# **Executive Vice President Orians Announces** Changes, Additions to Staff Personnel

On June 1, 1998, Director of Services Eric P. Wulf (University of Iowa, Gamma Nu '92) departed Memorial Headquarters staff after serving the Fraternity for two years in order to pursue career aspirations in Chicago, Illinois. Wulf joined the Fraternity

staff in July 1996 as a chapter consultant. He traveled for one year visiting chapters in the Cumberland, Rockies, and Lone Star Regions, and was also instrumental in the establishment of the Plymouth State University colony. In June 1997 Wulf was appointed, along with R. Chuck Hunt (North Alabama, Theta Alpha '93), to the serve as director of services for the Fraternity. As a director of services, Wulf worked on the development of several new educational initiatives and helped refine the chapter consultant training program. In addition, he also served as liaison to the Risk Awareness Foundation. Wulf graduated from the University of Iowa in May of 1996 with bachelor of arts in political science, and as an undergraduate served Gamma Nu as vice president, rush chairman, and membership educator.

Executive Vice President Orians is pleased to announce the return of six staff members from last year's department of services who will serve the Fraternity in different capacities for the 1998-99 academic year. As reported in the June 1998 edition of the Shield & Diamond, R. Chuck Hunt assumed the position of direc-

# Expansion

# Psi Chapter Returns to North Georgia College & State University

In the cold of winter, back in 1900, a band of eleven men petitioned their small agricultural school in hopes of establishing a second fraternity. Their efforts were aided by Upsilon Chapter at Auburn, the nearest established chapter of that day. On March 19, 1900 Psi Chapter was established at North Georgia Agricultural College in Dahlonega, Georgia.

Over the next 34 years, Psi Chapter would initiate some 282 men into the bonds of Pi Kappa Alpha. At the height of the devastating depression in the 1920s-30s, the State Board of Regents decided to convert the small town school to a junior college. On May 31, 1933, the chapter received a dreaded letter from the Pi Kappa Alpha national headquarters in Atlanta, Georgia. Addressed to the brothers of Psi Chapter, the letter requested that they surrender their charter in light of recent changes at the school. On the evening of Psi's farewell banquet, Dr. John C. Barnes, who was the chapter's very first initiate and chapter advisor, turned over the charter to a member of the Supreme Council.


Although many of the brothers of Psi would remain in touch over the years, the chapter would remain silent for some sixty-four years.

In January 1997, Brother Christopher P. Welch (Georgia Southern, Iota Upsilon '93) was contacted by members of an interest group hoping to establish a chapter of the Pi Kappa Alpha Fraternity on the campus of North Georgia College and State University, as the school was now called.

The members of this group were unaware of two very important facts. The first was that there had once been a chapter on their campus. The second was that Welch, along with Director of Expansion Steve Vincent (Missouri, Alpha Nu '83), had already been in contact with the school in hopes of reviving the silent chapter.

Following a visit by Shad Williams (Oklahoma State, Gamma Chi '90) from Memorial Headquarters, and persuasion from the existing interest group, the school administrators were persuaded that Psi Chapter of Pi Kappa Alpha could no longer be silent.

An expansion team, consisting of Williams and Chuck Hunt (North Alabama, Theta Alpha '93) moved into The Smith House Inn and set out in search for the men that would have the

honor of refounding Psi chapter, ninety-seven years after its original chartering.

Thirty-eight men received the honor of refounding Psi Chapter on June 13, 1998. These men sought to epitomize what Pi Kappa Alpha is all about: scholars, leaders, athletes, and gentlemen.

From the beginning, the brothers of Psi Colony set lofty goals before chartering. These goals were all exceeded through the efforts of every brother in the colony. It should be strongly noted that the colony never lacked in leadership abilities. This could be attributed in part to the strong military influence at NGCSU.

On the evening of June 13, 1998, Psi Chapter was installed. A banquet was held at Gold Creek Country Club celebrating the occasion. Newly initiated brothers, their families and dates enjoyed a moving keynote address given by International President John Michael Williams (Oklahoma State, Gamma Chi '68). The new brothers were especially moved by the presence of two very important guests, Psi brothers George C. Nelms '30 and Thomas L. Waters '29. Brother Welch presented these two men with certificates, thanking them for keeping the faith that Psi would some day return.

The brothers were also honored to have as guests Director of Expansion Hunt, Supreme Council member H. King Buttermore (Vanderbilt, Sigma '63) and Dixie Regional President Jeff Minecci (West Georgia, Eta Sigma '79).

# History of North Georgia College and State University

North Georgia College was founded as a direct result of the great gold rush of California. Actually the first discovery of gold in the U.S. was in Dahlonega, Georgia. Following

this discovery, a branch of the U.S. mint was established in the tiny gold capitol. The mint produced many coins with gold extracted from area mines. Once gold was discovered in California, however, many miners packed up and headed west. Soon after, the U.S. Mint branch closed, leaving its property abandoned. In time the land was given to the State of Georgia for educational purposes. On January 6, 1873 North Georgia Agricultural College was established as a land grant school of agriculture and mechanical arts, with its major focus on mining engineering.

In 1916, the National Defense Act officially established the Army Reserve Officer Training Corps (ROTC). The first graduating class to be commissioned by the Army ROTC numbered 180 officers and graduated in 1920. In 1942, shortly following the U.S. entrance into World War II, one of the first and most well known military units to emerge from North Georgia College's Corps of Cadets began training for war. The "Hell's Angels" was born when 31 North Georgia cadets traveled to Atlanta to take the U.S. Navy's Naval Aviation tests. Twenty-three passed the tests. These cadets enlisted in the Navy and became Naval Aviation Cadets. The cadets received national attention as the only aviation squadron to be totally manned by students from a single school. Whenever a vacancy was created in the squadron, by death or injury, it was filled by another NGC cadet. On September 20, 1952 North Georgia College officially became a Branch General ROTC program. This status meant cadets could be commissioned into any branch of the Armed Forces.

Today, there are approximately 3,200 students attending North Georgia College and State University. Approximately two-thirds of the student body are non-residential, commuting to the campus every day.

# Delta Epsilon Rechartered at University of Tennessee at Chattanooga

Delta Epsilon Chapter of Pi Kappa Alpha returned to the University of Tennessee at Chattanooga's campus after an eight year absence. Helping Delta Epsilon get back on the right track were Pi Kappa Alpha's Expansion Consultants Chuck Hunt (North Alabama, Theta Alpha '93) and Emil Peters (Southern Methodist, Beta Zeta '92).

In the spring of 1997, the two expansion consultants came to the university working closely with sororities to seek young men who would become the founding fathers of the rechartered Delta Epsilon Chapter. Within a month they found the best men on campus, making sure that this chapter would be able to uphold Pi Kappa Alpha's standard of excel-lence. Starting with 45 of Chattanooga's finest men, Pi Kappa Alpha's traditions of scholarship, leadership, athleticism and gentlemanly conduct continued. Many of these men were varsity athletes. The brothers of Delta Epsilon represent their fraternity and their university on UTC's football, basketball, wrestling and golf teams. During the Pikes' first year back at UTC, the football team finished with their first winning season in six years; the basketball team made it to the Sweet Sixteen; the wrestling team won the Southern Conference; and the golf team finished third in Conference; and one of Delta Epsilon's brothers, Brendon Wilson, made All Conference in golf. Through exposure to the community of Chattanooga, Pi Kappa Alpha was very successful in university support, alumni relations, and recruitment.

The Pi Kappa Alpha colony soon welcomed new members and grew to be a force in the Chattanooga Greek system and community. The Pikes excelled in intramurals, coming in third overall with half the number of members compared to the competition. They accumulated more community service hours than the other fraternities, totaling 5,200 hours. The Pikes' fund raisers included a very successful date auction, a television raffle, a Super Bowl Party for the benefit of the National Children's Cancer Society, a blood drive which benefited the Chattanooga area, and an active/alumni golf tournament. Through community service projects, they brought campus sororities and fraternities together, building unity throughout the Greek system.

Homecoming events at UTC built a positive image of Greeks at the university. During Homecoming, Pi Kappa Alpha sponsored a tug-of-war contest open to the students and competed to win the annual Delta Sigma Theta Step Show. During their first year Pikes became a favorite among the sororities, and held mix-

ers with all three sororities. Through all of these efforts, Pi Kappa Alpha met the challenges of becoming a chapter at the University of Tennessee at Chattanooga.

March 1998 brought about a highly awaited inspection for the colony. Director of Expansion Shad Williams (Oklahoma State, Gamma Chi '90), Expansion Consultant Hunt, and brothers from the University of Montevallo were among the inspection team. The colony passed and was scheduled to receive their charter in May. The anticipated weekend of May 15-16 soon arrived and the time for each colony member to become a brother of Pi Kappa Alpha was just around the corner.

On Friday, May 15, 1998, thirty-six founding fathers of the rechartered Delta Epsilon Chapter were initiated by brothers from Theta Sigma Chapter (Winthrop College), Theta Beta Chapter (Montevallo), and Eta Zeta Chapter (Middle Tennessee State). On Saturday afternoon, May 16, the chartering ceremony was conducted by International President John Michael Williams (Oklahoma State, Gamma Chi '68). Williams also addressed the brothers at the chartering banquet as the keynote speaker for the evening. In attendance at the black tie Chartering Banquet were Delta Epsilon's chapter advisors, Roy Williams and Mark Cuttle; Dean of Student Affairs Jim Hicks and the brothers' parents. That weekend was an event that they will remember for the rest of their lives.

# History of the University of Tennessee at Chattanooga

When the Methodist Episcopal Church began to explore the possibilities of developing a central university in the South, Chattanoogans came forward to work with the church

in this effort. Chattanooga University was founded in 1886. For 83 years, the University was a private school. Three years after its founding, the University was consolidated with another church-related school, East Tennessee Wesleyan University in Athens, under the name of Grant University. In 1907, the name of Chattanooga was adopted.

In 1904, the University emerged from what may have been its weakest period. Some church leaders had wanted to close the University, then known as U.S. Grant University in Chattanooga. These clergymen would have made the school in Athens the main campus, but some still recognized the potential for a great university in Chattanooga.

By 1930, the University had established an independent, yet cordial, relationship with the Methodist Episcopal Church. The community began to show the University the kind of support with which the University could flourish and grow.

In 1969, the University of Chattanooga and a junior college, Chattanooga City College, merged with the University of Tennessee, one of the oldest land-grant universities in the nation, to form the University of Tennessee at Chattanooga's campus. The new campus was given the mandate to devote the major portion of its resources to the development of excellence in undergraduate education and in selected areas of graduate study.

Since the merger, student enrollment has doubled and millions of dollars have been invested in expanding campus facilities. Combining the best of its private traditions with the new resources made possible by the merger, University of Tennessee at Chattanooga is a unique institution with a diverse student body and a highly qualified faculty.

# Work Day: The Beginning of A Tradition

ork Day began as an idea generated by alumni in the fall of 1997, stating that they would prefer that their gatherings accomplish something tangible for their chapters. This sparked a concept: chapters with housing could host an alumni and guest event that focused on the improvement of their facilities in the spring of each year. As a by-product of this activity, relations with alumni, parents and local communities would be improved. Thus the International Work Day program was launched. The first publicity for Work Day appeared in the December 1997 issue of the Shield & Diamond. In March, registered chapters were named in the magazine and on the Fraternity's web page. When the academic year was completed, 14 chapters returned information about their Work Day events to Memorial Headquarters and the results were outstanding. Over 400 alumni, parents, and guests participated and over \$25,000.00 worth of property improvements were accomplished in a single day. Because this was the first year for the event not all chapters participated, but it is estimated that over three-quarters of Pi Kappa Alpha's

chapters will participate during the upcoming school year. This tradition is one that benefits both alumni and undergraduate brothers and will help keep Pi Kappa Alpha strong for many years to come.

## How to Get Your Chapter Involved with the 1998-99 International Work Day

Step 1: Call the Housing Department at Memorial Headquarters (901) 748-1868 and ask for a Free Work Day Kit.

Step 2: Follow the Work Day Kit checklist.

Step 3: After setting your Work Day date, contact the Housing Department at Memorial Headquarters to register your event so it can be publicized in the Shield & Diamond and on the Fraternity's web page.

### What is International Work Day?

It is a day in the spring set aside by participating chapters and house corporations, preferably in but not limited to the month of April, to work on their chapter house and/or grounds.

### Who's involved?

Everyone is welcome to participate. Students, alumni, parents, and friends are all encouraged to get involved. This program was developed in response to alumni who said they prefered gathering to accomplish something tangible for the chapter, such as repairing or enhancing the chapter house.

### What's the purpose?

The purpose is three-fold: needed work on the property is addressed; everyone has fun with old and new friends; and the chapter further develops its alumni and public relations programs.

### What's the agenda?

Each location develops its own game plan. A typical day would include a welcoming meeting, when a member of the chapter or house corporation announces the objectives for the day and organizes the group accordingly. When the work is complete there would likely be a barbecue or food catered in, and a social occasion where participants can reflect on the accomplishments of the day, plan for future events and mingle with friends.

# How's the International Fraternity involved?

The Fraternity recognizes the need for both alumni and students to take an active role in caring for chapter property. If each group succeeds locally, the entire Fraternity benefits internationally. The Fraternity offers support by supplying chapters and house corporations with free Work Day Kits. These kits include a sample alumni letter, a planning checklist, a

sample Work Day agenda, and a list of phone numbers and mailing labels for that chapter's alumni as well as all area alumni. The Fraternity also provides thank you letters and gifts for all participants at each event; all the chapter has to do is send in a list of participants and their addresses, and the Fraternity does the rest. Pi Kappa Alpha also offers support in marketing each local Work Day by advertising it in the Shield & Diamond and on the Fraternity's web page. The Fraternity encourages all chapters to select a Work Day date, preferably in the spring, and contact the Housing Office at Memorial Headquarters by October 15, 1998; that way each participating chapter's date can be published in both the December and March issues of the Shield & Diamond.

### How do we get involved?

Get in touch with your chapter, local house corporation, or the Housing Department at Memorial Headquarters at (901) 748-1868. The Housing Department staff will either sign your group up or put you in contact with the appropriate local person in charge of your chapter's Work Day.

# An International Affair:

# The 1998 Pi Kappa Alpha Convention

hat's more American than baseball, hot dogs and college fraternities? Well, as of this past August, Toronto, Ontario, Canada can claim the best of all three – depending on your opinion of the Blue Jays. With pockets full of "monopoly money" and street-corner 'dogs in each hand, hundreds of American Pikes barged across the border to join their Canadian brethren at the first truly-International Convention.

On Friday, Aug. 7, the night before most undergraduates arrived, local alumni and Very Important Pikes joined Memorial Headquarters (MHQ) staff at Skydome ("just Skydome, not the Skydome") to watch the Oakland A's squeeze by the 1992 and 1993 World Champion Toronto Blue Jays — with all but a few Oakland faithful

rooting for the home team. Most of the foreigners were somewhat confused, however, when a local song replaced the comfortable "Take Me Out to the Ball Game" during the seventhinning stretch.

This reception was the first of several alumni receptions, programs and impromptu reunions of those six Garnet-and-Golden days in August. Several alumni said that regardless of life's turns, they could always catch up with certain people every two years at the Pike convention—men like Robert Hahnen (Minnesota, Beta Chi '25), who estimated this was his sixteenth convention since his first, 1938 in Los Angeles (He personally remembers meeting many of the men whose effects are displayed in the cases of the Hart Museum at Headquarters)

Most of the undergraduates, registering on Saturday, Aug. 8, were beginning their first convention – hopefully the first of their own tradition—but several were veterans from Kansas City, 1996. As they anticipated the opening session in the late-afternoon, the conventioneers spent the day finding their way around the mammoth and spectacular Sheraton Central

International Music Director Stephen Knight (Alabama, Gamma Alpha '64) massaged the ivory keys while everybody found their seats for the Convention's opening session. Knight pulled glorious melodies from the

hotel piano at the beginning of every major event.

The Fraternity fondly remembered Past International Chaplain The Reverend Simon A. Simon (Nebraska-Omaha, Delta Chi '54). Quite fittingly, the memory of the man who had been an institution at so many previous international events was the first order of business of the first event he attended in spirit alone. International Chaplain The Reverend Canon Henry Minich (Virginia, Alpha '51) led the service, and Past National President The Reverend Gary Sallquist (Nebraska-Omaha, Delta Chi '57) delivered the eulogy.

Sallquist described Simon as a "keen wit" who was "funny, sensitive and committed to Pi Kappa Alpha – a brother par excellence." Sallquist first met Simon as an undergraduate at which time Simon introduced himself by saying he was "glad his parents had not named him A. Simon Simon." Sallquist has counted Simon as a personal friend ever since, although he has been pleasantly chagrined every time somebody has called him "Pinhead" – a nickname Simon gave him in retaliation to a college prank.

"Being with him felt good," Sallquist said, remembering that after a poor tennis performance—which would have inspired lesser men to profanity and excuse—Simon simply said, "we would have won, but they scored more points faster than us."

Simon was the SMC of Delta Chi, an All-American football player, the captain of a national-championship football team and the president of his class at UNO for four years. In recent years, he had been a Presbyterian pastor in Jerseyville, Illinois, which is just North of St. Louis. He died of cancer of the larynx.

"When we met Si, we'd think 'I'd like to be like that," Sallquist said. "His example of 'the essence of PiKA' inspired other Pikes to be better."

Executive Vice-President Raymond Orians (Memphis, Delta Zeta '66) welcomed all attendees to the Convention. He introduced the current staff members, who then cleared the room and re-admitted qualified brothers on password to witness Gurvis

In the evening, convention-goers had their choice of enjoying educational workshops for SMCs, ThCs, continuing educators, house managers and those interested in using internet technology.

Director of Services Geoffrey Fiedler (New Hampshire, Gamma Mu '95), Chapter Consultant Jason Hernandez (Chapman, Theta Psi '95) and Iota Pi (California-Los Angeles) Chapter Advisor Rudy Rodriguez (California State-Fresno, Iota Beta '86) facilitated the first of several chapter advisor workshops, including a two-and-a-half hour open discussion.

The 35 chapter advisors in attendance discussed the common issues they faced, the best ways to help chapter operations and alumniboard recruitment. They also authored a resolution asking MHQ to investigate the feasibility of an academy dedicated exclusively to chapter advisors — similar to the Rush Chairmen's Summit during the Chapter President's Conference.



Conventions have historically been called to let the undergraduates dictate the future of the Fraternity. The Constitution and Laws of the Fraternity could not be changed without undergraduate initiative and approval. Delegates

from every attending chapter debated and judged numerous fraternal issues throughout the Convention, and everybody gathered to determine what sort of organization they wanted our Fraternity to become. The undergraduate members of Pi Kappa Alpha possess a unique control over the content of their Constitution.

The democratic process began as the delegates met for the first of four sessions dedicated to committee meetings. Committees processed and approved every piece of legislation before it came to the legislative floor.

Almost every committee reviewed at least one con-

troversial piece of legislation. Some of those proposals would die in committee, some would pass and most would be amended. Bills proposing to "authorize the Supreme Council to adjust fees and dues (no more than 5% between conventions)," "increase the initiation fee," "voice Pi Kappa Alpha's support of alcohol-free fraternity housing" and mandate an eightweek pledge program, three bills providing new expulsion methods, and four bills setting international academic standards for members, recruits, transfers and officers respectively were the most controversial.

The first of four legislative sessions began early on Sunday morning with a memorial for those brothers who had passed into Chapter Eternal since the 1996 Convention. A Gold Star Memorial followed in honor of all PiKAs who have given themselves in service of our countries.

The grand roll call opened the Convention to regular business with 126 chapters, 9 alumni associations and 43 officers responding, but several groups who were tardy would add their

names to this list. The standing executive committees of the Fraternity (such as The Educational Advisory Committee, The Housing Commission and The International Rush Advisory Commission) gave their reports.

International President John Michael Williams (Oklahoma State, Gamma Chi '68) reported that Pi Kappa Alpha had once again dominated the Fraternity world with the largest average chapter size for the 11th year running at 63. The Fraternity claimed numerous other titles in 1997-98 including largest average pledge class (26).

Chapter Excellence Awards were presented to 44 chapters, and legislation began moving before the meeting yielded to the second

round of educational programs. Sunday morning featured programs on pledge education, alumni associations, rush, the internet and achieving the dream house and workshops for SMCs, ThCs, IMCs, and chapter advisors.



The Educational Foundation Luncheon was the first of the big banquets and the beginning of the pomp and circumstance surrounding the Convention. The Foundation named Commissioner Emeritus of the Housing Commission Richard Ralph (California, Alpha Sigma '53), Congressman and Past National President The Honorable Edward Pease (Indiana, Delta Xi '71), Past National President and Past Educational Foundation President Dr. William Nester (Cincinnati, Alpha Xi '47) and businessman Phillip Lighty (Washington State, Gamma Xi '38) to the Order of West Range and recognized businessman Craig Hoenshell (Nebraska-Omaha, Delta Chi '63) with the Distinguished Achievement Award.

"Pi Kappa Alpha is the world's single greatest leadership development laboratory," Hoenshell said. "And, leadership is the world's single most valuable commodity." He related leadership to an enjoyable life and a positive fraternity experience. Hoenshell stressed that one can achieve success through scholarship, but one can only achieve "great success" through leadership. Good leaders, he said, gain wealth, power and personal accomplishment.



The misuse of alcohol and alcohol-free housing were hot topics coming into the Convention with nine national fraternities committed to an alcohol-free stance. A recent widely-interpreted memo from the Supreme Council, which basically restated a resolution passed by the delegates of the 1996 Convention, also contributed to the issue's attention.

On Sunday afternoon, approximately 200 undergraduates gathered for a forum on alcohol abuse, facilitated by former Executive Director and risk guru Allen W. Groves (Stetson, Delta Upsilon '79). They discussed alcohol's role in the fraternity and its effects. The forum overwhelmingly found alcohol abuse to be negative, and they discussed various ways of dealing with it. While the forum generally viewed alcohol-free housing to be a positive public relations move and an inevitable reality, they did not feel that it was necessarily the best direction for the entire International Fraternity to move at this time.

Outside the forum, vendors representing Campus Classics, Omega Financial, Legacy

Jewelers and Greek Creations gave conventioneers the opportunity to take home some nice souvenirs or information from Toronto. The Fraternity shared the hotel's convention facilities with the multilingual sales associates of Allouette Cosmetique, who strangely enough bought up Campus Classics's shirts like the PiKA symbol on the shirt pocket was the best thing since the Izod alligator.

By the second round of committee meetings that afternoon, the delegates began seriously dissecting the legislation at hand. The Housing Committee talked about several issues of which the most interesting was the alcohol-free initiative. They discussed a bill which encouraged MHQ to create financial incentives and establish

assistance programs for those chapters that choose voluntarily to become alcohol-free.

"We [the Supreme Council] want to give you [undergraduates] self-determination—we want you to be able to do something different [than what other fraternities have done in response to the issue of alcohol abuse]," International Vice President Wallace Long (Memphis, Delta Zeta '67) said. "We [the Supreme Council] do think alcohol-free housing is definitely a positive concept."

Long said the Supreme Council was mainly concerned with the success of the students, giving undergraduates a positive fraternity experience, and improving a young man's quality of life in relation to the concept.

John Moshy (Southern California, Gamma Eta '97) quoted the alcohol resolution passed by the 1996 Convention from the Dagger & Key, stressing its emphasis on the choice of individual chapters to make decisions about the nature of their housing. He also applauded and reminded everyone of PiKA's historically democratic nature.

The committee signaled agreement with both men's points, and the resulting legislation indicated the undergraduates' support of MHQ's development of such incentives and programming.

The Finance Committee talked about a dues increase that would create funding for a new program to give extra attention to struggling chapters, to keep the costs of the 2000 Convention reasonable, to increase expansion and to provide for new incentive programs like those being discussed in housing. They decided to wait on the specifics of the increase until other committees had talked about the programming the funds would benefit, but they did talk about which fees should be affected by any necessary increase.

The committee worked to make various sections of the Constitution read more clearly and accurately. The most interesting vote kept an alumni association from voting on a colony's status during an inspection, defined of how many members an inspection team was composed and determined what inspection expenses MHQ would reimburse.

The delegates in other committees continued preparing legislation for the floor, as the rest of the Convention's guests socialized outside the ballroom doors, awaiting the International President's Banquet.

Once seated, Pikes are prime rib like they were busted in Vegas, and John Michael Williams prepared to present his farewell speech.

The members of Alpha Chapter (Virginia) and Gamma Chapter (William and Mary) shared a table. Depending on the counting method, they each had a two-and-a-half member delegation, since John "Tug" Coker (William and Mary, Gamma '97) currently attended Virginia. Milan Chakraborty (William and Mary, Gamma '97) even celebrated his birthday that night.

Executive Director Ron Ross (Memphis, Delta Zeta '68) introduced the outgoing Su-

preme Council, and the Fraternity surprised Past National President Joseph Turner (Clemson, Eta Alpha '70) with the Loyalty Award, in recognition of the highest service to Pi Kappa Alpha (see page 13).

In his introduction to the award, Williams said, "We show our loyalty by our actions." He then quoted Past National President William LaForge (*Delta State, Zeta Beta '69*), "Joe Turner personifies loyalty.... No, there's more – Joe Turner personifies this Loyalty Award."

Turner was visibly moved and caught without a speech.

On behalf of the Fraternity, Williams formally presented charters to Psi (North Georgia College and State University), Delta Epsilon (Tennessee-Chattanooga), Delta Psi (Maryland), Kappa Upsilon (American) and Kappa Phi (California-San Diego) Chapters.

Williams began his final speech, thanking the families of the volunteers and staff and reciting a list of men who have been influential in Pi Kappa Alpha's history and men who have touched his life.

Williams then recognized several specific Pikes who had made personal sacrifices, such as Congressman Pease, who flew cross-country with a extremely painful, bleeding ear, to attend Kappa Phi's chartering ceremony. He mentioned Jack Lucas (High Point, Delta Omega '56), a Congressional Medal of Honor recipient who threw his body on two separate live grenades to save his fellow soldiers. Williams also talked about Scott Moore (Nebraska-Kearney, Iota Gamma '87), who was paralyzed in an alcohol-related car accident two days before his scheduled initiation but later returned to be initiated and faithfully serve the Fraternity.

Williams commented on the future of the Fraternity, paraphrasing Simon A. Simon's 1996 International Convention monologue about the "main thing" of the Fraternity and of our lives. Williams said he believes the main thing for the men he mentioned is not the misuse of alcohol nor is that misuse of alcohol the main thing of the Fraternity.

Additionally, Williams mused that the Fraternity would likely have a future with a membership that will become more culturally-diverse.

Our waning President ended his speech, complimenting the leaders in the room, and the whole ceremony featured more standing ovations than the State of the Union address – but Congressman Pease was likely happier standing during the former leader's speech than he was rising for the latter.

This evening ended, as did the previous and following evenings, with each of the 16 regions getting together to discuss legislation, regional issues and individual chapter progress.

Monday morning began with a Rush Workshop facilitated by Rush Czar Kevin Knaus, IRAC Member Scott Bell (Central Florida, Eta Phi '81) and Director of Expansion Chuck Hunt (North Alabama, Theta Alpha '93). The workshop gave the undergraduates information they could apply to their rush programs and updated them on the progress of our expansion program.

Chapter Consultant Jim Ahern (Chapman, Theta Psi '96) noted that many of the delegates seemed tired during the third round of committee meetings, following the rush workshop, but most committees steamed full ahead.

The Second Legislative Session opened that afternoon, and the delegates began seriously debating the bills that they had already pushed through committees. The main debate during this session lead to the failure of the bill setting specific international scholarship requirements for a man to be recruited.

The most popular program at every largescale Fraternity gathering is quite possibly Executive Housing Officer Dan Corah's (Colorado State, Epsilon Theta '83) "This Old Chapter House" presentation. With the help of Director of Housing Clint Bartman (Illinois State, Kappa Alpha '94), Corah updated the presentation, turning it into a multi-media experience.

The committees met one last time to tie up any loose ends and prepare all legislation for the floor. The ever-present Constitution Committee debated appropriate reasons for expulsions and how expulsions should be done. Most of the debate focused on a possible minimum GPA standard which failed in committee.

All these changes kept Director of Services James Yolch (Minnesota, Beta Chi '93) working late into the night, rewriting legislation.

Parliamentarian and Lone Star Regional President Mark Robertson (Southern Methodist, Beta Zeta '82) rode the Rules Committee overtime to schedule the rest of the legislation that was coming to the Convention floor.

The committee contemplated in which order the various bills would make the most sense, but Chapter Advisor of the Year Rudy Rodriguez wanted to make sure the committee was not influencing whether the bills would pass – the order should only make them more easily understood. The committee strategically

# **Loyalty Award Presented To Former National President Joseph J. Turner Jr.**

Brother Joseph J. Turner Jr. was named Pi Kappa Alpha's Loyalty Award recipient for 1998. This award, presented to Turner during the International Presidents Banquet at the recent International Convention in Toronto, Ontario, Canada, is awarded annually to an alumnus brother in recognition of lifelong service and loyalty to Pi Kappa Alpha.

Totally unaware of being named the 1998 recipient until it was announced by International President John Michael Williams during the banquet, Turner was taken completely by surprise, and humbled practically beyond words. In introducing Joe Turner, and attempting to succinctly summarize Turner's nearly thirty years of loyal and dedicated service to our grand Fraternity, President Williams stated "Pi Kappa Alpha is a Brotherhood. Loyalty is a key element of that Brotherhood. It is fitting we honor a brother whose whole life exemplifies loyalty - loyalty to friends, loyalty to family, and loyalty to Pi Kappa Alpha."

President Williams then remarked "Perhaps Former National President Bill LaForge said it best - Joe Turner personifies loyalty; no, Joe Turner exemplifies this Loyalty Award."

Joe Turner began his involvement with Pi Kappa Alpha in 1970 when he was initiated as the charter SMC of Eta Alpha Chapter at Clemson University. Through the foundation built under his leadership, Eta Alpha has been named one of Pi Kappa Alpha's most outstanding chapters countless times since its chartering in 1970. As an alumnus, Turner has served as a chapter advisor, district president, regional president, and chairman of the national alumni commission. In 1976, he was elected to the Supreme Council as a vice president, and was re-elected in 1978 for a second term. From 1980 to 1982, he served as a trustee of the Fraternity's Endowment Fund.

At the 1982 National Convention in Washington, D.C., Turner was elected as Pi Kappa Alpha's national president, and served in that capacity through the 1984 National Convention in Dallas, Texas. Recognizing his tremendous love of Pi Kappa Alpha and a burning desire to see it prosper, at the conclusion of his term as national president he was promptly named to the board of trustees of the Pi Kappa Alpha Educational Foundation, and ultimately served as its president from 1987 to 1989.

Professionally, Turner is chief executive officer and co-owner of First Sun Management Corporation in Clemson, South Carolina, an award winning Wendy's Restaurant franchise management firm. He is a member of the Clemson Rotary Club and served as its president from 1986 to 1988, has served the First Baptist Church of Clemson as chair of the deacons, and is a former president of the local Boy Scouts Council.

Turner and his wife Cathy reside in Clemson, South Carolina, and have three children, Jackson, Anne Campbell and Tate.

placed lighter bills between the more controversial ones.

All the members of the Phi Phi Kappa Alpha Club enjoyed a reception that capped Monday evening early, allowing the Conventionattendees to see Toronto. The Sheraton was conveniently located in Toronto's active entertainment district, and most Pikes took advantage of the area restaurants and cultural opportunities.

Members of the host chapter, Iota Omega (Western Ontario), and local members of Kappa Mu Chapter (Wilfrid Laurier) helped their American guests find their way around beautiful Toronto. Everything they needed was

within walking distance, and even in unpleasant weather, nobody had any reason to worry since the central area of Canada's largest city is intricately connected by tunnels resembling a shopping mall.

All involved expressed their belief that Toronto was "better" than Kansas City, which probably had nothing to do with Kansas City but only spoke of Toronto's great charm. Consultant Ahern and countless others commented on the friendliness of the locals. Dozens of people took advantage of the hot-dog-and-sausage stands spaced virtually 20-feet apart throughout downtown and ate the best meal a coin ever bought.



During the Third Legislative Session, delegates approved the scholar-

ship requirements for transfers and officers, new expulsion procedures and dues increases. The Convention gave the Supreme Council the authority to judiciously increase dues when necessary, but they denied specific academic requirements for members.

At two minutes before 11:00, the Nominating Committee finally surfaced. They had been working day and night in a secluded hotel suite, interviewing potential 1998-2000 Supreme Council officers and listening to anybody with an opinion about those potential officers.

They finally appeared to present their longanticipated slate of recommended International Officers. Past National President and International Alumni Commission Chairman Tommy J. Turner (*Texas Tech, Epsilon Gamma* '67) took the podium as committee spokesman, poking fun at Mark Robertson and the chicken he was riding and also at Past National President and Educational Foundation President Gary Menchhofer (*Cincinnati, Alpha Xi* '65).

All joking aside, Turner talked about the image of the fraternity, quoting Cumberland Regional President John Bobango (Arkansas State, Delta Theta '74), "Brotherhood is the flame within our hearts, not the beer within our hands." Turner spoke of other aspects of image and related them to the image of the international president.

With the help of the other members of his committee, he then presented the slate to much clamoring from the gallery. The Convention unanimously elected President Thomas J. Handler (Illinois, Beta Eta '74) and Vice Presidents Wallace D. Long III (Memphis, Delta Zeta '67), D. Mark Anderson (Wofford, Nu '76), H. King Buttermore (Vanderbilt, Sigma '63) and Howard E. Goldstein (Lehigh, Gamma Lambda '83). Handler was previously a vice president, Buttermore had been legal counsel, and Goldstein was promoted from North Atlantic regional president.

The MHQ Awards Luncheon followed the commotion in the legislative chamber. Execu-

tive Director Ross's salmon blazer threatened to steal the show until Senior Chapter Consultant Tim Brady (St. Joseph's, Iota Rho '94) and Senior Expansion Consultant N. Ryan Flickinger (Southern Illinois, Iota Mu '94) began presenting the awards for 1997-1998.

The Fraternity presented awards for accomplishment in scholarship, rush, alumni relations, community service, pledge education, continuing education, campus involvement, athletics, publications, housing and service to the International Fraternity.

Alpha Sigma Chapter (California) earned The Harvey T. Newell Award, recognizing the most improved chapter, and 14 chapters were awarded the highest honor, The Robert Adger Smythe Award.

Alpha Kappa (Missouri-Rolla), Beta Theta (Cornell), Beta Tau (Michigan), Gamma Xi (Washington State), Gamma Omicron (Ohio), Zeta Alpha "B" (Kettering), Theta Psi (Chapman), Iota Alpha (Wyoming), Iota Gamma (Nebraska-Kearney), Iota Iota (Michigan State), Iota Kappa (California-Santa Barbara), Iota Mu (Southern Illinois) and Iota Omega (Western Ontario) Chapter all took home a Smythe trophy.

Iota Omega's recognition was fittingly the finale of the ceremony, and the entire banquet hall respectfully and proudly stood as the exuberant brothers at Western sang "Oh Canada" – their national anthem.

The Fourth Legislative Session concluded the business portion of the Convention with several interesting bills passing. Resolutions which encouraged MHQ to help our alcoholfree chapters and encouraged MHQ to investigate colonies in Puerto Rico passed. By the time the bill mandating the length of the pledge education program hit the floor, the length had been extended to 10 weeks, but that part of the bill failed in the main gallery.



Only the International Officers Banquet remained, which was definitely the climax of the Convention and possibly its most memorable event. The lights dimmed and the men of Pi Kappa Alpha roared as newly-appointed Legal Counsel Allen W. Groves called out their 66 international officers like an NBA announcer. And in true-NBA-style the officers, wearing white dinner jackets and garnet-and-gold sashes, ran, tumbled and were carried through an adoring gauntlet of rowdy Pikes to their seats at the head table.

The meal passed ridiculously and gloriously slowly as members and officers walked among the tables, visiting old friends and convention friends and friends they will work to create before the next gathering. Brothers traded war stories, gave thanks to those who were deserving and reveled in the

great cheer of the most glorious single event in the fraternity world – the one meal for which every PiKA present would have gladly traded all other meals over the past two years.

Any man who was not emotionally altered and physically moved must have been an imposter at the Pi Kappa Alpha Convention. The grass over Frederick Southgate Taylor's (Virginia, Alpha '68) grave grew two feet that night.

And that night, Toronto stayed up late as she and Pi Kappa Alpha began their sad goodbyes.

"It's an experience every brother should have at least once," Randall Vess (Austin Peay State, Eta Tau '81) wrote in a note to staff. "What I came away with can't be fully described in words. I can tell you I won't be missing another for years to come. Atlanta in 2000 ... who do I call for reservations?"

Another resolution which had passed during the Fourth Legislative Session encouraged all Pikes to stop using the term "National" to describe the Fraternity, saying instead "International." As our delegates returned home on Wednesday with less "monopoly money" than they might have hoped, most of them would likely agree that Pi Kappa Alpha can now boast of its strong North American tradition.

By the way, that Wednesday afternoon as the Pikes dispersed, the Blue Jays went yard on the Mariners.

Brothers,

It is my pleasant duty to present the 1997-1998 Annual Report for Pi Kappa Alpha.

As you read the pages which follow, you may also be interested to know that Pi Kappa Alpha continues to enjoy great success among our fellow Greeks in the fraternity world. It is a pleasure to report the following highlights of our success in 1997-1998:

- Pi Kappa Alpha is now on 214 college and university campuses, composed of 202 chapters and 12 colonies.
- Pi Kappa Alpha continues to maintain the largest average chapter size among all fraternities in North America.
- Pi Kappa Alpha pledged the most men per chapter among all fraternities in North America.

During the last year our expansion efforts continued with the establishment of nine new colonies and the chartering of five new chapters. In the two years since the Kansas City Convention a total of twelve new chapters have been chartered. A continuing benefit of our expansion program is that it has permitted us to return to many campuses where chapters were closed in the past. These campuses not only provide for prestigious colonization sites, but also our re-established chapters quickly become a source of pride and satisfaction for alumni from previous years. In the last year three of our five charterings have been the rechartering of previously existing chapters.

All of these successes have been accomplished as our chapters become more diverse. Many of our highly successful chapters are composed of men of diverse educational pursuits, men of varying religious faiths, and men who do not have the same color of skin, where the brotherhood of Pi Kappa Alpha makes the differences not make any difference! These chapters have learned firsthand the richness which diversity brings to the fraternity experience.

The reasons for our successes are many. First, I believe, is our commitment to quality undergraduate leadership programming, and the expenditure of significant resources in this pursuit. This commitment is exemplified by our Officers Leadership Academy attended by 340 undergraduates, our Chapter Presidents Conference and Rush Summit attended by Presidents of 149 chapters and 91 Rush Chairmen, and our 16 Regional Leadership Conferences attended by 2,635 undergraduate members. Equally important in our success is the dedication of loval alumni volunteers and the professionalism of our Memorial Headquarters staff which advance the ongoing success of Pi Kappa Alpha.

To all who made Pi Kappa Alpha a success during the last year, I extend a hearty thank you.

# Leadership Programs

## Officers Leadership Academy

The Officers Leadership Academy was held on the campus of the University of Memphis from July 23-27, 1997. The four-day conference and workshop was attended by 340 undergraduates representing 120 chapters and 7 colonies. Advanced training in chapter operations and leadership development was the core of the curriculum. The Leadership Academy also included intensive sessions on rush, risk awareness and strategic leadership. Personal development workshops included creative thinking, improving academic performance, health issues and financial management. International Historian Dr. Jerome V. Reel, Jr. (Tulane, Eta '57) provided an explanation of the development of the Fraternity's ritual and initiation ceremony. Thomas L. Harken, owner of eight franchises of the Casa Olé restaurant chain in Texas, was initiated into the bonds of the Fraternity.

# **Chapter Presidents Conference** & Rush Summit

The Chapter Presidents Conference, the first of its kind and still one of only a few in the fraternity world, is an intensive three-day workshop for chapter officers. Presidents from 149 chapters and 91 rush chairmen attended the conference held in Memphis at the Peabody Hotel. The Pi Kappa Alpha Educational Foundation provides scholarships for chapter presidents that significantly reduce the registration fee for those attending this unique conference.

The conference featured sessions on the ritual, leadership, risk awareness and strategic planning. Chapter presidents also attended training workshops on finance, alumni relations, risk awareness, pledge education and leadership. Group discussions provided chapter presidents the opportunity to share information on chapter management and motivation with other undergraduate members. The Rush Summit is a successful addition to the conference: designed for rush chairmen, the program featured extensive training on all aspects of the Fraternity's rush program. Continued growth is projected for the Rush Summit. The 1997 Distinguished Achievement Award was presented to Charles A. Bowsher (Illinois, Beta Eta '59) at the conference. Brother Bowsher was Comptroller General of the United States and the nation's chief auditor.

# Services



James A. Yolch (Minnesota, Beta Chi '93) Director of Services

The Services Department is charged with addressing the evolving needs of Pi Kappa Alpha's chapters and members. This objective is accomplished by continuing development of innovative programming, and by providing leadership and assistance to the Fraternity's constituents. During 1997-98, the chapter consultant program continued to be a vital component in providing our chapters with resources and support necessary for them to realize their full potential. The inaugural chapter consultant campaign took place over 50 years ago, and the program remains today as the leading program for assisting Pi Kappa Alpha's chapters.

In addition to seven chapter consultants, a housing consultant and an expansion consultant were hired for 1997-98. Collectively, these nine individuals provided exemplary leadership and support while conducting over 240 chapter visits. The context of these chapter visits varied from the all-inclusive consultation on chapter programming to developmental visits focusing on critical operational components such as recruitment or finances. Additionally, a comprehensive assessment of chapter programming with specific Ultimate Fraternity-related suggestions was provided to each chapter at the conclusion of each visit.

The chapter consultants began the year in August with the completion of 31 recruitment-based visits to those chapters requesting this unique service. In early September, the consultants embarked on their regular travel schedules. In addition to fulfilling their primary role as advisors, the consultants also provided valuable insight and resources at each regional leadership conference and chapter chartering banquet, the Officers Leadership Academy, and the Chapter Presidents Conference and Rush Summit. Moreover, the chapter consultants assisted with the successful formation of eight new colonies during the 1997-98 academic year.

The Services Department also continued to recognize the importance of servicing those chapters faced with special circumstances. The Memorial Headquarters conducted several charter/membership reviews and assisted with the establishment of numerous alumni advisory/receivership boards. In addition, the Services Department facilitated a number of programming presentations at the request of chapters or host institutions.

# **Risk Awareness**

Through the continued development of innovative educational programs and informative presentations, Pi Kappa Alpha once again realized a reduction in the total number of claims against the Fraternity for the 1997-98 academic year. Providing chapters and members with the necessary resources to make informed decisions in reducing the risk and liability associated with chapter-sponsored events is the primary objective of the Risk Awareness Foundation. This objective is effectively attained through risk awareness presentations made during each regional leadership conference, the Officers Leadership Academy, the International Convention, and the Chapter Presidents Conference. These presentations emphasize the importance of practicing sound risk awareness measures in order to maintain the safety of the chapter environment, and illustrate the possible ramifications resulting from an incident.


The above mentioned educational sessions and materials are made possible by funding from the Risk Awareness Foundation, to which each member and chapter contributes through the Fraternity's self-retention insurance fund. The excellent claims record of Pi Kappa Alpha also makes it

possible for the Foundation to provide affordable liability protection for all chapters, house corporations, alumni associations, and their respective officers and members. Prompt reporting of any incident to the Memorial Head-quarters as soon as possible makes certain that chapters can be properly protected when warranted. The *Standards for Membership Retention and Chapter Charter in Good Standing*, which were originally adopted at the 1988 National Convention, states the expectations concerning alcohol and drug abuse, hazing, sexual misconduct, and facility safety.

The Risk Awareness Foundation also maintains an educational video library with over 30 tapes available for chapters to utilize. Funding from the Risk Awareness Foundation allows chapters to acquire these videos at relatively inexpensive cost. Approximately 20 chapters took advantage of this service during the 1997-98 academic year by incorporating these videos into their risk awareness programs.

The Memorial Headquarters and the Risk Awareness Foundation realize the importance of developing new risk awareness initiatives on an annual basis. The past success of the Fraternity's risk awareness strategies does not guarantee the future longevity of our chapters. Increasing discussion regarding the responsible use of alcohol has been addressed with the creation of The Misuse of Alcohol Task Force. This organization is responsible for the investigation of new methods to address the growing concerns on the misuse of alcohol, and provide educational support to ensure that a safe and enjoyable experience is achieved by our members and their guests.

# Communications

In 1997-98, Pi Kappa Alpha printed a total of 307,412 copies of the *Shield & Diamond*. Over 120,000 members received a copy of the September issue, which goes to all mailable members.

The Shield & Diamond was honored in 1997 with the National Interfraternity Foundation Publications Award for the article Fraternities and Friendship: An Answer for the Abandoned Generation? written by Dr. William H. Willimon (Wofford, Nu '65). This article appeared in the December 1996 issue of Shield & Diamond, edited by Kevin E. Virta (Western Michigan, Epsilon Psi '83) and Barbara E. Perkins, and was reprinted in the Fraternity & Sorority Magazine published by the National Interfraternity Conference.

The Shield & Diamond was honored in 1998 with the College Fraternity Editors Association General Excellence/Honorable Mention Award for the March 1998 sports issue of the Shield & Diamond, edited by Steven S. Vincent (Missouri, Alpha Nu '83) and Barbara E. Perkins.

The Oak: A History of Pi Kappa Alpha by Jerome V. Reel, Jr. (Tulane, Eta '57) was updated by the author and completely redesigned by editors Kevin E. Virta (Western Michigan, Epsilon Psi '83) and Barbara E. Perkins for its fifth edition, published in November 1997. A total of 15,142 copies were printed, containing 200 pages and 121 photographs.

# Expansion

Nine new colonies were established during the past academic year and five new charters will be presented at the International Convention in Toronto. Pi Kappa Alpha is recognized as the leader in expansion in the fraternity world.

Marking a return to the Big 12 Conference, the first recolonization of the past academic year was Alpha Phi at Iowa State. In the spring, the Gamma Beta Chapter at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln returned following an absence of more than 20 years. Colonies were also established at New York University and California State Polytechnic University-Pomona.

During the spring, the Fraternity established its presence at the University of Alberta, Canada, the University of California-Riverside, Florida Atlantic University, the University of Wisconsin-Whitewater and California State University-San Bernardino. At each of these fine institutions, Pi Kappa Alpha's colonies are among the top fraternities on campus.

Five colonies received their charters during the past year. Among these were Psi Chapter at North Georgia College and State University, Delta Psi Chapter at the University of Maryland and Delta Epsilon Chapter at the University of Tennessee-Chattanooga. Additionally, American University in the District of Columbia became Kappa Upsilon Chapter and the University of California-San Diego is home to Kappa Phi Chapter. The Fraternity continues its commitment to reviving silent chapters.

There were several changes in the Fraternity's expansion during the year, including the appointment of R. Chuck Hunt (North Alabama, Theta Alpha '93) as director of expansion. Working closely with the services department, each colony was visited by an expansion consultant and received a regular chapter visit by one of the Fraternity's chapter consultants. Several existing colonies have received their final inspection prior to anticipated chartering in the fall of 1998. The Fraternity continues to develop new initiatives and enhanced programming to ensure the colonies' continued success.

The efforts of the Fraternity's expansion department are ongoing and plans call for establishing a colony at the University of Vermont during the coming academic year. Plans also include a return to the University of Arkansas and Virginia Tech. In September, a chapter will be chartered at Plymouth State University and campaigns will continue at colleges and universities across the country and in Canada.

There are several key components in Pi Kappa Alpha's success in the area of expansion, including an excellent staff and programming. Pi Kappa Alpha recruits the top scholars, leaders, athletes and gentlemen on each of the campuses where a colony is established. The valuable support of the outstanding alumni of our great Fraternity is another major component. Finally, the programming and educational sessions provided at regional leadership conferences and services provided by the consultants and staff of the Fraternity for both colonies and active chapters are essential to continued success.

# Housing

Housing is important to Pi Kappa Alpha chapters and the Fraternity continues to emphasize the need for improved care and conditions of our chapter facilities. While Executive Housing Officer Daniel W. Corah (Colorado State, Epsilon Theta '83) continues to head the Fraternity's housing operations, on June 1, 1998, Clint E. Bartman (Kappa Alpha, Illinois State University '94) was hired to fill the newly created position of director of housing. Including Housing Assistant Heather L. Huffman, there are now three staff members dedicated to administering the Fraternity's housing department.

One of the most tangible roles the International Fraternity plays in the housing area is that of a lender. Through the Chapter House Fund, governed by the Pi Kappa Alpha Housing Commission, loans are granted to qualifying chapters and house corporations. Two types of loans are available for application, secured and unsecured. The unsecured loan is for acquisition of furnishings and equipment up to \$25,000. A secured loan is for the purchase, construction or renovation of real estate. The limit on a secured loan is \$250,000 with a first mortgage, or \$150,000 with a second mortgage. In the 1997-98 fiscal year, the Chapter House Fund committed, disbursed, modified, refinanced, and/or subordinated loans involving \$463,897 of new funds for housing purposes at the following chapters:

The Housing Commission also governs the Holding Corporation, which is a non-profit corporation created in 1963. The role of the Holding Corporation is to hold title to real estate that has been acquired by the Fraternity. While the International Fraternity prefers to not own chapter houses, circumstances occasionally occur when real estate is obtained. The Holding Corporation currently owns property at the following locations:

Alpha (University of Virginia) [land only] Alpha Zeta (University of Arkansas) Alpha Theta (West Virginia University) Beta Nu (Oregon State University) Gamma Omega (University of Miami) Zeta Mu (University of Idaho) Theta Lambda (Creighton University) Theta Mu (University of Massachusetts) In addition to "beefing-up" the existing programming and staff, this year the Fraternity conducted its first International Work Day. This is all part of an on-going list of initiatives, developed by the Housing Commission, all aimed at improving the housing stock of the entire Fraternity and making it not only competitive, but also best prepared to meet the needs of the future chapter and student.

The Fraternity acknowledges those chapters who do an exemplary job of managing and maintaining their chapter houses by presenting a quarterly award of a certificate, recognition in the Fraternity's monthly newsletter, *The Forum*, and a \$250 grant. The quarterly award winners are eligible for the annual House of the Year award which includes a trophy, recognition in the *Shield & Diamond* and a \$1,000 grant. For those chapters who do not have a chapter house per se, but do have a chapter room they call home, the Fraternity presents the Chapter Room of the Year Award. This award includes a trophy, recognition in the *Shield & Diamond* and a \$500 grant.

The Housing Commission and staff look forward to continuing and increasing their effort at providing valuable services and resources for the best housing in the fraternity world



### Revenues

The Pi Kappa Alpha Educational Foundation receives support through various venues including the Foundation's annual giving program, the PIKE Fund, planned gifts and outright major gifts of cash, securities and marketable real estate. As owner of the Pi Kappa Alpha Memorial Headquarters, the Foundation also receives numerous of gifts fraternity memorabilia, archives and literary works which are held in the Harvey T. Newell Library of the Memorial Headquarters. Following is a summary of activity in these areas during the 1997-98 fiscal year.

### The 1997-98 PIKE Fund


For the fiscal year ending June 30, 1998, over 5,600 alumni and friends of Pi Kappa Alpha made gifts to the Foundation's annual fund, or PIKE Fund as it became known in 1996, totalling \$310,100. \$208,588 of this figure were gifts to the Foundation's direct mail campaign, \$89,578 was raised through phonathon efforts by volunteers from five chapters, and \$11,935 was contributed by undergraduate brothers joining the phi phi kappa alpha club. This total was some \$31,890 less than 1997-98 receipts which totaled \$341,991, which included the hugely successful autographed *The Oak:* A History of Pi Kappa Alpha gift premium program. 


### The phi phi kappa alpha club

Begun in 1992 to encourage lifelong support of the Pi Kappa Alpha Educational Foundation beginning at the undergraduate level, the phi phi kappa alpha club saw record activity during the fiscal year ending June 30, 1997. 693 undergraduate brothers contributed \$11,935 to the Foundation, of which 100% of these monies was deposited to the Chapter Fund Endowment of the respective undergraduate donor.



The Pi Kappa Alpha Educational Foundation defines any immediate gift of \$10,000 or more as a major gift. The Foundation received \$131,291 in cash or marketable securities in this regard during the 1997-98 fiscal year, which included contributions to endow scholarship funds, seed funding for chapter specific educational facilities grants, and unrestricted gifts for general operations.

# The Oak Trust

As of June 30, 1998, the following brothers and friends of the Pi Kappa Alpha Educational Foundation had named the Foundation as beneficiary of a planned gift. These future gifts are funded primarily through bequests, charitable trusts, and gifts of life insurance proceeds, all of which have positive tax ramifications to the donor and his estate.

# **Expenditures**

Through the generous support of thousands of loyal alumni, the Pi Kappa Alpha Educational Foundation provides financial assistance for qualified endeavors to the Pi Kappa Alpha General Fraternity, its chapters and individual members of the Fraternity through various means including scholarships and low interest student loans, reimbursement of initiation fees to join the prestigious Phi Beta Kappa and Omicron Delta Kappa honor societies, grants to the Pi Kappa Alpha General Fraternity for educational and leadership based programming, and the upkeep and care of the Pi Kappa Alpha Memorial Headquarters, including all IIKA archives and memorobilia contained therein, in Memphis, Tennessee. Specific activity in these areas during the fiscal year ended June 30, 1998 included:

#### **Scholarships**

Over \$40,000 in scholarships was granted to deserving undergraduate brothers during the 1997-98 fiscal year, recognizing academic excellence, demonstrated leadership to the chapter and/or campus, or a combination of both. Many of these scholarships, funded by generous alumni, are endowed so they will be available through perpetuity.

A complete listing of 1997-98 scholarship recipients appears below.

#### **Educational Grants**

During the past fiscal year, the Pi Kappa Alpha Educational Foundation granted \$189,875 to the Pi Kappa Alpha General Fraternity and various chapters in support of qualified educational endeavors. These grants included funding for educational and leadership based forums for our undergraduate brothers on timely topics including improving academic performance, substance abuse, values and ethics and graduate school planning, just to name a few.

#### **Student Loan Program**

The effects of a strong ecomony and tight labor market were reflected in student loan demand from the Foundation during the 1997-98 fiscal year. \$29,500 in new student loans was granted to qualified brothers pursuing undergraduate and graduate degrees, compared to \$40,000 in new loans for the 1996-97 fiscal year. The Foundation currently

manages over \$200,000 in performing loans in various stages of repayment.

The Student Loan Program offers interestfree loans until 90 days after a student leaves school, at which time the loan begins accruing interest at a rate of 8% annually.

#### Sabre & Key Honor Society

Founded in 1996 to recognize our most outstanding brothers in every chapter, the Sabre and Key Honor Society tapped 26 new brothers into membership this past year. To qualify for this prestigous society, undergraduate brothers must meet minimum requirements of no less than a 3.5 Grade Point Average, or equivalent, and be in the top 10% of their class.



# LaForge Completes 50th Career Marathon





#### Dr. A. Everette James Leads Historic Renovation in Robersonville

State and local dignitaries gathered in Robersonville, North Carolina on July 19, 1998 to celebrate the restoration and grand opening of the old Bank of Robersonville Building.

The ceremony began at 2 p.m. at St. James Place Museum at Outerbridge Street and U.S. 64. Dr. Everette James (North Carolina, Tau '57), the local arts patron who restored the bank building, hosted the affair, which included a visit from Betty Ray McCain, North Carolina secretary of cultural resources.

A tour of the restored 1910 bank building, located at the intersection of Main and Railroad streets, followed the ceremony.

James began the restoration of this elegant and imposing downtown structure in 1995, after decades of neglect. He hopes the work will help revitalize Robersonville's historical commercial district.

In addition to McCain, James invited Robersonville Mayor Frank Measamer to welcome guests at the St. James's Place ceremony. Myrick Howard, president of Preservation North Carolina and Reid Thomas of the North Carolina department of archives also spoke.

James led a tour of the bank, which was constructed just after the turn of the century to serve as the flagship for what was to become an active commercial district. Local businessmen who undertook the venture believed the community had the elements necessary to build and sustain a robust economy, relying principally on prosperous farming in the surrounding area and the implications of the railroad that served Robersonville.

When the Bank of Robersonville was completed in 1910, it became, and has remained, the only three-story building in town. Meanwhile, two hotels rose in the immediate area to accommodate visiting businessmen who were expected to engage in commerce with the locals. Other buildings dotted the tree lined and unpaved Main Street, according to the Manning Archives and Martin Community College.

The bank structure boasts a number of architectural refinements unique to the town. From its external surface of sand-colored brick and wooden trim with decorative metal embellishment to the parapet,

the building from the second decade of the century reflected the optimism of the founders.

But the heavy influx of businessmen from the outside world failed to materialize. Activity at the bank fell short of boom times, as did the traffic at the new hotels. It became clear that the project would fail to meet the hopes of the bank's founders. By approximately 1921 the Bank of Robersonville was merged with a competitor and banking activity left the corner of Railroad and Main.

With the departure of the bank, the building served several purposes, and following World War II, a beauty salon and barber shop occupied the first floor. Attorneys and other professionals moved into the second floor, while on the third floor, where the board room of the bank was formerly located, the area


has served as apartments, an artist's studio and as a storage area.

The bank building was offered for sale privately in the mid-1990s. In 1995, James, a retired radiologist, medical school professor and writer, evaluated the property with members of the North Carolina Department of Archives and History and with various professional restorers for its potential to qualify as a structure of historical importance. If he were successful, he hoped the building could once again become the flagship for his home town.

James had restored the Primitive Baptist Church (also circa 1910) at the corner of Outerbridge Street and U.S. Highway 64 in Robersonville. The church subsequently was made into a museum. St. James Place, dedicated to Pattie Royster James, houses the James Wilson Collection of North Carolina Pottery (750 pieces, 1860-1950), the James Collection of North Carolina Quilts, and vintage furniture.

The subject of newspaper and magazine articles, the museum and its collections won for James the Carraway Award from Preservation North Carolina for its restoration.

James purchased the Bank of Robersonville building in 1996 and restoration began under the guidelines of the Na-

tional Trust, the U.S. Department of Interior and the North Carolina Department of Cultural Resources, and with assistance from the Eastern office of the North Carolina Department of Archives and History.

"The concept was to restore the Bank of Robersonville to its former structural integrity and grace and to preserve an architectural landmark that might appropriately be listed by the National Trust and Department of Interior," James told the periodical *Southern Antiques* in May.

He hopes the project will allow the bank building to once again come forth as a community asset that will provide impetus for a Main Street project and designation of the town's business area as a historical district. The prospects look good, he said, and the building already has several tenants.

"Clip and Curl," a combination barber shop and beauty salon, will presently occupy the first floor. The second floor will serve as gallery space for the inventory of St. James Place, dealing in fine art and antiques. The third floor will house the offices of United Medical International, a consulting firm for medical imaging, informatics and health care planning.



#### Pikes In Print -

Five Seconds to Air: Broadcast Journalism Behind the Scenes by Bob Losure Hillsboro Press, \$24.95

"Five seconds to air."

Words that set the adrenaline rushing, quicken the breathing, make the sweat crawl from every pore, the stomach contract, the nerves twitch.

Words that are all too familiar to native Tulsan Bob Losure (Tulsa, Gamma Upsilon '68), who spent 11½ years as an anchor for Cable News Network Headline News. Losure had been with the network almost from the beginning, when Ted Turner's dream of a 24-hour television news channel was being dubbed by insiders as the "Chicken Noodle Network."

One day after his 50th birthday party in 1997, he returned to work in Atlanta, Georgia, and turned in his notice.

"I just didn't want to do (broadcast journalism) anymore," he said, "I wanted to write a book that would set the record straight about the news business, and get down on paper some of the humorous things that happened in a 30-year career on television."

Losure recently released his book, aptly titled *Five Seconds to Air: Broadcast Journalism Behind the Scenes* (Hillsboro Press, \$24.95). The book traces Losure's career from its beginnings at a Detroit radio station to his work at Tulsa's KRMG (740 AM) and KOTV Channel 6, to his time at CNN.


"The one thing was I had always wanted to put down in writing what I had done in this business, for my own self-gratification," said Losure. "Also, I thought if I wrote a book, it would hopefully spur some speaking engagements." On that score, Losure has been successful – he is a corporate spokesman for several organizations including United Parcel Service and Home Depot.

Five Seconds to Air goes into detail about events traumatic and silly, from Losure's victory over cancer (which gave him the impetus to go after the CNN job) to barging unannounced into Tina Turner's dressing room for an interview, from the 1997 John F. Kennedy document controversy that ended up with him facing off with Ed Bradley on "60 Minutes" to watching a fellow CNN broadcaster narrowly escape disaster by refusing to read an erroneous bulletin that President George Bush had died on a visit to China.

Losure started working on the book in 1996 as a way to pass the time on an overseas flight to South Korea. He wrote the first 53 pages, declared it junk and deemed it "the ruminations of a man on a long transoceanic trip." He put the book away until May 1997, when he left CNN.

"I had no publisher – I basically, did it on my own," said the University of Tulsa graduate. "I got to a fourth draft by late January this year. A good friend of mine, Southern humorist Beau Whaley, helped me find my way through this publishing thing. He put my manuscript in front of a vice president with Hillsboro Press."

Bob Losure was inducted into the Pi Kappa Alpha Educational Foundation's Order of West Range at the 1996 International Convention in Kansas City.



# Pikes On CD – Memory Dean



Memory Dean Shake It Up Capricorn Records

When you combine a Pike and a Sigma Chi from the University of Georgia, then "shake it up", you get Memory Dean. Jay Memory (*Georgia, Alpha Mu '87*) and band co-founder/Sigma Chi Bubba Dean head the harmonic, exuberant and eclectic band that is drawing rave reviews for its major label debut CD and live performances.


While undergraduates at Georgia, Memory and Dean met at a Pi Kappa Alpha rush party. Early in the friendship, each realized that the other had tremendous musical talent. After a long evening of conversation and guitar playing at Lake Lanier, a partnership was formed.

Originally an acoustic duo, in 1992 Memory Dean released an independent tape titled *Highway Twenty-Nine*, a reference to the highway connecting Atlanta and Athens. The following year saw the release of the band's first CD simply titled *Memory Dean*. The disc features cover art by Howard Fenster, the folk artist famous for R.E.M.'s *Reckoning* cover art. Memory Dean began to move to more of an electric sound on 1995's *Stomp*. Also in 1995, the band added bass guitarist Mark "The

Shadow" Ross and drummer Larry Voss.

The fuller electric sound combined with the growing loyal audience led legendary Capricorn Records to sign Memory Dean. With Widespread Panic and the Freddy Jones Band, Capricorn is known as a label rich in artist development. Shake It Up, the band's 1997 Capricorn debut, was produced by Jeff Tomei (known for his work with Smashing Pumpkins and Matchbox 20). The disc mirrors Memory Dean's raucous on-stage delivery. Influenced by brisk sales and a bright future, Capricorn picked up the band's option for a second CD to be released spring 1999.

Whenever Memory Dean plays a college



town, the band always visits the Pi Kappa Alpha and Sigma Chi houses. Says Memory, "The best thing about being in a large, international fraternity is that everywhere you go, you always run into a brother. Music and meeting new people is our life, so we've got to make the most of it." Recalling the Pi Kappa Alpha Preamble, Memory states, "These relationships should be for all of our mutual benefit... might even say mutual benefit and advancement."

With a rigorous touring schedule, Memory credits the support of his bandmates and, most importantly, his wife Kappy. The band realizes the importance of playing in front of as many fans as possible. "Even in clubs, a Memory Dean show takes you back to what it was like when you were right in the front row at a Pike party. When you see us, be sure to come up and say, 'Hey, brother. Phi phi'."

#### Joe N. Basore

Joe Neff Basore (Arkansas, Alpha Zeta '48), of Bella Vista, Arkansas, died June 13, 1998, in Springdale, Arkansas. He attended college and law school at the University of Arkansas. He served in the National Guard from 1947 to 1950; he served in the United States Air Force Office of Special Investigation as a first lieutenant from 1951-1955. He joined his father-in-law, John A. Cooper, in community building in 1955; they started as Cherokee Village Development Company, known today as Cooper Communities, Inc. He was widely recognized for developing the marketing program for the company. He served as sales representative, vice president, sales manager, project manager, director of housing division, senior vice president of marketing, chairman of the boards of Village Insurance, Inc. and Ad Agency. He retired as vice chairman of the board in October 1985. He served on the National Land Company Board, Cherokee Village, Bella Vista Village, Arkansas Travel Foundation, as president of the Arkansas Society of Sons of the American Revolution and president of Northwest Arkansas Radiation. He served as chairman and was a member of the College of the Ozarks board of trustees and vice chairman of the board of directors of the First National Bank of Berrryville. He was a charter member of the First United Methodist Church of Bella Vista and the First United Methodist Church of Cherokee Village. Survivors include his wife, a son and daughterin-law, Mr. & Mrs. J. Neff Basore, Jr., a granddaughter, Kathryn Ann Basore and a grandson, Joe Neff Basore, III.

#### Robert E. McCarthy

When I pledged PiKA, the SMC was Robert E. McCarthy (California-Berkeley, Alpha Sigma '50). He had been the student body president at Bakersfield High, my hometown. Bob passed away the same day as Garff Wilson (California-Berkeley, Alpha Sigma '27). Coincidentally, Garff, a speech professor at UC, had led a group of students to Europe in 1952. Bob was one of them.

Bob was a second generation Alpha Sigma (his father was Robert E. McCarthy '23).

He was a very successful businessman with the family business, McCarthy Tank and Steel, and a community leader, serving as president and then treasurer of the Boy Scouts of America, Southern Sierra Council. He was also one of my favorite people. He was a member of Phi Beta Kappa as an engineer (not an easy task), active on the UC campus, and married the Daffodil Queen, Louise Fischer. They raised four children, Robert, Ann, Kathleen and William. He was a wonderful example of PiKA.

#### Llewellyn B. Moses

Llewellyn B. (Bill) Moses (Gamma Pi '39) transferred one year after his initiation to the University of Southern California, where he served as SMC of Gamma Eta. Following military service in World War II, Bill was active in the Los Angeles advertising community, handling accounts for Blue Chip Stamps, Midas Muffler, and Postal Instant Press. He was a talented artist and founded Artists Co-Op 7. Bill passed away March 1, 1998, and is survived by his wife, Judge Marilyn Lazar, two sons, two stepsons, daughters-in-law and grandchildren.

#### W. Maxwell Thomas

The man considered by many to be the patriarch of Dallas ophthalmology died June 28, 1998, at Baylor University Medical Center. Dr. W. Maxwell Thomas (Texas, Beta Mu'23) was a leader in introducing contact lenses, corneal transplantation and retinal-detachment surgery in Dallas. Early in his career, Thomas worked hard to help build the department of ophthalmology at UT Southwestern. "He was a workhorse", said Dr. James P. McCulley, chairman of the department of ophthalmology at the University of Texas Southwestern. Thomas was also generous with financial support, establishing an endowed professorship.

Thomas practiced in Dallas between 1928 and 1972 and served as a volunteer advisor at UT Southwestern until 1985. During his career, he was chief of the eye clinics at Children's Medical Center in Dallas, Parkland Hospital, and the Veterans' Administration medical centers in Dallas and McKinney. His volunteer work included more than three decades at the Hope Cottage, and he established Dallas' first free refraction clinic at Baylor University Medical Center, also working at St. Paul Hospital's free clinic.

Thomas received his medical degree at

UT Medical Branch at Galveston in 1927. After an internship in Kansas City, Missouri, Thomas attended Washington University in St. Louis, where he specialized in ophthalmology. In 1928, he moved to Dallas and began practice with three friends of his grandfather, Dr.John P.C. Coleman, a physician recognized by many as the founder of Texas Tech University. His first job as an eye doctor was with the Works Progress Administration in Dallas.

From 1942 to 1946, he was a Navy commander based in the Fiji Islands. "I was the only ophthalmologist anywhere in the area," Thomas told *The Dallas Morning News* in 1971. "They didn't even have any instruments for me; I had to bring my own."

Thomas is survived by his wife, Barbara, a son, Maxwell Thomas of Los Angeles, a daughter, Irma Wright of Canyon Lake, Texas, two grandchildren, and five greatgrandchildren.

#### Joe E. Whitesides

Joe Edward Whitesides (Gamma Epsilon '63) died June 8, 1998, in Bountiful, Utah. He graduated from Utah State University in 1936, where he was named All-Conference End in football. He coached at Bear River High School, then began a coaching career at Utah State from 1937 to 1953, which included positions of assistant coach, head basketball coach, director of athletics, and Dean of Students. Whitesides was an officer in the Utah National Guard, and served in the Pacific during World War II as lieutenant colonel and commanding officer of the 204th Field Artillery Battalion. From 1953 to 1967, he was a colonel in the National Guard, serving as property and fiscal officer for the State of Utah.

Whitesides served on the Alumni Council at Utah State as president. He was inducted into the Old Main Society in 1998. He represented District 12 in the Utah State Legislature from 1974 to 1982, as a member of the Public Education, Appropriation and Rules Committee, of which he was chairman. As a member of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, he held several teaching and administrative positions.

Whitesides married Lazelle Ewing in 1934, and they had two children, a son, Kim, and a daughter, Jill. His wife died in 1982; he later married Elma Cheney.

#### James M. Windham

James Marvin Windham (Texas, Beta Mu '36) entered Chapter Eternal on June 11, 1998. He received a bachelor's degree from the University of Texas in 1940. Three years later, he married Woerman Gibson. He joined the U.S. Army, where he served in the Pacific Theater in World War II as captain of artillery from 1941 to 1945. He was involved for over 30 years in the oil field construction business, serving as president of Windham and Son, Inc., until 1975, when he sold the company and became engaged in personal investments. He was a member of the Livingston I.S.D. board of trustees, president of the Polk County Chamber of Commerce, elected to the Texas House of Representatives from 1948 to 1950, chairman of the Texas Board of Hospitals and Special Schools. He was elected Polk County's Man of the Year in 1954, served 22 years on the board of Texas Department of Corrections for four years as chairman. He served for 50 years as director of the First State Bank of Livingston. He was the recipient of the Silver Beaver Award from the Boy Scouts of America.

#### Garff B. Wilson

Garff Bell Wilson (California-Berkleley, Alpha Sigma '27), professor emeritus of rhetoric, the self-described "unidentified man on the right" who welcomed kings, presidents, and other world fig-

ures to the University of California-Berkeley, died May 6, 1998, in Berkeley. He was 89.

From the time of his initiation into Alpha Sigma Chapter at Cal-Berkeley on January 30, 1927, Brother Wilson was one of its most loyal members, serving it in so many ways, including more than thirty-five years as faculty advisor. He was a prominent figure on the Cal-Berkeley campus, not only for his stature as professor of rhetoric, but also because he was the hand-picked representative of the campus president to meet every dignitary that visited the university. It was an enriching experience for the chapter to have him attend dinners and house meetings and to hear first hand of the protocols in meeting President John F. Kennedy, Prime Minister Nehru, Crown Prince Charles, Robert Frost, and so many others. Of course, having the gift of eloquence, grace, and a rich baritone voice kept all in rapt attention as each encounter was always vividly described. Perhaps the most memorable Founder's Day Banquets in Alpha Sigma history were those in the 50s when Brother Wilson was the master of ceremonies and Brother Lynn "Pappy" Waldorf, head football coach at Cal-Berkeley, was the guest

speaker. It was through Garff's efforts that "Pappy" (Syracuse, Alpha Chi '21) maintained a close liaison with the chapter. It was entirely due to his easy manner, and tireless, gentle prodding that the elderly couple who owned the residence next to the fraternity decided to sell to no one else, enabling Alpha Sigma to acquire a piece of property valued today at fifteen times its original cost.

What good fortune for Alpha Sigma that

this Ogden, Utah, native got on a train in the Fall of 1926, headed west for Berkeley, and founded our fraternity. 
Dear Pi Kappa Alpha:

Mary Jane Collins, a jazz and blues musician, was the honorary Dream Girl of Eta Chapter (*Tulane*). She died on May 12, 1998 at her home in Metarie, Louisiana. Ms. Collins was best known as the voice and the familiar face behind the piano at Pat O'Brien's during the 40s and 50s. She owned the club Mary Jane's.

Born in Texas and raised in the Midwest, Ms. Collins came to New Orleans in the early 1940s to do defense work. When the war ended, she began playing piano at the Embassy Lounge on Bourbon Street.

She performed for 10 years at Pat O'Brien's and became O'Brien's partner. She would greet every group of Pikes and their rushees with "How'd You Like to be a PiKA?" or "Here's to PiKA".

In 1965, she moved to Memphis, Tennessee, where she set the standard for piano bar entertainment. Her ability to connect with her audiences convinced Kemmons Wilson, founder and former owner of Holiday Inn Hotels, that entertainment in a hotel lounge is an asset. She became a piano entertainer with Holiday Inn until 1979. While in Memphis, she often entertained at Pi Kappa Alpha events, most notably at the 1976 National Convention in Memphis.

The next year, she became the first president of the Blues Foundation, an organization dedicated to promoting the blues. She was a member of Beta Sigma Phi Sorority.

Survivors include two stepsons, Louis J. and Vincent P. Caruso, a stepdaughter, Bernadine Caruso, six step grandchildren, and seven step-greatgrandchildren.
