the Union League Club, among others.

He became associated with one of Philadelphia's most prominent legal firms, Edmonds, Obermayer & Rebmann, with offices in the Packard Building, on his graduation from law school and admission to the Bar in 1924. He was admitted to the firm in 1929 and is presently the third ranking partner. One of his senior partners and closest friends since they were charter members of Beta-Pi Chapter is John F. E. Hippel, National President of Pi Kappa Alpha, 1953-56.

Brother Maxwell married Emily Nelson of New York City in 1925, and they have two children. Fairlie Maxwell Pasfield is a graduate of Wellesley and has three children. David O. Maxwell, a graduate of Yale and Harvard Law School, is now in the Navy.

The Story of Our Chapter House Loan Fund

◆ This year marks the 50th birthday of the Pi Kappa Alpha Chapter House Loan Fund. J. Pike Powers, Grand Princeps, was presiding on May 2, 1907 at the National Convention, Jefferson Hotel, Richmond, Virginia, when I. A. Vincent, Z (Tennessee), made the report of the special committee on Chapter Houses. Upon motion by J. Graham Sale the convention adopted a \$1.00 assessment as of November 1 of each year on every student member. The funds were to be expended only upon the order of each convention. The local chapter was required to raise a definite amount of money and in no case was the loan to be greater than one-third of the total cost. In 1913 the assessment was raised to three dollars per man, primarily to provide a \$500.00 grant to Alpha Chapter as a memorial to the founders.

The fund was of great value in assisting numerous chapters in purchasing or building, but the procedure for having loans granted by convention during the rush and pressure proved unsatisfactory. The total funds available for loans usually were divided up in some percentage fashion among the total number of chapters applying for loans. The minutes of the National Convention, Hotel Pennsylvania, New York City, April 21, 1922, illustrate this difficulty. H. N. Eversole, AN (Missouri), the Convention House Loan Committee chairman, reported the following petitions for loans: Beta-Beta (Washington) \$5,000, Alpha-Chi (Syracuse) \$4,000, Pi (Washington and Lee) \$1,200, Beta-Gamma (Kansas) \$5,000, Alpha-Tau (Utah) \$5,000; total, \$20,200. The total amount available for loans was \$10,929.96. The committee recommended that loans be granted as follows: Beta-Beta \$2,500, Alpha-Chi \$2,000, Pi \$1,000, Beta-Gamma \$2,700, Alpha-Tau \$2,700. Total loans granted, \$10,900. You will note that the chapter house fund had a balance of \$29.96 after these loans were granted. If \$5,000 were necessary to consummate the financing of a house purchase or construction, the reduction of the petition to \$2,500 might be fair from the standpoint of distribution, but not helpful for the purpose making the purchase possible.

Despite these difficulties, considerable progress was made in chapter housing. On April 23, 1924, at the National Con-

vention, Hotel Chase, St. Louis, Missouri, Walter C. Barnes, BH (Illinois), presented an excellent report as the first chairman of the *standing committee* on Chapter House Plans. An analysis of 20 of the houses owned by the chapters at that time, showed a purchase cost of \$441,250, with an average equity of 25 per cent at the time of purchase. Some of his words sound very familiar: "The prerequisite of house ownership is a desire on the part of the active chapter to have their own house and that is not as trite as it seems! Your chairman knows one chapter which has wanted a house for five years, but their attitude is this, 'Here we are, alumni, we need a house. What are you going to do about it?', and I know another chapter which when the alumni did not respond, went out and raised \$10,000 from businessmen and friends in the town!" He goes on to urge the establishment of a House Corporation and the election of a *working* Board of Directors with an active Executive Committee composed of preferably a banker, a lawyer, and an advertising man, and the liberal use of prominent alumni.

On September 3, 1936 at the New Orleans National Convention, John L. Packer, BA (Pennsylvania), National Counsel, and chairman of the Constitution and Laws Committee, presented the committee's recommendations for changing the procedure for granting house loans. The revision was adopted and provided for a Chapter House Committee to receive and recommend approval or disapproval of loans to the Supreme Council which had final authority to act. Loans were to be made at 6 per cent interest and retired by amortized payments. The able personnel of the first Chapter House Loan Committee functioning under the new setup were Ernest E. McKeen, BB (Washington), chairman; Everett M. Oxley, AΩ (Kansas State), and Frederick K. Glynn, AX (Syracuse).

On August 30, 1940, at the National Convention in Chicago, a *Chapter House Commission* of three members was established with direct responsibility for supervising all housing and local house corporations. They serve six-year terms, one term expiring at each National Convention every two years. They must be professionally qualified in architecture, construction, engineering, real estate or real estate mortgage financing. This new

form of administration through commissioners has proved very effective. The high quality of the membership of the committee has enabled the Fraternity to make rapid strides in the area of chapter housing. McKeen, Oxley, and P. D. Christian, Jr., BK (Emory), constituted the first commission. Arthur S. Bowes, BΦ (Purdue), also served on the commission.

The per capita assessment for the Chapter House Loan Fund was discontinued in 1935 during the depression years. At the 1946 National Convention, Donald Dole, a student delegate from his dynamic leadership persuaded the Gamma-Pi (Oregon) Chapter, through convention to establish a \$5.00 per capita annual assessment for the Chapter House Loan Fund. This wise decision has tremendously strengthened this phase of the Fraternity operations. During the first 39 years of the existence of the fund up to the 1946 National Convention, the net worth of the fund had built up to \$104,573.19. The 1954 National Convention at Memphis, Tennessee, provided additional funds through the allocation of a portion of each initiation fee. By March 31, 1957, in slightly over 10 years, the net worth of the fund had reached \$464,157.34. Of course, the cost of construction has been rising at a rapid pace, also!

Through the years, almost every chapter of the Fraternity has benefited by a loan from this fund. Forty-six of our 113 chapters are currently financing houses through the fund. Until a few years ago, the maximum amount loaned any chapter was \$5,000. Today, the average loan is in the neighborhood of \$20,000 and the maximum loan has been \$30,000. Although the supply of money has increased rapidly, the demand far outruns the supply.

The present commission is composed of P. D. Christian, Jr., of Atlanta, Georgia, owner of Christian Construction Company, as chairman. The Treasurer is Herbert Miller, retired official of the Pittsburgh-Des Moines Steel Company, Des Moines, Iowa. Brother Miller has effectively directed the affairs of Alpha-Phi (Iowa State) House Corporation since its organization in 1909. The third member of this fine team is Ward Kief of Seattle, Washington. Brother Kief for many years headed the Securities Mortgage Company of Seattle and is currently in the land development business on a large scale as a partner in Raber & Kief, Contractors and Developers.

The Pi Kappa Alpha Fraternity owes a debt of gratitude to all those students and alumni members in the Fraternity who through the years have had the vision and have brought about the necessary legislation to provide these funds which assist our chapters in the purchase or construction of adequate housing.

pletely constructed the houses, both the exteriors and interiors, installing all the electric fixtures, plaster and painting, and finished all of the seven lodges in approximately seven months.

The fraternities pay the school \$531.00 rent per year. The school has assured the chapters that as long as the fraternities remain on the campus the houses will be used expressly for the fraternities. Nu Chapter lodge is completely furnished.

The color scheme for the interior of the lodge is green and tan. The living room draperies are accented in these colors. Furniture in the living room includes a sectional sofa, TV set, bookcase, three small tables, two armchairs, rocking chair, carpet and three lamps. The cost for furnishing this room was approximately \$700.00.

The kitchen is completely furnished with range, refrigerator, table and chairs. Brother Wallace Culp donated the dinette set. Cost for these furnishings—approximately \$250.00.

The bedroom accommodates two men. It has twin beds, a double desk and double dresser. This room was furnished for approximately \$400.00.




