his invaluable service as the Fraternity's legal counsel to which he honored us with his acceptance.







Pike descended from Toledo's oldest fraternity.

On Saturday, April 6, 2002, the University of Toledo Colony was installed as Epsilon Epsilon Chapter of Pi Kappa Alpha. The chartering reestablishes Pi Kappa Alpha as a prominent fraternity at UT after a five-year absence and brings back the campus' oldest Greek group, dating back to 1915.

The celebration of the proud rebirth of Epsilon Epsilon Chapter took place in the luxurious setting of Heatherdowns Country Club in Toledo, with over 220 guests who enjoyed meeting the newest members of Pi Kappa Alpha. The chapter was honored by the presence of International President H. King

Buttermore III (Vanderbilt, Sigma '63), who gave an inspiring welcome to the chapter as keynote speaker, along with University of Toledo President Daniel Johnson, UT Greek Life Advisor Marna Ridenour-Ward, and Great Lakes Regional President Kevin Virta (Western Michigan, Epsilon Psi '83). The colony was well supported byparents, friends and many Toledo alumni at this special evening.

From Colony To Chapter

When Epsilon Epsilon Chapter surrendered its charter in early 1996, Toledo alumni made plans to reestablish the chapter as soon as possible. After several conversations with then Director of Expansion Ryan Flickinger (Southern Illinois, Iota Mu'94), members of the Pi Kappa Alpha Memorial Headquarters staff visited the University of Toledo. The International Fra-

ternity and alumni representatives made their case for expansion to the Toledo administration, and found that Pike was in competition with three other national fraternities. Due to the success of that presentation, Pi Kappa Alpha was invited to come to campus in late 2000.

That fall, Chapter Consultants DruWilson (East Central, Epsilon Omega '96) and Ashley Offermann (Utah, Alpha Tau '97) held interviews with campus leaders, staff, sororities and alumni, and recruited 54 men to establish the colony on November 13, 2000. At 54 men, the colony was already the second largest fraternity at UT. Alumnus Paul Wannemacher (Toledo, Epsilon Epsilon '80) was chosen to be chapter advisor and Professor David Howard (Toledo, Epsilon Epsilon '67) was chosen as faculty advisor.

Immediately, the chapter set about attaining their goals and establishing the colony as an energetic force. When the petition to charter the colony was submitted in February 2002, the colony had 51 members. As a top group at UT, the colony led campus groups in community service and campus involvement and placed second in academics among fraternities. Expansion Consultants Matt Johnson (Southern Methodist, Zeta Beta '98) and Jason Patocka (Northern *Iowa, Theta Zeta '97)* maintained contact with the group and continued to help them develop into a cohesive unit that was at its peak as the colony inspection approached.

On March 23, 2002, the colony inspection was conducted by representatives from Wayne State University (*Delta Nu*), the University of Michigan (*Beta Tau*), and Ohio State University (*Alpha Rho*), along with Great Lakes Regional President Virta. The colony was unanimously approved for chartering two weeks later, and initiations took place in Toledo on Friday, April 5th. The initiations were assisted by then Expansion Coordinator Justin Buck (*Southeast Missouri*, *Epsilon Iota* '96), Offermann, Wannemacher, and Toledo House Corporation President Tom Muenger (*Toledo, Epsilon Epsilon* '67).

University History

The University of Toledo began in 1872 as a private arts and trades school offering painting and architectural drawing as its only subjects. The university evolved into a four-year institution in the 1900s and added athletics, Greek organizations, and additional courses of study over the next decade.

In 1928 Dr. Henry J. Doermann became president and wanted the campus to reflect the best design elements of the universities of Europe. Almost all buildings at UT reflect the collegiate gothic design scheme, adding to the attractiveness of its rolling, well landscaped campus.

The University of Toledo is one of Ohio's largest universities, with emphasis on engineering, education, pharmacy, law and arts & sciences. In the 125 years since, the university has grown into a comprehensive institution offering more than 250 undergraduate and graduate programs to more than 20,000 students from around the world.

The Greek System

UT's Greek System was formed on December 6, 1916 with the recognition of The Cresset Fraternity, which later became Pi Kappa Alpha. Today, the University recognizes 11 fraternities and 8 sororities. UT Greeks contribute over 17,000 community service hours and over \$75,000 to local and national charities every year, and contributes student leaders to many organizations including student government, the Leadership UT, Blue Key National Honors Society, Golden Key National Honors Society, SWAT team and Circle K.



EXPANSION

The University of Central Oklahoma welcomed Pi Kappa Alpha as its newest fraternity on Saturday, April 13, 2002. After over a year of hard work and determination by colony members and the current chapter advisor, Lambda Iota Chapter was initiated into the bonds.

On Friday evening, 45 men received the honor of being initiated into Pi Kappa Alpha. Initiation teams consisted of brothers from Beta Omicron (Oklahoma), Gamma Chi (Oklahoma State), and Gamma Upsilon (Tulsa) Chapters. The following day, then Expansion Coordinator Justin Buck (Southeast Missouri, Epsilon Iota '96), along with International President H. King Buttermore III (Vanderbilt, Sigma '63), Past International President John Michael Williams (Oklahoma State, Gamma Chi '68) and Arkoma Regional President BillVogle (Tulsa, Gamma Upsilon '66) conducted the installation ceremony. The group was installed as the "Chartering Members" of Lambda Iota Chapter and Tyson Sjulin (Central Oklahoma, Lambda Iota '02) was installed as the chapter's first president.

International President Buttermore was also the keynote speaker at the evening's black tie event, which was held on the University of Central Oklahoma campus. Attending the banquet were Buck, Williams, Vogle and Lambda Iota Chapter Advisor Dru Wilson (East Central, Epsilon Omega '96), along with representatives from Beta Omicron Chapter. Sorority women and parents also attended that evening, including the newly elected chapter president's father, John Sjulin (Iowa, Gamma Nu'68). Thanks to the work of the Lambda Iota Chapter and the tremendous support from alumni, faculty, and sororities on campus, Pi Kappa Alpha has created a long lasting impression at the University of Central Oklahoma.

Colony History

In October 2000, Expansion Consultant Jason Patocka (Northern Iowa, Theta Zeta



'96) and Chapter Consultant Jason Belland (*Ferris State, Zeta Kappa* '96) began the recruitment process at UCO by conducting interviews for what would be one of the first fraternities to expand on campus in several years. Initially, the team signed 29 men. On October 28 th, the new members were pinned and the colony wasformed.

The Central Oklahoma Colony endured highs and lows, but in fall 2001 the colony members decided to make chartering a reality and set out a plan to become Lambda Iota Chapter. At that same time, Wilson was recruited as chapter advisor and helped steer the colony in the right direction.


After raising the level for fraternities on campus and meeting the goals they set when forming the colony, the group sent in their chartering petition to Expansion Coordinator Buck in February 2002, and an inspection date set.

On October 6, 2001, representatives from Beta Omicron, Epsilon Omega and Gamma Upsilon Chapters, along with Arkoma Regional President Vogle, conducted the colony inspection. Following the team's vote to approve the colony for chartering, Pi Kappa Alpha chapters and the Supreme Council voted unanimously in favor of the chartering of Lambda Iota.

University History & Greek Life

The University of Central Oklahoma, 112 years old, is the third largest university in Oklahoma and leads the state in teacher edu-

> cation, funeral sciences, and criminal justice. Construction began on the first school building in 1890, which is known as Old North (*pictured above*). Old North was opened for classes in 1894, and it is still in use today. In 1972, itwas dedicated as a national historical landmark, and is the marquee building for the university. UCO has




approximately 390 full-time professors, and an additional 255 professionals from the community instruct as adjunct faculty.

Greek life developed slowly at UCO. The first fraternity and sorority were founded in 1959 with Sigma Tau Gamma and Sigma Kappa. Shortly thereafter, Alpha Gamma Delta and a few other national groups were founded. On March 8, 1997, the Delta Zeta Sorority came to campus and Sigma Nu followed two years later. Currently, there are eight men's groups and six women's groups at the University of Central Oklahoma.

PiKappa Alpha and San Jose State Univer-sity proudly welcomed the return of Delta Pi Chapter on Saturday, April 20, 2002, after a 10-year absence. Forty-three men were initiated into the International Fraternity, and joined in celebration at the chartering banquet with over 200 alumni, parents, faculty, and friends at the San Jose Airport Doubletree Hotel. Pi Kappa Alpha's International President H. King Buttermore III (Vanderbilt, Sigma'63) attended along with Memorial Headquarters staff members Justin Buck (Southeast Missouri, Epsilon Iota '96) and Dean Snihur (Alberta, Lambda Epsilon '01), and Golden West Regional President John Silberstein (Chapman, Theta Psi (85)

International President Buttermore made the keynote address, and spoke eloquently on what it means to be a part of Pi Kappa Alpha. San Jose State's Greek Life Advisor Angela Harper congratulated Delta Pi Chapter on attaining success and persevering after a "challenging" colonization period. Colony President Walker Kellogg (San Jose State, Delta Pi'01) presented a unique gift to President Buttermore, a clock constructed of used

computer parts – a gift that represented the City of San Jose, known as the "Heart of Silicon Valley". Also in attendance were Chapter Advisor Rudy Rodriguez (Fresno State, Iota Beta '86) and Alumni Advisory Board member and Alumni Association President Kurt Carrasquilla (San Jose State, Delta Pi'90).

Colony History

The San Jose State Colony had endured numerous peaks and valleys since its inception on December 2, 1998. When the colony was formed, there were 15 founding fathers. The colony grew quickly to over 40 members, recruiting scholars and leaders from various student organizations. However, the following spring, the colony experienced some challenges and lost over half its membership due to conflict and poor communications.

Until the fall of 2000, the colony teetered on the brink of closing down. It was not until spring 2001 that the newer colony members resolved to work to become Delta Pi Chapter. A new alumni advisory board was established under the leadership of Chapter Advisor Rodriguez. Memorial Headquarters provided the necessary tools for organizing the colony, including sending staff to facilitate retreats several times throughout the year. As a result, the colony got back on track toward achieving its goals.

In fall 2001, the colony experienced its greatest growth and goal achievement. Delta Pi Chapter is now the third largest fraternity in the San Jose State Greek system and has maintained one of the highest fraternity GPAs, including sustaining a GPA above the all-men's average.

The colony inspection took place on Sunday, March 10, 2002, at the close of the Golden West Regional Leadership Conference in Reno, Nevada. Although 150 miles away, 42 of 43 colony members attended for the inspection. Kappa Nu (*Pacific*) and Iota Theta (*Cal Poly-San Luis Obispo*) Chapters served as the inspection teams and Regional President Silberstein was the facilitator. Chapter Consultant Drew Rowe (*Western Ontario, Iota Omega '98*) represented Memorial Headquarters.

University History

"Minns' Evening Normal School" was the first public institution of higher education on the West Coast, opening in San Francisco in 1857. The city school became the state "California Normal School" in 1862. San Jose was selected by the State Legislature for the school's location in 1870. Today, San Jose State University offers over 130 undergraduate and graduate degree programs to over 27,000 students.

Greek History

Greek life at San Jose State began in 1898, when Sigma Theta Chi Sorority was established. The first men's fraternity, Delta

Omega Nu, was formed in 1901. During the early 1900s and 1910s, several literary societies were formed that would eventually become fraternities and sororities.

Delta Pi Chapter of Pi Kappa Alpha was first chartered on the SJSU campus on March 1, 1952. Throughout the 1970s, as with most Greek systems, membership dropped significantly. It was not until the 1980s that Greek life experienced growth as multi-cultural fraternities and sororities were established on the SJSU campus.

San Jose State currently has 40 recognized social Greek organizations on campus, which is considered one of the most diverse and unique Greek systems in North America.

I've served as Midwest regional vice president for 11 years. In addition, my commitment to the community in which I live has been impacted by my undergraduate experiences as a community volunteer.

Why is rush so important?

It is the one area where we can beat all the other chapters at once. When we lose someone in rush we have lost someone that we will have to face on the athletic field, in the classroom and throughout the campus as a competitor, as opposed to a brother. It is truly the life blood of the Fraternity. It's what keeps the Fraternity alive. Rush is a friend-making process that allows us to put our best foot forward 365 days a year. It is something we need to do not only with prospective members, but parents, administrators, faculty and community. Everything we do can impact our rush efforts. When we are good community members and classroom members, we are then able to recruit the best men with endorsements from people the rushees respect.



The *Return to Values Initiative*, begun by a focus group of Fraternity and Educational Foundation representatives, approved by members of the Convention's Leadership Committee and unanimously ratified by all Convention delegates, represents Pi Kappa Alpha's renewed focus on the Fraternity's values and purpose. As the necessary first step toward developing programs to advance Pi Kappa Alpha along this course, the 2002 International Convention adopted new Mission, Vision and Creed statements for the Fraternity. These important declarations will serve as the guiding principles for the enhancement of current Fraternity programs, and development of new initiatives – especially in regard to conference programming.

The Two Towers

Pi Kappa Alpha has been fortunate over the past two years to have a leader who speaks with such intelligence, strives for success, and loves all his fellow brothers. It was evident in King Buttermore's farewell speech that his love for the members of our Fraternity was constant and unwavering. As he communicated his farewell to a room of over 600 people and recited the successes of the last two years, it was evident that a mix of sadness and sense of accomplishment flowed throughout the crowd. When the presidency was formally passed to D. Mark Anderson at the final banquet, a new chapter in the history of Pi Kappa Alpha was opened. The transition between international presidents did not skip a beat and it was evident in our new president's address. His message is simple, yet significant: "Fail:" failures can only come if you take risks. "Risk:" risks are what's needed to make personal, chapter, and Fraternity advancement. "Try:" try new things, take chances, make change, and success will follow. The Pike Vision (in its simplest sense) sets the standard. Anderson and the rest of the Supreme Council are trailblazers who strive to attain that vision, and that can only be done by taking chances and trying new things. Brothers across North America should be proud of what their Fraternity has come to be, and in the direction it's headed.

The only question left to answer is, "Who will be the first?"

Who will be the first to meet our Vision? Who will be the first to complete our Mission?

Who will be the first to live our *Creed*?

Who will be our leaders at the 2004 convention?

The answer to all of these questions could be "You."



2002 Distinguished Achievement Award Presented to Tim McGraw

Tim McGraw (Louisiana-Monroe, Eta Omicron'86) entered the Awards Banquet at the 2002 Convention with style only a true superstar could pull off. After accepting a standing ovation and a gracious introduction by Jeff Thompson, his longtime friend and pledge brother, the recipient of the 2002 Distinguished Achievement Award gave the packed house an emotional speech about how the Fraternity influenced his dream to pursue country music. He joins the ranks of past Distinguished Achievement Award winners, including national champion football coach Bobby Bowden (Samford, Alpha Pi '92), Denver Broncos owner Patrick D. Bowlen (Oklahoma, Beta Omicron '92) and former president of American Express Financial R. Craig Hoenshell (Nebraska-Omaha, Delta Chi '92). McGraw is also a member of the Pi Kappa Alpha Educational Foundation's Order of West Range.

McGraw exploded onto the music scene with his debut album *Tim McGraw*. The awards began coming in a short time later – he received the Blockbuster Entertainment Awards Favorite CD, Country Music Television Awards Male Video Artist of the Year, Academy of Country Music Album of the Year and the Academy of Country Music Top New Male Vocalist, just to name a few. Since that time he has earned over 35 awards from the music industry for his singles, vocal collaborations, albums, artistry, videos and tour packages. Most recently he has been named as the Favorite Male Artist by the American Music Awards, Blockbuster Awards and *Play*-



boy magazine, and was named entertainer of the year by the Country Music Association. In 2001, Tim and wife Faith Hill won a Grammy for vocal collaboration. He has sold more than 25 million albums and singles.

McGraw's record of service to his community, fraternity and country is a distinguished one. In 1994, he organized the first Swampstock, a fundraising event which began as a softball game to raise funds for hometown Little League in Rayville, Louisiana. Today, Swampstock consists of a celebrity softball game and multi-artist concert with attendance in excess of 20,000. The 2001 ac-

In May 2001, at the University of Louisiana-Monroe commencement ceremonies, a crowd of nearly 8,000 saw the University confer an honorary doctorate of humanities on McGraw. "Mr. McGraw, his wife, and their friends have worked tirelessly to give young people from the rural south an opportunity to succeed through a variety of venues," said ULM President Lawson Swearingen, Jr., "including little league baseball, scholarships to open the doors to higher education, and benefit concerts for regional cultural entities such as Friends of the Jackson Zoo, as well as benefits for families torn by tragedy, such as those who lost loved ones during the U.S.S. Cole incident."

Since his initiation in 1986, McGraw has continued to stay involved with his chapter and the International Fraternity. As an undergraduate he served Eta Omicron Chapter as secretary. He was also active in multiple intramural championship teams and attended the 1988 International Convention commemorating the dedication of the new Memorial Headquarters in Memphis, Tennessee. He made Pi Kappa Alpha a family tradition for his brother Mark McGraw and father (and baseball great) Tug McGraw by participating in their special initiation at the 2001 Swampstock.

McGraw and his wife, country music superstar Faith Hill, reside in Nashville, Tennessee. They have three daughters, Gracie Katherine, 5, Maggie Elizabeth, 2, and Audrey Caroline, 8 months. In 2000, McGraw was named Father of the Year by the National Fatherhood Initiative.

CHAPTER ADVISOR OF THE YEAR

Charles R. Weaver (Clemson, Eta Alpha '76) Advisor to Eta Alpha Chapter at Clemson University



What do you think it takes to be a successful alumnus advisor/volunteer in Pi Kappa Alpha?

The best way to describe what it takes to be an alumnus advisor/volunteer can be summarized using a common acronym – COPAY.

No, this does mean that you pay ten dollars and get a heart transplant and a crown on your tooth, but the concept is the same. You invest a little of yourself and your time, and the benefits never stop paying you.

Dr. Jerry Askew (North Carolina, Tau '73)said recently in his speech at the International Convention: "...you can never pay back what Pi Kappa Alpha has done for you – you have to pay ahead."

COPAY also has a deeper meaning; each letter has a meaning as it relates to advising and volunteerism. They are:

"C" stands for *cognizance*. Always know what you are getting into and how much time it will take. Always be aware of what is going on and recognize problems. This minimizes the chance that your expectations will not be met, and by the same token, you will not let anyone down.

"O" stands for *organize*. Organize your thoughts and expectations. Organize your guys too, and teach them the organizational skills to minimize wasting your time and that of other volunteers. Organization is the key to success.

"P" stands for *patience*. Patience with college-age men is something that takes a great deal of effort and time to develop. I deeply admire college professionals for

their mastery of this elusive virtue. The advisor/volunteer job is difficult if you cannot muster some patience.

"A" stands for *ask*. If you want to know what is going on, just ask. Be aware of your surroundings, and if things don't add up, ask.

"Y" stands for *year*. Once you get involved, evaluate your progress every year. Make a change if your volunteerism takes more from you than you have to give.

Success as an advisor comes with the small achievements the chapter makes, as well as large accomplishments, like the elusive "Smythe", that take success to a whole new level.

Success as an advisor/volunteer comes when you are cognizant, organized, patient, not afraid to ask what is going on, and assessing your impact on a yearly basis.

Success comes personally when you always "pay ahead"!

Why would you encourage an alumnus to become actively involved with a chapter?

Our faith teaches us to "give of yourself" – what better reason. We are all blessed with talents to share with young men. We can also act as role models for the three F's: FAITH, FAMILY, and FRATERNITY.

Active involvement can mean a seat on the house corporation board to advising a group of young men on the proper way to handle a meeting, practice the ritual,

n behalf of the Supreme Council and your Memorial Headquarters Staff, please accept the 2001-2002 Annual Report of the Pi Kappa Alpha Fraternity. Imagine the awe of our Founders if the fruits of that meeting in 47 West Range on March 1, 1868 could be seen by them today. Pi Kappa Alpha is synonymous with success, merit and distinction throughout the fraternity world. Our inter-fraternal organizations call upon our staff for guidance and assistance. Our operational model is acclaimed as unparalleled, but continues to be refined. Our expansion program resulted in eleven charterings during the past biennium, and two of those newly chartered groups have already earned the coveted Smythe Award, as being the best of the best. The following highlights demonstrate the excellence of Pi Kappa Alpha which is reflected in this Annual Report:

- Pi Kappa Alpha pledged more than 5,200 men last year and initiated nearly 4,400 new brothers.
- The Fraternity continues to lead all fraternities in terms of average chapter size, a major indicator of chapter strength.
- Pi Kappa Alpha maintains its status as one of North America's leading frater-

nities with 208 chapters and five colonies.

 Pike pledged and initiated more men on a per chapter basis than any other fraternity.

Your Supreme Council passed the torch of the brotherhood to its successors at the historic and remarkably successful Palm Springs Convention in August, 2002. We anticipate that this flame will inspire new goals, new aspirations, and will raise the level of expectations of our undergraduate chapters in the United States and Canada. The Return to Values Initiative received unanimous approval by the Convention. You will be learning about the new creed which was adopted as a part of the initiative, giving each brother a tangible, public verbalization of the mysteries of our order, which can be applied by each brother in real life encounters. I challenge each alumnus to adopt Pi Kappa Alpha's creed even though it was adopted after you completed your university experience.

A substantial completion of the tasks adopted in the Fraternity's Strategic Plan have been accomplished. As the list of unfinished items grows shorter, it is anticipated that a new strategic plan will be created, utilizing wisdom and experience from all elements of the Fraternity family. Pi Kappa Alpha will not settle for the status quo, but will always assess, aspire, and adopt those actions which are essential for growth, success, and validity.

Through our core of volunteer international officers, through our

alumni mentors in the chapters, through our undergraduate brothers now committed and even those yet to come, and through our most professional and dedicated Memorial Headquarters staff, Pi Kappa Alpha will continue to focus on values-based education of our brothers... for life. 
The Numbers

Pi Kappa Alpha ended the 2001-2002 year having pledged more than 5,200 men and initiated more than 4,300 via 203 chapters and five colonies. The pledging totals represent some of our best results in the past five years, while our initiation total represents the Fraternity's second-best year since 1994. We are encouraged by what we see to be a continuing upward trend in overall fraternity membership, and in Pi Kappa Alpha in particular. These figures should keep Pi Kappa Alpha on top in terms of average pledgings and initiations per chapter - one of the best measurements of overall fraternity strength.

Leadership Programs

Pi Kappa Alpha continued to lead the way this past year, in terms of leadership programming quality and undergraduate attendance. The 2001 Officers Leadership Academy provided a fitting kick-off to another outstanding year of leadership events.

The Officers Leadership Academy (OLA) was held outside Memphis, Tennessee at Whispering Woods Hotel & Conference Center. The four-day program featured intensive programming specifically designed for chapter officers. A popular new addition to the 2001 OLA was a five-part personal development and leadership track facilitated by International Education Advisor Michael A. Hayes (Indiana State, Theta Omicron '82), Educational Advisory Committee



member W. Patrick Haun (High Point, Delta Omega '89) and former staff member Mark C. Dziatczak (Wavne State. Delta Nu '91). Special attention and resources were provided to recruitment chairmen by the International Rush Advisory Committee during four newly developed rush sessions. Attendees were also able to learn important leadership and fraternal lessons from an all-star faculty list that included Past National President Jerry Askew (North Carolina, Tau '73), International Historian Dr. Jerry Reel (Tulane, Eta '57), International Vice President Allen Groves (Stetson, Delta Upsilon '79) and former staff member Chris Peterson (Florida, Alpha Eta '91). Also packed into the OLA's agenda was a trip to the AAA Memphis Redbirds baseball game, the dedication of the Lighty-Wade Courtyard and Pavilion at the Memorial Headquarters and the 2000-2001 International Awards, including the presentation of the Loyalty Award to R. B. Johnson (*Linfield, Delta Rho '51*) and the Distinguished Achievement Award to Dr. E. Gordon Gee (*Alpha Tau, Utah '63*).

During the course of the year, the Fraternity sponsored sixteen **Regional Leadership Conferences**, drawing more than 2,200 undergraduate Pikes from across North America and nearly 100 local advisors and house corporation members. These conferences were once again coordinated by each region's dedicated volunteer – the regional president. At least two members of the Fraternity's professional staff, an Inter-

national Officer and Supreme Council member were able to attend most of these weekend events. The primary focus of the conferences continues to be recruitment, risk awareness, pledge education and chapter finances.

The 2002 Chapter Presidents Conference (CPC) set new attendance records in its 30th year, in terms of both chapter presidents and rush chairmen (who participated in the affiliated "Rush Summit"). The setting for the CPC was once again the luxurious Peabody Hotel, in downtown Memphis, Tennessee. The International Rush Advisory Committee, ably manned by International Rush Director Todd Mudd (Missouri, Alpha Nu '81), Steve Heck (Kansas State, Alpha Omega '88) and Darius Sidebotham (Florida Tech, Zeta Sigma '94), again rose to the challenge by coordinating the Rush Summit, a multifaceted educational track specifically designed for rush chairmen. dent Dr. Jerry Askew's popular "Strategic Leadership" session, Chris Peterson's "Pledging Our Best" program, International Vice President Allen Groves' risk management discussion and "Leading with Integrity" by special guest faculty member Jim Mitchell. A new addition to the program was a series of "personal development forums", containing topics such as personal finance and goal setting, and "chapter development forums", featuring subjects such as alumni relations and chapter housing operations.

The Fraternity would like to also recognize the International Officers, undergraduates, alumni, guests and staff members who participated as faculty or coordinators for these events; thank you for your service and dedication to Pi Kappa Alpha!

Chapter Services

Throughout the 2001-2002 academic year, the services department continued its support of Pi Kappa Alpha's chapters, members and advisors. This past year, eight new consultants and one senior chapter consultant added to the experience of the Memorial Headquarters staff. During this academic year these talented consultants were able to conduct 25 recruitment or developmental visits, 25 financial visits and 214 chapter visits throughout North America.

New this year was the unveiling of the Fraternity's Chapter Advisor Accreditation Program, available at *www.PIKES.org.* The program, developed by the Chapter Advisor Task Force, provides a valuable new tool for advisors and chapters. More than 135 chapter advisors participated in the program this past year. Emphasis was also placed on the recruitment of chapter advisors; through the Memorial Headquarters, more than 30 alumni expressing an interest in volunteering were placed in contact with a local chapter.

The services department continued to facilitate educational presentations at the sixteen regional leadership conferences, the Officers Leadership Academy, and the Chapter Presidents Conference. With six new chapter consultants joining Director of Services Jason Belland this past June, the department is looking forward to another successful year for Pi Kappa Alpha.

> It was another banner year for Pi Kappa Alpha's expansion department. We continue to be a leader among North American fraternities, boasting a total of eight installations and five colonizations during the year. Of special note was the outstanding success of the West Virginia (*Alpha Theta*) colonization. That effort, led by staffers Beau Carlson (*Iowa State, Alpha Phi* '99) and Dean Snihur (*Alberta, Lambda Epsilon* '00), set an all-time, allfraternity record with 167 colony members by the conclusion of their five-week project!

> Four of the five current colonies are expected to petition to be chartered this fall, with the spring 2002 project, East Carolina University, on schedule to petition this coming spring. Pi Kappa Alpha continues to be aggressive in its expansion efforts with five projects scheduled for the fall and another two confirmed for the following term. Included in confirmed projects are the University of Minnesota, University of British Columbia, George Washington University and the University of California-Irvine.

> The expansion department continues to work with area chapters, alumni, universities and existing colonies in an effort to add strong chapters to our existing ranks. Former chapter consultant Ryan Van Andel (*UC-Berkeley, Alpha Sigma '98*) has assumed the position as director of expansion and will lead a threeperson staff in the upcoming year's expansion efforts.

The Fraternity's official web site has been continually updated and revised, providing Pi Kappa Alpha's public with the latest in Fraternity news and resources. New this year was the unveiling of the chapter programming resource library. The Chapter Programming Flow Chart provides an interactive and effective



databank of the most commonly used Fraternity forms and recommended job descriptions for every chapter officer and chairman.

Last year marked the first time that the Fraternity's monthly publication, the Forum, was distributed entirely via email. While previous editions of the Forum were printed and mailed to chapters, electronic distribution allows the Fraternity to send a copy of the Forum to each pledge, member, alumnus and Greek advisor/dean of students who has provided the Memorial Headquarters with a valid email address – more than 6,000 copies in all. Each edition of the Forum also remains archived for one year on the Fraternity's web site.

The Shield & Diamond magazine continues to be perceived as a leader among fraternity publications, and serves as the Fraternity's most effective and popular communication vehicle. Advertising guidelines have helped Pike reach new and larger markets while creating a revenue stream. This year, Editor Barbara E. Perkins oversaw the circulation of the 291,789 copies of the Fraternity's magazine. The Shield & Diamond also reaches a wider audience through its online version.

Marketing

During the 2001-2002 year, Pi Kappa Alpha unveiled a newly revised marketing program, which focuses on providing positive and timely information to undergraduates, alumni, university and college officials, parents and potential members. Pi Kappa Alpha has been

coordinating its efforts with the ongoing North-American Interfraternity Conference (NIC) marketing initiative by participating in events such as the NIC's Congressional Reception, hosted this year by Congressman Pete Sessions (*Southwestern, Alpha Omicron* '76) and Past National President Ed Pease (*Indiana, Delta Xi* '71). Past National President Tom Handler (*Illinois, Beta Eta* '74) continues to provide valuable leadership to the NIC's Public Relations Task Force.

The Fraternity's licensing and vendor program continued to be enhanced during this past year. Formal application and review procedures for vendor prospects have been established, and additional advertising space was made available in the *Shield & Diamond* Magazine. Over the next few years, the Fraternity anticipates significant growth in this program.

Alumni Affairs

The Fraternity works to provide enhanced opportunities for alumni involvement at all levels of the organization. As our commitment to fraternal excellence continues, so does our commitment to the alumni of Pi Kappa Alpha. Throughout 2001-2002 our alumni, alumni associations and chapters held events ranging from homecoming, golf tournaments, gold and silver anniversaries and Founders Day Banquets to honor our alumni.

This past year the Fraternity, through

our alumni volunteers, was able to provide keynote speakers and guests for 17 different banquets across North America in recognition of Founders Day and homecoming events.

We would like to congratulate our 84 current alumni associations for a great year. Keep up the good work!

Real Estate

The International Fraternity continues to highlight the need for improved care and conditions of our chapter facilities. 176 of our active chapters or colonies occupy some form of real estate. While few fraternities employ even one full time person to work on housing, Pi Kappa Alpha has four professional staff dedicated to real estate matters: Executive Real Estate Officer Daniel W. Corah, Director of Real Estate Clint E. Bartman, Director of Real Estate Programs Justin A. Buck and Real Estate Assistant Heather L. Huffman.

Of the many real estate programs, the loan program is still the premier service offered to house corporations. The Fraternity provides loans for the acquisition of furnishings and equipment; for purchase, construction or renovation purposes; and for professionally conducted capital campaigns. Available loans generally range from \$25,000 to \$250,000. In 2001-02, the Housing Commission committed, modified, or refinanced \$833,754 in loans to Pi Kappa Alpha house corporations.

The Fraternity's role in chapter housing has continued to expand significantly beyond its initial function as that of primarily a lender. New programs have been established that take an empowerment-oriented approach; providing enhanced education and incentives to encourage improved involvement by both students and alumni.


The Fraternity provides a wide array of housing materials and programs to all Pi Kappa Alpha chapters, house corporations and alumni. This past year, educational sessions were presented at regional conferences, the Officers Leadership Academy and the Chapter Presidents Conference. The department also created a quarterly e-mail service titled "The Pike House Link" that assisted in effectively communicating current fraternity housingtrends and resources available to chapter members, house corporations and alumni.

In an effort to increase support and education for alumni and house corporations, the Fraternity successfully hosted two "Housing Summit" educational conferences in 2001. These summits were the first volunteer educational forums held for house corporation officers and provided an expense paid trip for an officer from every corporation to attend one of the events. The first Housing Summit, held in Denver on the weekend of April 28, 2001 had 48 corporations represented and 78 total participants. The second of the two Summits, held in Washington, D.C. on December 1-3, 2001, was rescheduled from September 14-16, due to the tragic events of September 11th. Seventy house corporations were on hand in D.C., representing a total of 118 house corporations. Overall, the summits were able to effectively reach over 83% of all Pi Kappa Alpha house corporations. The feedback from these conferences has been extremely positive, enabling the real estate department to become even more aggressive with the services it provides.

The group property insurance program, coordinated through the Real Estate Department, now has 58 participating locations, representing over \$50 million in total coverage. The purchasing power of the group has saved house corporations thousands of dollars, while providing a comprehensive set of coverages that is far su-

On an international level, quarterly and annual awards are granted providing a combination of press coverage in Fraternity publications, trophies, certificates and grants. tion services, participation incentives, grants and awards to chapters that participate in the event. In its first five years of existence, over 237 events have been hosted, an estimated 7,893 students, parents, guests and alumni have accomplished over 820 individual projects, totaling over \$538,900 in improvements.

The White Horse Holding Corporation, previously known as the Pi Kappa Alpha Holding Corporation, is governed by the Housing Commission and administered by the Real Estate Department. It is a nonprofit corporation created in 1963 for the purpose of holding title to real estate that has been acquired by the International Fraternity. The name was changed in 2000 to help differentiate this entity from other groups using the Fraternity name on both a local and international level. While the International Fraternity prefers not to own chapter houses, circumstances occasionally occur when real estate is acquired. As of June 2002, the Holding Corporation owned property at the University of Virginia, University of Arkansas, West Virginia University, Oregon State University, University of Miami, University of Idaho, University of Minnesota and Creighton University.







The 7 Habits of Highly Effective People



HABIT 4

Think "Win-Win"

nce we've mastered the first three habits, we're ready to move from the "private victory" to the "public victory". Self-mastery and self-

discipline are the foundations of good relationships with others.

We all know what a financial bank account is. If we make deposits in it, money will be there for us to withdraw when we need it. The Emotional Bank Account is a metaphor that describes the amount of trust that has been built up in a personal relationship. If I make deposits into an account with you through courtesy, kindness, honesty, and keeping my commitments to you, I build up a reserve. Your trust for me becomes higher, and I can call on it if I need to. I can even make mistakes, and that trust level will compensate for it. Communication is easy, instant and effective.

Conversely, if I have a habit of showing discourtesy, disrespect, cutting you off, overreacting, betraying your trust, not honoring commitments, or threatening you, my account with you gets overdrawn. If the trust level is low, what flexibility do I have?

None. I'm walking on mine fields. I'm politicking. I have to measure every word. Many organizations and many marriages are like this.

The fourth habit, Think Win-Win, entails making important deposits in another person's Emotional Bank Account, thus finding a way both of you can benefit by your interaction. All the other possibilities - win/lose (I win, you lose), lose/ win (I lose, you win), and lose/lose - are ineffective, either in the short term or the long term.

The best way to approach a win-win dealing is to remember that it (like all agreements) embodies a caveat: The complete description is " win/win - or no deal." Your attitude should be, "I want to win, and I want you to win. If we can't hammer something out under those conditions, let's agree that we won't make a deal this time. Maybe we'll make one in the future.'

The president of a computer software company told me of the time he'd signed a five-year contract to supply software to a bank. The bank president was enthusiastic about the deal, but his people weren't. A month later, the bank changed presidents. The new president came to the software company president and said, "I'm uncomfortable with these software conversions. My people are unhappy, and I have a mess on my hands.'

The computer company was already in financial trouble at the time. It had every legal right to enforce its contract. But the software company's president responded, "We have a contract. But we understand you're not happy about it. We'll return your contract and your deposit, and if you're ever looking for a software solution in the future, come back and see us." He walked away from an \$84,000 contract. It might look like financial suicide, but he figured he didn't want to create an unhappy customer, and his attention to principle would pay off somehow. Three months later, the new president called back. He was ready to put in a new software system. They signed a contract for \$240,000.

Using the paradigm of win/win requires three traits:

- Integrity We define integrity as the value we place on ourselves. We need to be self-aware, possessed of an independent will. We make and keep meaningful promises and commitments to ourselves and others.
- Maturity This is the balance between courage and consideration. Simply put, you must have enough empathy and goodwill to work for a win for your counterpart, and enough courage to make a win for yourself.
- Abundance Mentality You must know and believe that there is plenty out there for everybody. Many people don't: They think that to succeed themselves, others must fail. They harbor secret hopes that other people suffer misfortune - not terrible misfortune, but acceptable misfortune that will keep them in their place. The Abundance Mentality recognizes that possibilities for growth and success are potentially limitless, and sees in others the opportunity to complement its own strengths.

Win/win is a powerful management tool. Peter Drucker recommends using the "manager's letter" to define the performance agreement between boss and employee. After a thorough discussion of expectations, guidelines, and resources, the employee writes a letter to the manager summarizing the discussion and setting the date for the following review.

With the agreement in place, the employee can manage himself within the framework of the agreement. The manager becomes like the pace car at an auto

race: He gets things going and gets out of the way. His job from then on is to remove the oil spills. When the boss becomes the first assistant to each subordinate, he increases his span of control. Entire levels of administration can be eliminated, and he can double or triple his managerial leverage.

I once consulted for a company that wanted me to train their retail people in human relations. They said the employees on the selling floor were rude. I went to their stores, and indeed, the sales help were rude. I wondered why. "Look, we're on top of the problem," the company president said. "The department heads are out there setting a great example: their job is two-thirds selling and one-third management. They're outselling everyone. Just train the sales help to sell, too."

But I went back to the store for more data. It turned out that managers (who got sales commissions) were sending the sales help into the back to take care of cleaning and inventory, stepping behind the cash register and "creaming" every sale, except during the store's most frantic periods. That's why they were outselling their employees.

We replaced that win/lose compensation system with win/win: we changed the rules so that managers only made money when the sales staff made money. The sales clerks' attitude problem disappeared overnight.

Gamma Omicron Alum Discovers Incan City

C cott Gorsuch (Ohio, JGamma Omicron '71) found more than he bargained for while hiking on a trip to the Peruvian Andes in 1999.

A clinical psychologist in Santa Barbara,

California, and an avid explorer, Gorsuch was among a group that first sighted the ruins at Cerro Victoria in the remote Peruvian region of Vilcabamba while hiking on a nearby ridge that bore evidence of ancient burials. The ruins were partially obscured by thick forests of jungle-like vegetation, but through binoculars the men could see the mountain-top ruins in the distance.

"We spotted what appeared to be a sacred platform on one of the peaks, and it seemed to have significance - it caught the sun's first rays in the morning and last ones at night," said Gorsuch.

When he and the expedition team traveled to the site later, they were surprised to find the remains of a large settlement, covering about 2.3 square miles.

Front page news of the discovery was announced to the world last March. The find is composed of tombs, walls, burial grounds with human remains, and more than 100 buildings. Gorsuch partially excavated the spot with help from a team of researchers funded by National Geographic magazine. He also photographed the excavation for that publication. 





Back to the Future: A Capital Campaign Story



As you stroll through the town of Chapel Hill, North Carolina, you can't help but notice a major renaissance in Greek housing. As the first public university, UNC-Chapel Hill will always have the oldest public university buildings in the country, but it will soon have the most modern Greek housing. Over the past five years, nearly 90% of the 33 Greek chapter houses have been renovated in some fashion. Ohio State Alum Displays Military Prowess In Best Ranger Competition

On the weekend of April 26-28, 2002, I competed in the 20th Annual David E. Grange, Jr. Best Ranger Competition (BRC) in Fort Benning, GA. The competition is a 60-hour test of military proficiency, muscle endurance, and mental toughness open to all Army units that have Ranger School graduates.

A team is made up of two men, known as a buddy team. This year 47 teams began the BRC. Day 1 started at 5:00 a.m. with a PT test consisting of push ups and sit ups, followed by an obstacle course, and finishing with a 3-mile run, a 300-meter swim, and another 3-mile run. Immediately after that we were tested in close quarter combat. Then it was on to the helicopters for a spot-jump and mile run with rucksacks to a rifle range. At the range we zeroed our weapons, conducted a stress fire, and then went through a record qualification. After about 4 hours of rest (the most we would get for the remainder of the BRC) we began an unknown distance footmarch. Basically, we carried our rifles and 50-plus pound rucksacks until they told us to stop. The finish line appeared 24 miles later. Only 15 of the original 47 teams would make the six-hour time limit. Within 30 minutes of finishing the road march (at about 2:00 a.m.), we went into Night Ranger Stakes, a mixture of military tasks lasting about 10 minutes each.

After Night Stakes, we got about 1½ hours of sleep, then began Day 2. The first task of the day was a bayonet assault course. Next came Day Ranger Stakes, similar to the Night Stakes, just with more light. When it seemed as if we were just starting to recover from the previous morning we had to tackle the Darby Queen Obstacle course. The DQ is a mile-plus of 32 obstacles. Fall off one obstacle and your team is given a 6-minute time penalty. Within 45 minutes of completing that smoker, it was on to Night Land Navigation. Wearing the rucksack once again, we were given 14 hours to find a minimum of 6 points located around Fort Benning. After finishing at 6:30 a.m., we received another 1½ hours of sleep.

Day 3 began with the water confidence test. This event included climbing a 40-foot ladder that suspends a 50-yard log above Victory Pond, running across the log, climbing a rope to a fixed point, then dropping about 35 feet into the water. After swimming out of the water, we had to run to another tower, climb 75 feet, and then slide down a zip line and enter the water. We then made a poncho raft for our rucksacks and weapons, jumped in a helicopter, then jumped out of the bird and into the pond again for another 200-meter swim. The last event was an unknown distance run. We ended up covering about $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles.

All in all, my teammate and myself ended up in seventh place. Not quite what we wanted, but not too shabby either.

Stanley W. Browning (Kentucky, Omega '66)

StanleyWayne Browning entered Chapter Eternal on April 8, 2002. He was a State Farm Insurance agent and a member of several clubs and associations in addition to Pi Kappa Alpha. His surviving family includes his wife, the former Ann Tedesco, his mother, two sons, one daughter, three brothers, two sisters and two grandsons. Franklin S. Forsberg (Utah, Alpha Tau '28)

Franklin S. Forsberg entered Chapter Eternal on March 29, 2002. He was 96.

Forsberg was born in Salt Lake City, Utah, and received his early education in Salt Lake City. He graduated from the University of



Utah, where he served Alpha Tau Chapter as president, and obtained a master's degree from New York University. He maintained active ties to Utah through the National Advisory Council of the University of Utah, of which he was an original member and attended regularly as an active and emeritus member.

His professional life was primarily in the publishing business. He served as a colonel in the U.S. Army in charge of publications and media in World War II. He founded Yank and oversaw the Army News Service and publication of Stars and Stripes. After the war, he was vice president of Popular Mechanics Publishing Co. In 1960, Forsberg headed up the magazine division of Holt, Rinehart and Winston, publisher of Field & Stream and other magazines. From 1981 to 1985 he served as U.S. Ambassador to Sweden, and was a strong supporter of the Swedish-American community, and to relations between the two countries. Forsberg was honored with the Royal Order of the Vasa by the Swedish Council of America.

In 1986, Forsberg was selected for induction into the Pi Kappa Alpha Educational Foundation's Order of West Range, and was elected to the Foundation's board of trustees in 1991.

He is survived by his wife, Ann Rountree Forsberg, a daughter, two sons and five grandchildren.

R. Craig Hoenshell (Nebraska-Omaha, Delta Chi '63)

R. Craig Hoenshell, 58, of New York City, entered Chapter Eternal on July 1, 2002, after a courageous battle with lung cancer.

Born on April 28, 1944, Hoenshell began his ascent to the top of the business

world at the age of 4, working in his father's grocery store, the *Red & White*, in Scribner, Nebraska. He ultimately graduated from Scribner High School and enrolled at Omaha University for college.

It was at this time a very bright and ambitious young man encountered many like minded young men who were members of Pi Kappa Alpha's award-winning Delta Chi Chapter at Omaha University, and a lifelong, mutually beneficial relationship between Pi Kappa Alpha and R. Craig Hoenshell began.

As Brother Hoenshell so aptly put it, "Delta Chi was a chapter that prided itself on the number of campus leaders it could develop. These men took great pride in our chapter's success and also in the individual success of each of its members. During my four years at the University, our chapter compiled one of the greatest legacies of success in the history of the Fraternity." He added, " It became clear to me that there was a direct correlation between our collective success and the passion, talent and effectiveness of our chapter leaders. It was our collective desire to be the best. It was a super-charged, success-driven environment, an environment that defined for me my ultimate potential."

Reaching his ultimate potential included leading some of America's most recognized corporations, including service as president of American Express In-

ternational, American Express Travelers Cheques and American Express Centurion Bank in the 1980s, and as chairman and chief executive officer of Avis Rent A Car in the late 1990s.

Throughout this period of significant corporate responsibility, Hoenshell always found time to give back to Pi Kappa Alpha, the entity he credited with teaching him the skills responsible for so much of his success. He served as a trustee of the Pi Kappa Alpha Educational Foundation from 1984 to 1992, and served as a commissioner of the Foundation's Endowment Fund from 1994 until his passing. In addition to sharing his wisdom and talents, he was and remains one of Pi Kappa Alpha's most generous benefactors. A member of the Pi Kappa Alpha Educational Foundation's 1868 Donor Society and the Oak Trust, Hoenshell gifted over \$200,000 to the Foundation in support of its educational and leadership programs.

Most notably, Hoenshell generously funded the R. Craig Hoenshell Honor Society Endowment at the Pi Kappa Alpha Educational Foundation, which pays the induction fees for all IIKA undergraduates tapped into higher education's most prestigious honor societies, including Phi Beta Kappa, Omicron Delta Kappa, the Order of Omega, Phi Kappa Phi and Tau Beta Pi. "Craig epitomized the belief that 'Once A Pike, Always A Pike'. He was loyal and supportive of the Fraternity from the day he pledged until the day he passed away. The Fraternity was consistently on his mind. He truly appreciated what it did for him personally and for how he saw it affect the lives of others. The endowment he established with Pi Kappa Alpha to encourage and recognize undergraduate leadership was very much the real Craig Hoenshell. He was a very generous person; a leader amongst leaders and focused on success," stated Educational Foundation Trustee Pat Halloran (Nebraska, Delta Chi '62), who was chapter president at Delta Chi Chapter when Hoenshell was chapter treasurer.

Pi Kappa Alpha proudly recognized Hoenshell for both his significant professional accomplishments and loyal service to the Fraternity with its highest awards. He was inducted into the Educational Foundation's Order of West Range in 1992, and received the Fraternity's Distinguished Achievement Award in 1998. Upon receiving the latter recognition, he spoke to the alumni and undergraduates attending the Fraternity's 1998 International Convention in Toronto, Canada,

and offered some of most eloquent remarks ever recorded on the value of the Pi Kappa Alpha experience. An excerpt follows:

"It has been said that, 'Education is the mother of leadership.' Well, if education is the mother of leadership, then Pi Kappa Alpha is the father. It was the Fraternity that began teaching me the principles of leadership and provided me with a living laboratory to experiment and perfect my ability to get things done with and through people.

When I look back upon my college years, the most critical, the most important learning that I received while an undergraduate student did not take place in the classroom, but rather, took place
