In 1947, Pi Kappa Alpha began sponsoring an off convention year program geared toward helping our undergraduate brothers by imparting methods to improve chapter operations and develop leadership skills. Pi Kappa Alpha discontinued the program in 1973 in favor of the regional conference concept, where conferences would be conducted annually in each of the Fraternity's regions across North America. Because of the demand for increased assistance in chapter programming, in 1983 the Fraternity rejuvenated the off convention year program, now known as the Officers Leadership Academy, realizing that the time was right to broaden the instructional offerings to undergraduates as well as to chapter advisors. The program has been enthusiastically received, and this past August a record 362 undergraduates and alumnus officers braved the Memphis summer heat to participate.

Recently, other international fraternities have actually abandoned their off convention year programs due to financial constraints, but Pi Kappa Alpha has been blessed with the enthusiasm and financial support of alumni who believe that the Officers Leadership Academy is an effective way to benefit undergraduate officers while giving something back to the Fraternity. Because The Pi Kappa Alpha Educational Foundation is capable of receiving tax deductible donations, alumni make contributions enabling the Foundation to fund programs which are instructional and

educational in nature. The Officers Leadership Academy and Chapter Presidents Conference both enjoy endowments which help to sustain these valuable programs in order that our undergraduates may participate.

Currently, Pi Kappa Alpha's educational programming is being restructured under the new Pike University umbrella. The regional conference concept which has served us well for almost 30 years is being replaced with fewer but more extensive Leadership Summits to be held annually in accessible geographical locations throughout North America. This will provide for more in depth instruction while alleviating the need for the Fraternity's regional presidents to plan conferences. More time for interaction with chapters will therefore be allowed. As with the Chapter Presidents Conference and the Officers Leadership Academy, alumni have been seeking ways to encourage their chapter's membership to participate in these valuable Leadership Summits. The Educational Foundation has responded by establishing PiKA scholarships that permit alumni to establish a fund to cover registration fees of these summits.

There is a degree of uncertainty that sometimes accompanies writing a check directly to a chapter, with the donor wondering whether the money will be used as the donor intended. The support that alumni provide to the chapter through the Educational Foundation guarantees that the contribution is used for its intended purpose. In this issue of the Shield & Diamond, the names of those

alumni who have made contributions to the Foundation in support of programs like the Officers Leadership Academy and Chapter Presidents' Conference during this past year are listed. The other list I would enjoy seeing is the one representing all of the undergraduates who attended various events because of the generosity of these alumni.

On Saturday, April 26, 2003, Epsilon Mu Chapter was rechartered on the East Carolina University campus after a four year absence. The refounding group of 46 men made Pi Kappa Alpha the largest fraternity on the East Carolina campus.

The Friday preceding the chapter's installation was particularly memorable. Two host chapters, Kappa Kappa (*University of North Carolina-Charlotte*) and Alpha Epsilon (*North Carolina State*), met at the Mendenhall Student Center to initiate the outstanding group of 46. The celebration following the final initiation carried throughout the building and lasted the remainder of the night.

The next morning, the 12-month colonization ended as the initiation team and International President Mark Anderson (*Wofford, Nu '76*) installed Epsilon Mu Chapter.

The chartering banquet was held Saturday evening at the Greenville Country Club. The feast honored the colony's success over the past year. Colony members joined in celebration with alumni, Supreme Council members, school officials, parents and friends to commemorate the amazing success of the past year. International President Anderson acted as keynote speaker, offering sage advice and hearty congratulations. The newly rechartered chapter presented awards to several brothers in recognition of their outstanding effort and dedication throughout the past year: Roger Lorince was named the Most Outstanding Athlete, Kiel Medlin received the Scholastic Excellence award, Jamie Woodward was awarded Most Outstanding Gentleman, and Taylor Keith received the Leadership and Brother of the Year honors.

A special award was given to Chris Wetmore, who was recognized for his relentless efforts to bring PIKE back to East Carolina. He was presented a beautiful glass trophy as a token of thanks from his brothers of Epsilon Mu.

From Colony to Chapter

In March 2002, Expansion Consultants Dean Snihur (*Lambda Epsilon, Alberta '00*) and Ryan Van Andel (*Alpha Sigma, California-Berkeley '98*) arrived in Greenville, North Carolina. They talked with university officials, students, and sororities and recruited a group that would become the best fraternity at ECU over the next few months.

The colony hosted two major philanthropic events to sponsor the Ronald McDonald House. The 118-mile "Walk to Wilmington" event raised over \$7,500 for the charity and the "Pi Kappa Alpha Bike the Outer Banks" rally raised nearly \$5,000. That philanthropy thanked the ECU group by naming them as their "Fundraising Group of the Year." The colony also co-hosted the second largest blood drive in East Carolina history.

Through the course of the colonization year, the group at East Carolina University dominated Greek life on campus. As a colony, Pi Kappa Alpha had the highest campus involvement at East Carolina, with 100% of the colony's men involved in at least one other campus organization. The group had several members in leadership roles in the Student Government Association and Student Boosters (Pirate Club), and claimed one religious organization leader.

The colony made its mark on campus by winning spring rush and taking the social scene by storm. The men worked as hard as possible all year to bring Pi Kappa Alpha back to East Carolina University and took over the Greek community along the way.

History of East Carolina University

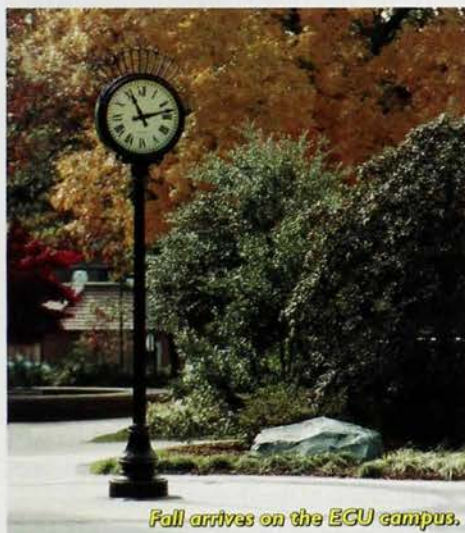
East Carolina University is situated on the coastal plain of North Carolina in Greenville. From modest beginnings as a teacher training school, ECU has grown to become an emerging, national research university with an enrollment of more than 20,000.

In 1907 East Carolina was founded to alleviate the desperate shortage of teachers in the eastern part of the state. The School of Education has now been joined by programs of high distinction in health care and the fine and performing arts.

Today East Carolina is a constituent institution of the University of North Carolina and offers more than 100 bachelor's degree programs, nearly 80 master's degree programs, and 13 doctoral programs in its professional schools, the Thomas Harriot College of Arts and Sciences, and the Brody School of Medicine.

Executive Vice President Announces New Recruitment Department

It is no secret that Greek membership has declined over the last decade. Fraternities have been challenged to recruit members in a hostile environment that includes challenges such as skeptical parents, increased costs of college, negative press and more opportunities for student involvement on campus – outside of what chapters offer. These difficulties have led to the decrease in average chapter size, a major indicator of chapter strength, for all inter/nationally recognized fraternities.

This change in the industry presents a great opportunity for fraternity leaders – an opportunity that Pi Kappa Alpha plans to maximize. To meet this challenge and chance to separate Pike from the pack, the Fraternity has reallocated its resources to help encourage and guide chapters to strengthening their membership in terms of quality and quantity.

Accordingly, Executive Vice President Orians has announced the creation of the Recruitment Department, a comprehensive entity of the staff that focuses on the strategic growth of Pi Kappa Alpha, addressing the challenges that chapters face in recruitment.

First, **Ryan Flickinger** (Southern Illinois, Iota Mu '94) has been named department leader as recruitment officer. Flickinger has worked closely with the expansion department for several years and most recently served the Fraternity as director of marketing. He will research Pi Kappa Alpha's target market, analyze trends, enhance our educational tools and facilitate training sessions for consultants and chapter leaders. Flickinger will continue to play a role in Pike's marketing efforts in areas such as trademark enforcement, while focusing on promotional marketing endeavors.

Second, **Bryan Schubert** (Southeast Missouri State, Epsilon Iota '99), recruitment consultant, will specialize in recruitment education on the chapter level and assist in Pike's expansion efforts. Schubert served the Fraternity previously as an expansion consultant, completing successful projects at Millsaps College and University of California-Irvine. Schubert will work with chapters in an effort to communicate and develop important membership growth plans.

Third, the expansion department will now be "housed" under the recruitment department's umbrella and led by **J. Burke Smith** (Alberta, Lambda Epsilon '00). Smith has been promoted from the expansion consultant role to director of expansion where he will oversee all colonies, secure new expansion projects and manage the expansion consultants.

Finally, two expansion consultants will work with Smith in the creation and management of colonies.

Eric Carr (Florida State, Delta Lambda '01) will be working on the first two colonization efforts this year at Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University and Bowling Green State University. Carr served Delta Lambda Chapter as vice president and president. During his presidency, Delta Lambda was honored as the 2002 IFC Chapter of the Year, a Chapter Excellence Award winner and a Robert A. Smythe Award recipient.

The expansion department also includes Expansion Consultant **Doug Cowan** (Missouri, Alpha Nu '00). Cowan served Alpha Nu Chapter in many leadership roles including chapter president. He will work with Carr in the establishment of colonies at Embry-Riddle and Bowling Green.

August 6, 2003 marked the inception of the first tangible result of conversations that erupted publicly a year previous at the Palm Desert Convention. In California, philosophical fermentations about the meaning of membership in the Pi Kappa Alpha Fraternity brewed into the Return To Values Initiative; the Mission, Vision and Creed; and a directive to staff to create programming reflective of those concepts.

On its 20th anniversary, the Fraternity's biennial summer leadership conference bore a new name. In the Pike University Officers Leadership Academy, the Pike University concept, which is described further on pages 12-13, was born. After an arduous gestation, the inaugural program was peppered with both new twists and familiar favorites.

In case you haven't read the inside front covers of recent spring issues of the *Shield & Diamond*, the Fraternity's leaders on both chapter and international levels have converged on Memphis, Tennessee since 1983 for comprehensive leadership seminars and personal development workshops. The Academy was a short course on running a fraternity chapter.

In spite of their excitement about the program's revisions, the Fraternity's staff and in-the-know volunteers kept much of the information about what it and Pike University would become under their hats. At the beginning of the show on August 6, the only hint was the new logo that stowed away on nametags, the staff's shirt pockets and registration-packet literature. Anticipation built throughout the weekend.

Executive Vice President Ray Orians (*Memphis, Delta Zeta '66*) opened the conference as only he can. And from minute one, Executive Director Eric Wulf (*Iowa, Gamma Nu '93*), who is responsible for much of the Academy's minutiae, was on his game, enthusiastically promising that the first Pike University event would be a first-class show – and he would hold true to his word.

Like past events, this year's academy was held in Memphis during the time of year when the air-conditioning servicemen are busier than skinny mosquitoes at a nudist colony. During a tramp to the business end of the hotel across the lawn separating it from an annexed meeting pavilion, Regional President Bob Cox (*Southeast Missouri State, Epsilon Iota '64*) comments, "I was not built for this kind of weather."

Not many of us were, Bob.

Like Cox, whose humor and good nature made the new conference feel like home, the all-star volunteers who generously donate their time to the undergraduates were still very visible at the event. Also visible were the other cast of unusual suspects, like fellow Regional President Mark Robertson

2003 Officers Leadership Academy Introduces Pike University

(*Southern Methodist, Beta Zeta '82*) with his charming disruptions, the faculty members who could talk a tornado into uncurling and the top-shelf special guests, including Neal Patterson (*Oklahoma State, Gamma Chi '68*) – this year's Judge Elbert P. Tuttle Distinguished Achievement Award winner.

In the mold of Patterson, who strives to fix the world's healthcare systems, many of the men at the conference possessed an honest, uncommon and invaluable desire simply to make things better. That was no different from past years, but a few things were different.

Throughout the week, the Pike University concept kept sticking its nose under the tent as speakers who were in on the secret referenced still-clandestine aspects of the show and as the changes in format became apparent.

Most notably, the faculty divided the conference into three officer tracks – individually designed for presidents, rush chairmen and treasurers – and offered detailed curricula for each position. Each track progressed from the first session logically and methodically to its conclusion.

"I like the approach of going in depth in particular fields, especially in the presidency, the area of rush and the area of finances," says Zeta Chapter Advisor Dan McGehee (*Southeast Missouri State, Epsilon Iota '63*). "It's much better than the shotgun approach. We should have done this five years ago."

Each day of the conference carried a different theme: envision, learn, plan and, then, act. Wulf says he developed these themes after reading a series of articles published by the Harvard Business School.

"It was a logical progression of what we wanted people to do, which was envision a better place and work toward getting there," Wulf says. "We tried to tailor the message accordingly."

"All the feedback I heard was that [the concept of the progression] was positive. I think we'll try it again." Wulf says the concept is probably not well-suited for the shorter regional weekend-long Pike University Leadership Summits, but he plans to incorporate the concept into other longer conferences.

Within each of the three tracks at the August academy, the officers were further divided into three sections, and these smaller, intimate groups each had a chance to exchange ideas and to mull topics. For example, they discussed hypothetical scenarios relative to the topics in the larger lectures.

On the second day of the conference, the fresh corps of chapter consultants steal a few minutes after supper to introduce themselves to their upcoming travel districts. For many of the men this is their first face-to-face interaction. After a group introduction, Consultant Mike Halbrook (*Arkansas State, Delta Theta '99*) slowly schedules individual meeting times with the chapter officers from Texas, the Rocky-Mountain states and the nation's breadbasket. As each trio of officers meets his chair, he jokes with them warmly for a couple minutes and then signs each group for a 15-minute time-slot on Saturday morning.

Joining Halbrook and the other consultants in their politicking, undergraduates hopeful of becoming undergraduate representatives on the Fraternity's Supreme Council or future

2003 DISTINGUISHED ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

Neal L. Patterson
(Oklahoma, Gamma Chi '68)

Neal L. Patterson is chairman of the board, chief executive officer and co-founder of Cerner Corporation, the world's leading clinical health care information technology company.

Patterson earned his bachelor's degree in finance and his master's degree in business administration from Oklahoma State University in 1971 and 1972, respectively. While at OSU he served Gamma Chi Chapter as treasurer from 1969 to 1971. His son Clay (*Southern Methodist, Beta Zeta '97*) and brothers Kent (*Oklahoma State, Gamma Chi '65*) and Bryan (*Oklahoma State, Gamma Chi '71*) are all members of Pi Kappa Alpha. In August 1996, the Pi Kappa Alpha Educational Foundation presented Patterson with its highest honor, the Order of West Range.

In 1973, Patterson began his professional career as an information system consultant with Arthur Andersen & Co. His entrepreneurial journey began in late 1979 when he and two Arthur Andersen colleagues formed Cerner Corporation. Patterson learned about the intricate process of health care automation during the initial development of PathNet®, Cerner's first major clinical application that automated the clinical laboratory. Cerner's first client was St. John's Medical Center in Tulsa, Oklahoma, a 777-bed tertiary care hospital (currently 550 beds). In 1982, Cerner successfully converted the alpha version of its PathNet® laboratory information system at St. John's. Even today, Patterson believes the clinical laboratory is the nexus of diagnostic medicine.

Patterson spearheaded the remarkable 20-year growth of Cerner Corporation from its inception to its current position as the world's largest stand-alone health care information technology company. Patterson led and continues to guide Cerner's core strategy – to develop great software that automates the major processes and connects the constituencies

chapter consultants begin working the international officers and staff members who make those decisions.

All the while, primarily that latter group and the supporters of the Pike University idea in particular are lobbying for its acceptance by the other attendees. "The Fraternity tries new things from time to time," International President Mark Anderson (*Wofford, Nu '76*) says to a group of alumni volunteers who meet in a large conference room for a hearing on the new program. "Some of the ideas are fleeting, but others endure, like the Chapter President's Conference. But regardless of the success of those individual programs, our ability to innovate and to evolve makes our group successful."

As the program reaches its denouement, the evening culminates in the 2003 awards presentations. Programming awards are handed out, and representatives from 45 chapters receive handsome black obelisks, reminiscent of Oscar awards, in recognition of their overall excellence. From this group, the Fraternity will give 15 Smythe awards to the chapters deemed to be its most noteworthy.

At the grand final banquet, a representative from each of these 45 chapters sits at a large head table in front of the group. This too is a shift from previous years when seasoned alumni would hold these seats. These young men watch their peers in the audience as the final speeches unravel.

Patterson, a former *Shield & Diamond* coverboy, accepts the Fraternity's Tuttle Award for distinguished alumnus achievement. He talks about his experiences at the Gamma Chi chapter at Oklahoma State as its treasurer, his career experiences since and the healthcare industry. And, he gives a little modest advice.

"In your 20s get really good at something," he says, adding later to the next generation of entrepreneurs in the audience, "If you're going to compete with your mind, you're going to compete with every mind in the world."

He predicts the next wave of technological advancement will be programming not machines, but living things, in the field of cellular genomics. And in conclusion, he looks over the crowd of young leaders and says, "There are many of you who will go much further than I have, and I'm only going to fix health care."

Then later, the lights go dark. All the men present have experienced the first Pike Uni-

versity event by now and the hints dropped earlier in the week now make sense. These men, many of them, get it. On their chairs are T-shirts sporting the same logos the staff had worn on the academy's first day. And on giant screens around the room, a professional multimedia presentation officially launches Pike University like the Detroit Auto Show launches a concept car.

The new initiative is thoroughly revealed. The dessert has come and gone. The tablecloths are thoroughly stained, and the coffee is getting thin. But, one last piece of business remains: the Smythe Awards.

The first two recipients are named. The boys from the Zeta chapter at the University of Tennessee slip on their jackets.

Five recipients have been named. Zeta Chapter has won the prestigious award in the past two years, has already collected an award this year for having over 100 men and has seen one of its all-star members named as an undergraduate representative to the Supreme Council.

Ten recipients have walked to the corner of the room to have their picture taken with Executive Vice President Orians. The Zeta boys remain.

The first 12 recipients have taken their prizes. Three remain unknown. Are you nervous Zeta?

"You know some people get worked up about this stuff," Chapter Treasurer Robert Bauchiero '02 says. "But, we're going to go back to Knoxville and do the same things whether we win or not. We just want to be the best we can be."

That's the spirit of the ideas that were kicked around a year ago in Palm Desert – in part, the belief in the importance of virtue. And that – doing things the right way for its own sake – was the goal that the Fraternity's staff and its volunteers had in the creation of Pike University.

It was stated well by the treasurer of the 14th group to be named as a Smythe winner in 2003.

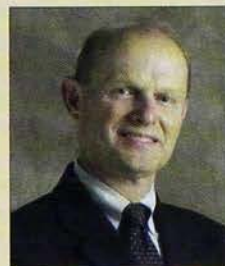

2003 LOYALTY AWARD

When you visit Dr. Larry Lunsford in his office at Florida International University in Miami, don't wear anything with a University of Miami logo on it. He'll tell you that when he teaches one of his freshman experience classes, he carries FIU t-shirts that he gives to every student wearing a Miami logo if they'll put the FIU shirt on over it. And you won't leave his office either without getting your own FIU t-shirt.

FIU is a young school – only 30 years old – but in that short time it's already grown to 30,000 students, twice the size of nearby Miami U. But Miami gets all the respect. It burns him up that students at FIU advertise their rival. He says he gives away the shirts to build loyalty to the university.

This year, he received the Fraternity's highest honor for service to the Fraternity, the Loyalty Award. When you visit his office, he'll show you the plans to a grand, new chapter house for the nine-year-old chapter on FIU's campus. It has been beautifully designed in the style of the old Spanish homes that line Coral Way on the approach to the campus from downtown. He'll explain the modifications to the plans and the trials in securing the loan. If you're not careful you'll be serving with him on the house corporation before you leave.

Lunsford is FIU's ombudsman. If anybody has any problem with anything at the university they come to him he's the fix-it man. He knows who to call and how to barter their favor.

He's been a fix-it man for the Fraternity, too. Following his graduation, he joined the then-National Fraternity staff as a chapter consultant and publications assistant. After the standard year of service, he went to Indiana University for his masters degree and served Delta Xi Chapter as its resident counselor. Then, he moved to Pittsburgh where he worked for 12 years and received his doctoral degree in higher education administration from the University of Pittsburgh. Again, he served – this time as Gamma Sigma's chapter advisor.

CHAPTER ADVISOR OF THE YEAR

J.J. Arnold (Indiana State, Theta Omicron '96)

Advisor to Kappa Omega Chapter at the University of Wisconsin-Whitewater

J.J. Arnold received the Fraternity's Chapter Advisor of the Year Award this August at the 2003 Officers Leadership Academy for his outstanding work with Kappa Omega Chapter at the University of Wisconsin-Whitewater.

Arnold was initiated by Theta Omicron Chapter at Indiana State University in 1996. Later, he transferred to the University of Wisconsin-Whitewater. A Pi Kappa Alpha colony was created shortly after his arrival on campus and he became the first chapter president. For the last five years Arnold has served Kappa Omega Chapter as advisor. He also serves on the board of directors of the local house corporation and is a charter member of the Kappa Omega Alumni Association. He recently received the 2003 Advisor/Alumni of the Year Award from the University of Wisconsin-Whitewater.

Chapter President Jeff Davis '00 says that Arnold has always been there for him and the chapter whenever needed. "It doesn't matter if it's three in the morning, he is willing to listen and provide advice," Davis adds, "his biggest contribution is that he leads by example in everything that he does whether it's fraternally or professionally, J.J. is a great role model."

Arnold is employed by Derco Aerospace, Inc. a Division of United Technologies Corporation where he serves as U.S. Government logistics program manager. In this position he is responsible for managing and negotiating long term supply chain contracts with the government for various military aircraft.

He also serves his community in numerous volunteer and philanthropic organizations including the Boy Scouts of America, Big Brothers Big Sisters of Northeast Wisconsin, and the United Way. When called upon, Arnold also serves as a volunteer EMT.

The *Shield & Diamond* asked Arnold to reflect on his personal experience and what impact volunteering for Pi Kappa Alpha has had on him.

What have you learned through your involvement with the Fraternity?

Through my experiences as an undergraduate and as an advisor, I've learned there is a family of brothers who exemplify the ideals of Pi Kappa Alpha all over the world. My experiences within the Fraternity have solidified my ideals, sharpened my leadership abilities, and prepared me for everyday life in my career, social, and volunteer endeavors.

As an advisor, I've learned how to work with different types of undergraduates, and learned how to attain the same goal in different ways.

What do you think it takes to be a successful alumnus advisor/volunteer in Pi Kappa Alpha?

To be successful as an advisor, I feel it's important to be able to look at the "bigger picture" and be able to convey the cause and effect of certain actions. By painting the bigger picture, more educated and fun decisions are made. The key to working with undergraduates is to allow them to think critically and to steer them in the right direction when needed. Empowerment is key. Empowering them to make decisions will only make them stronger.

Why would you encourage an alumnus to become actively involved with a chapter?

Ultimately, it allows you to stay connected with the undergraduates or alumnus members. When we all graduated from college, we stated, "I want to stay in contact with the chapter." By being a volunteer, you stay connected and see how your legacy is being upheld and advanced. My most memorable life experiences come from being a part of my brothers' everyday lives, and from making new friendships. By staying active with the Fraternity through the chapter, alumni association, or housing corporation, you can hold onto the promise, "Once a Pike, Always a Pike".

What has been your greatest satisfaction working with the undergraduate members of Pi Kappa Alpha?

My greatest satisfaction is being able to watch an undergraduate grow in all aspects of his life. Through trials and tribulations, I can see him learn what kind of person he is and what kind of person he wants to become. It's the best feeling in the world to know that when an undergraduate leaves school and starts the next chapter of his life, he has all the tools to succeed in all of his endeavors.

Beginning a New Era of Excellence

Pike University, the Fraternity's new leadership programming initiative that was launched at the 2003 Officers Leadership Academy, is the most significant enhancement to Pi Kappa Alpha's programs in nearly 30 years. Not since the 1974 Convention (when regional conferences replaced district conventions) has the Fraternity so extensively reallocated resources and improved operations to meet the needs of our members. Pike University promises to begin a new era of excellence for Pi Kappa Alpha.

What is Pike University?

Pike University, as showcased at the Officers Leadership Academy this past August, is a reorganization of the Fraternity's resources – primarily leadership events – into a comprehensive umbrella program that is administered and executed by the Fraternity's professional staff. Pike University's features can be categorized in two ways: events and programs.

Events

Five events initially comprise Pike University. Each has its own distinct – and complimentary – focus and programming. Existing events, such as the Chapter Presidents Conference, Officers Leadership Academy and Convention, are retained as pillars of the University, while two new events are added to bolster that already outstanding lineup.

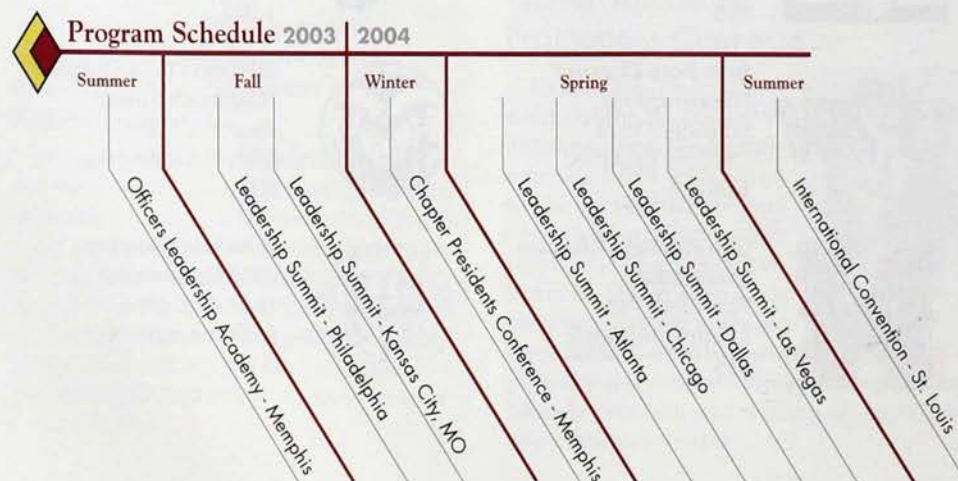
The first additions are the Leadership Summits, annual events held on weekends in major cities across North America. For the 2003-04 academic year, a total of six Leadership Summits will be sponsored; host cities will be Kansas City, Philadelphia, Las Vegas, Atlanta, Chicago and Dallas. The target audience for Leadership Summits will be Pi Kappa Alpha's emerging leaders – pledges, new initiates and current or aspiring chapter officers. The Leadership Summit agenda will include educational sessions that not only introduce this powerful demographic to chapter operations and Fraternity history, but will commit

each attendee to envisioning an ideal Pike chapter, developing their leadership path and maximizing their membership experience. An exciting component of the Summits will be the ability of chapters to attend more than one Leadership Summit. While each of the Fraternity's sixteen regions will be encouraged to attend a specific Summit (where the regional president will be in attendance and regional meetings will occur), chapters may also register to attend programs at other Summits – thereby allowing chapters to send both their fall and spring new member classes to these important programs.

The other addition to the University's event roster is the Volunteer Forum. Building on the overwhelming success of the Pi Kappa Alpha Housing Summits of 2001-02, the Volunteer Forum will be a biennial event specifically designed for chapter advisors, house corporation officers and alumni association leaders. (The first Volunteer Forum will take place in spring 2005 in Memphis.) A major component of this event will be the increased interaction it will facilitate between International Officers, staff and our valuable local volunteers. Forum educational sessions will focus on topics such as alumni relations, capital campaigns, chapter advising and property management techniques.

Programs

Also included in the Pike University format is the International Awards Program (including the Robert Adger Smythe Awards), a participant certification program and the Pike University Scholarship Program. Particularly exciting will be enhancements to the International Awards Program in order to recognize more chapters and members for their outstanding accomplishments. The enhanced Awards Program will recognize new levels of excellence. Those efforts will be combined with the work of the Memorial Headquarters' staff to share best practices amongst chapters and publicize those accomplishments to universities. A certification program for attendees will provide credits for those members who successfully complete University events and allow chapters to track individuals' performances and qualifications for chapter office. Perhaps most importantly for the long-term success of Pi Kappa Alpha is the new Pike University Scholarship Program. This coordinated effort with the Pi Kappa Alpha Educational Foundation will offer chapters financial support to participate in Pike University. For the 2003-04 academic year, every chapter and colony is provided with at least \$100 in Pike Univer-



sity Scholarship funds; those scholarships can be used to offset the tuition and travel expenses associated with Pike University events. These funds may be augmented by additional dollars from the Pi Kappa Alpha Educational Foundation (via chapter endowments) or Fraternity. This philosophical shift—from providing individual scholarships and travel subsidies to providing leadership programming chapter grants—represents a revolutionary change for the Pi Kappa Alpha Educational Foundation.

Why Change?

Pike University's origins can be traced to the development of the Fraternity's strategic plan in January 2000. Contained in that plan (later ratified by the 2000 Convention) were tactics related to educational programming including, "develop an alternative proposal to the existing 16 [regional] conference format," with the goal of providing consistent event quality. Pi Kappa Alpha has experienced divergent trends with existing events over the past several years: attendance at "international events" (such as the Chapter Presidents Conference and Officers Leadership Academy) has increased nearly every year, while overall regional leadership conference attendance has declined. Another important need identified during the strategic planning process was the recruitment and retention of chapter advisors. When a task force of the Supreme Council, composed of International Vice President and former Regional President Howard E. Goldstein (*Lehigh, Gamma Lambda '83*), International Legal Counsel and former Regional President Patrick A. Talley (*Armstrong State, Eta Mu '74*) and Undergraduate Vice President Scott Himes (*Rose-Hulman, Iota Delta '99*) took up the issue of conference programming, it became apparent that great synergy could be achieved by directing the Fraternity's staff to assume the conference planning responsibilities to allow more time for regional presidents to work with alumni in their regions. Thus, the concept of Pike University was born!

At the 2002 Convention, Goldstein and Himes presented the Pike University concept, along with several legislative proposals to free regional presidents from mandatory conference planning responsibilities. The proposals carried enthusiastically - and nearly unanimously. At the same time, the Supreme Council appointed a task force to propose new job expectations for regional presidents. That task force, composed of Heartland Regional President Robert Cox (*Southeast Missouri State, Epsilon Iota '64*), North Atlantic Regional President Mark Robertson (*Southern Methodist, Beta Zeta*

'82) and Director of Real Estate Justin Buck (*Southeast Missouri State, Epsilon Iota '96*), finalized its recommendations in February. In line with the goals of Pike University, the new expectations focus on regional president support of local chapters, assistance to advisors and participation as faculty at Pike University events. The new expectations were adopted by the Supreme Council last spring.

How can you be a part of Pike University?

In order for Pike University to continue to grow and develop, the input and support of all members will be essential. One way a loyal Pike can be a part of Pike University is by supporting the Pike University Scholarship Program offered by the Pi Kappa Alpha Educational Foundation. There are two traits shared by those Pike chapters that time and again rank amongst the best, the presence of a dedicated and qualified chapter advisor and consistent participation in Pike leadership events. Please consider joining in this

effort to prepare for Pi Kappa Alpha's future by pledging your support. Donations to the Pike University Scholarship Program will provide your chapter with valuable permanent funds to participate in Pike University.

Alumni are encouraged to attend the Friday evening alumni receptions that will be a part of all Leadership Summits (dates and locations will be posted on the Fraternity's website and mailed to area alumni in advance of each Summit). Opportunities will be provided at these events to provide feedback and ideas for Pike University enhancements, to volunteer for a local chapter and to join an area alumni association. The Fraternity is also interested in building its growing database of qualified speakers and faculty for these events; indications of interest to teach at Pike University events (along with general feedback) can be submitted to pikuniversity@pikes.org.

Undergraduate members are likewise encouraged to begin making their plans to attend the inaugural year of Leadership Summits. Whether you're a new initiate, a tenured chapter advisor or an alumnus interested in rekindling the Pike spirit with other brothers, please attend an upcoming Pike University event in your area. We look forward to seeing you, and working with you for the advancement of our great Fraternity.

International Work Day has become an annual tradition for many chapters where alumni, parents, guests, and brothers can come together and make a lasting impact on the chapter's most valuable asset. International Work Day is a one-day event set by the chapter or house corporation that is dedicated to house improvement projects and renovation. The International Work Day program is endorsed and subsidized by the International Fraternity's Real Estate Department. All participating chapters qualify for many incentives, which includes a \$250 participation grant, an event planning kit, recognition in the fall *Shield & Diamond*, and eligibility for one of the six International Work Day Awards. To get your chapter, house corporation, or yourself involved, follow the simple instructions in this article or look on the website in October.

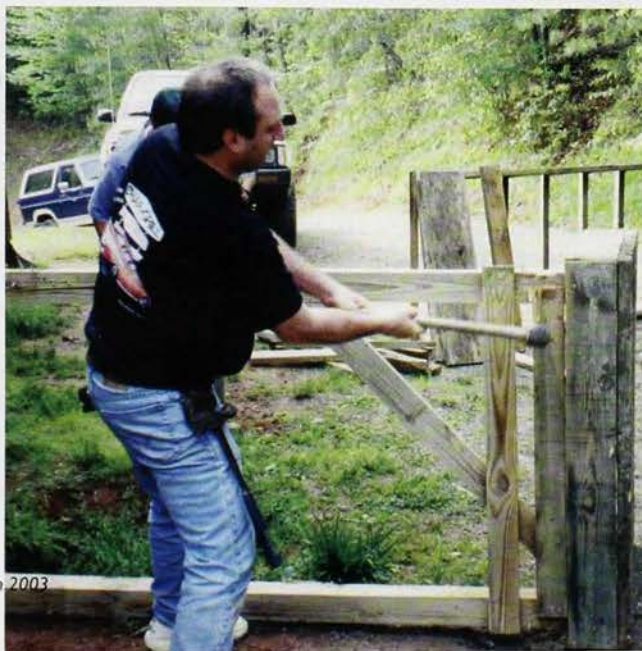

LEADERSHIP PROGRAMS

Over the past year, Pi Kappa Alpha continued to be an industry leader in terms of leadership programming quality and attendance. More than 2,500 undergraduates participated in the Fraternity's leadership events during 2002-03, a year that began with the Fraternity's International Convention.

The 63rd **International Convention** was held at the Marriott Palm Desert Resort in Palm Springs, California during the first week of August 2002. A record-tying 177 chapters were represented at the event, with new records set for alumni association (19) and chapter advisor (49) attendance. The luxurious resort setting enhanced what was an already exciting program. Highlights included the presentation of the Robert Adger Smythe Awards to sixteen of the Fraternity's most outstanding chapters, the Distinguished Achievement Award to country music star Tim McGraw, the Loyalty Award to Heartland Regional President Robert Cox and the election of International President D. Mark Anderson and the 2002-04 Supreme Council. The Convention featured an alumnus/undergraduate golf tournament and educational programs on topics such as risk awareness, recruitment and the Fraternity's Ritual.

The 31st **Chapter Presidents Conference** was held during the second week of January 2003 at the historic Peabody Hotel in Memphis, Tennessee. The Conference was the largest to date – with nearly 300 chapter presidents and rush chairmen (who participated in the affiliated Rush Summit) gathering for the three-day event. Roughly half of the agenda was devoted to tactical, officer-based programming for presidents and rush chairmen. The balance of the agenda focused on leadership development, with sessions focusing on leadership style development, the use of persuasion and influence, strategic planning and ethical decision making.

Throughout the academic year, the Fraternity sponsored conferences for each of the sixteen regions. Two **regional leadership conferences** featured multiple regions; the Dixie and Delta Regions joined together in Jackson, Mississippi and the Carolinas and Founders Regions met in Charlotte, North Carolina. Twelve other conferences were held across the United States. Cumulatively, these two-day programs attracted approximately 1,800 undergraduate attendees to an agenda featuring a variety of chapter programming topics.

Pi Kappa Alpha has become a leader in educational programming due to the dedi-

cation of the undergraduates who travel from across North America to participate in programs such as the Chapter Presidents Conference, the volunteers who serve as conference faculty and the local alumni advisors or house corporation members who assist in the planning or funding to attend these events. We are grateful to all the brothers and friends who helped make the last year a success.

SERVICES

Throughout the 2002-2003 academic year, the services department continued its support of Pike chapters, members and advisors. The services department is charged with meeting the growing needs of Pike chapters by developing innovative chapter programming and leadership training while providing effective consulting services to our constituents.

With six chapter consultants servicing Pike chapters this past year, the services department made 241 visits to our 214 chapters throughout North America. During the year we were also able to conduct 25 developmental visits to chapters that requested additional assistance from Fraternity representatives. If your chapter would like to receive a developmental visit during the upcoming academic year, contact Director of Services Jason Belland.

This year the Fraternity continued the Chapter Advisors Accreditation program. This program is available to new chapter advisors on the Fraternity's web site, and provides introductory information for their position while informing them of relevant Fraternity standards and programming. The Fraternity witnessed a 10% increase in accredited chapter advisors this academic year. Additionally, through the "Volunteer for Pi Kappa Alpha" link on the Fraternity's website we have been able to put more than



87 alumni expressing interest in volunteering in touch with a local chapter.

With eight new consultants joining the Memorial Headquarters Staff this summer the Fraternity is excited to begin another great academic year. Please feel free to contact the director of services regarding any questions about the services department.

EXPANSION

The Fraternity continues the quest to grow strategically in terms of total number of chapters through the hard work of the expansion staff, area chapters and alumni. During the past academic year, this work produced five new colonies and four chapter installations. A significant victory for Pike came at the conclusion of the four-week project at the College of Charleston where Expansion Consultants Alex Price (*South Alabama, Eta Kappa '98*) and Burke Smith (*Alberta, Lambda Epsilon '00*) left with a colony of 56 men – the largest fraternal group at the historic college. Other successful projects included University of British Columbia, Millsaps College, George Washington University, and University of California-Irvine.

After achieving the Fraternity's *Standard Colony Objectives* and gaining the required approval for chartering, the following four colonies were installed and all members were initiated: University of Delaware (*Delta Eta*) – January 16, 2003; West Virginia University (*Alpha Theta*) – March 29, 2003; Northwestern University (*Gamma Rho*) – April 5, 2003;

Two of the Fraternity's existing six colonies are expected to petition to be chartered this fall semester, the other four are expected to petition to be chartered in the spring.

The first colonization project confirmed for the upcoming fall term is Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University in Daytona Beach, Florida. The second will be Bowling Green State University in Bowling Green, Ohio. It will be Pi Kappa Alpha's first time at Embry-Riddle and an exciting return to Bowling Green State University (silent Delta Beta Chapter) after a four-year absence. Four additional projects are expected to follow during the spring semester.

MARKETING

The Pi Kappa Alpha marketing program continues to be refined and enhanced. The focus of the program is on three specific categories including intellectual property (licensing program), event promotions and deliverables, and assisting the North-American Interfraternity Conference (NIC) with an international promotions campaign targeted at graduating high school students.

Staff has made significant strides in the area of protecting the Fraternity's registered trademarks. This has been accomplished by defining and registering trademarks, creating a formal licensing process for vendors, evaluating contract language with existing vendors, initiating enforcement efforts, and expanding the number of Pi Kappa Alpha affiliated companies. The Fraternity's focus is on establishing a strong marketing campaign via its marks and at the same time producing significant revenue through royalties.

The Fraternity has also focused on its message and deliverables to different audiences. A significant undertaking by the Fraternity in this area is a "new member" welcome pack. This program has enhanced direct communication with incoming initiated members. New

initiates receive a personalized welcome pack with an introduction letter from the international president, a copy of *The Oak*, membership card, membership certificate, apparel catalog and Educational Foundation brochure. Follow-up email messages and surveys have helped the staff identify the needs and wants of the newly initiated members.

Conference attendance at all Fraternity sponsored meetings continues to grow. Pi Kappa Alpha reached over 2,000 members during the past year. Each meeting's curriculum included sessions on marketing, public relations and brand management. Through focused educational sessions, our members are able to tailor a specific Pike message for their respective chapter.

Finally, the Fraternity continues to support the NIC in its efforts to reach thousands of high school seniors, prominent alumni and parents to promote Greek life. Monthly updates are being provided to the executive vice president, international president and director of marketing. These updates include names of interested students and their respective university / college that they will be attending. Information is sent to the prospective member directly from the Memorial Headquarters.

ALUMNI AFFAIRS

The International Fraternity continues to work to provide enhanced opportunities for alumni involvement at all levels of the organization, from the ranks of chapter advisors to house corporation officers, member of an alumni association or as a mentor. 2002-03 was a good year for the Alumni Affairs Department of the International Fraternity as the ranks of alumni associations grew from 84 to well over 105 active associations. In August of 2003 the alumni section of www.pikes.org was redeveloped to better serve our constituency and to assist alumni in forming and operating alumni associations.

This past year, through our alumni volunteers, the Fraternity was able to provide numerous speakers for a myriad of Fraternity events including association events and reunions, homecomings, Founders Day, International Work Day and other special occasions.



COMMUNICATIONS

During the busy 2002-03 year, Pi Kappa Alpha communications commissioned a 5,000 volume reprinting of *The Oak: A History of Pi Kappa Alpha* with minor updates. Plans are underway for a major revision with the next printing, which will include new material to bring the Fraternity's history up to the current day.

The *Shield & Diamond* continues to be the Fraternity's flagship publication, with the largest issue each year circulating to 130,000+ members. The online version of Pi Kappa Alpha's magazine, available at www.pikes.org, has proven to be a popular and effective means of communication, with even more readers than the printed version.

Communication via email has seen an upswing during the 2002-03 year. *The Forum*, Pi Kappa Alpha's newsletter for members, volunteers and supporters, is distributed electronically, as are recruitment letters to prospective members.

The Fraternity's website constantly undergoes update and revision to provide complete and easily accessible communication among Pi Kappa Alpha's many constituents. This year, the College Fraternity Editor's Association honored www.pikes.org with a second place award for Greek website.



REAL ESTATE

While few fraternities employ even one fulltime person to work on housing, Pi Kappa Alpha is fortunate to have **four professional staff dedicated to real estate matters**: Executive Real Estate Officer Daniel W. Corah, Senior Director of Real Estate Clint E. Bartman, Director of Real Estate Justin A. Buck and Real Estate Assistant Heather L. Huffman. This allows the International Fraternity to continue to highlight the need for improved care and conditions of our chapter facilities.

Currently, 173 of our active chapters or colonies occupy some form of real estate.

Of the many real estate programs, the **loan program** is still the premier service offered to house corporations. The Fraternity

provides loans for the acquisition of furnishings and equipment; for purchase, construction or renovation purposes; and for professionally conducted capital campaigns. Available loan sizes generally range from \$25,000 to \$250,000. In 2002-03, the Housing Commission committed, modified, or refinanced **\$1,047,446** in loans to Pi Kappa Alpha house corporations, resulting in the largest year for dollars committed in its history.

The Fraternity began offering three new types of loans this past year: The **Dynasty Loan Fund** enables donors to make restricted tax deductible gifts through the Fraternity's Foundation, which can then be lent back to their house corporation for significant renovations to their facility; the **Life Safety Loan Program** is offered to house corporations at a lower interest rate for the installation of new life safety equipment; and finally, the **Capital Campaign Loan** allows house corporations to receive the funding upfront to determine whether a professional capital campaign is feasible, and potentially move forward with their campaign.

The **Fraternity's role in chapter housing continues to expand beyond its initial charge as that of primarily a lender**. Additional programs have been established that take an empowerment-oriented approach; providing enhanced education and incentives to encourage improved involvement by both students and alumni.

The Fraternity provides a wide array of housing **materials and programs** to all Pi Kappa Alpha chapters, house corporations, and alumni. This past year, educational



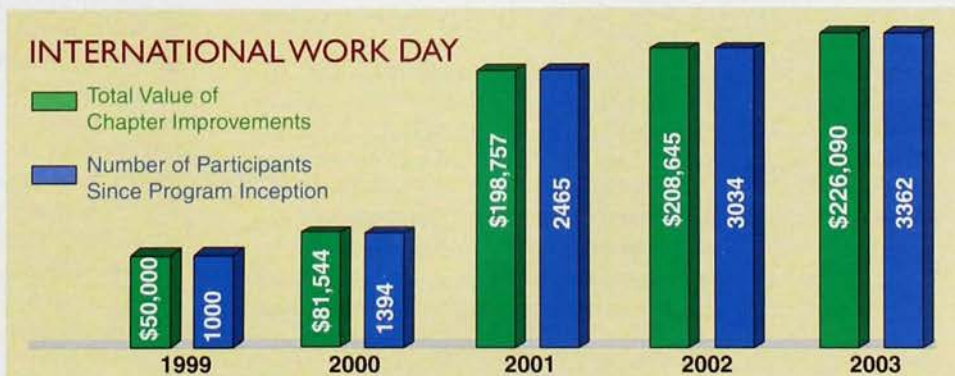

sessions were presented at regional conferences, the International Convention and the Chapter Presidents Conference. The department also created a quarterly email service titled "The Pike House Link" that assisted in effectively communicating current fraternity housing trends and resources available to chapter members, house corporations and alumni.

Following up on the widely-successful "Housing Summits" in 2001, the first volunteer educational forums of their type, the Real Estate Department sponsored An Advanced Housing Forum in conjunction with the 2002 International Convention. Approximately two dozen house corporations came to Palm Springs to receive additional education and information on preparing their Chapter and facility for the future. The feedback from these conferences has been extremely positive, enabling the Real Estate Department to become even more aggressive with the services it provides.

The **group property insurance program**, coordinated through the Real Estate

Department, now has 58 participating locations, representing over \$50 million in total coverage. The purchasing power of the group has saved house corporations thousands of dollars, while providing a comprehensive set of coverages that is far superior to that of what could be obtained on an individual basis.

The **awards program** recognizes chapters that excel in managing and caring for their facilities. Funds are made available to every region for recognition in this area. On an International level, quarterly and annual awards are granted providing a combination of press coverage in Fraternity publications, trophies, certificates and grants.

Since its creation in 1997, **International Work Day** has become an annual tradition for many chapters. This is a synergistic program that combines real estate improvement projects with an alumni and parent relations event. The Fraternity provides "how-to" guidance, communication services, participation incentives, grants and awards to chapters that participate in the event. In its first six years of existence, over **317** events have been hosted, an estimated **11,255** students, parents, guests and alumni have accomplished over **1263** individual projects, totaling over **\$752,980** in improvements. WHITE HORSE HOLDING CORPORATION

White Horse Holding Corporation is governed by the Housing Commission and administered by the Real Estate Department. It is a non-profit corporation that holds title to real estate for the benefit of the International Fraternity. As of June 30, 2003, the Holding Corporation owned property at the University of Virginia, University of Arkansas, West Virginia University, Oregon State University, University of Miami, University of Idaho, University of Minnesota and Creighton University.

Health care executives, industry leaders and analysts extol Patterson for his passion and foresight about health care and information technology solutions, his ability to drive change management within organizations, his entrepreneurial spirit and his often candid, uninhibited conversation style. Above all, Patterson is respected for his courage to bet the future of Cerner on the \$400 million investment needed to develop Cerner's person-centric information architecture, Cerner Millennium®. This architecture has been recognized as the most comprehensive and integrated suite of clinical and management health care solutions ever created.

Patterson serves as a trustee of the Midwest Research Institute and is active in the Healthcare Forum's Leadership network and local entrepreneurial organizations. In addition, he is co-founder and serves on the executive board of the First Hand Foundation, Cerner's non-profit foundation (www.firsthandfoundation.org) that provides financial assistance to children with critical health care needs. Through his vision for both Cerner and the health care industry, Patterson is at the heart of health care transformation – improving the health status of communities worldwide.

And, his service continued. Lunsford served as North Atlantic regional president from 1982 to 1988 when he was elected to the Supreme Council as a vice president. He was re-elected in 1990. He has also served the Fraternity as a member of the educational advisory commission, a member of the nominating committee at the 1986 Boston Convention and a frequent contributor to the *Shield & Diamond*.

It seems as though Lunsford has his plate full with his service to the Fraternity, but a closer look reveals that it's a full buffet.

"Everybody wants to talk to him," says Alison Charlton, his executive secretary at FIU. "He helps everybody. He's everybody's idol, especially the fraternity boys."

Besides being the university's ombudsman, he is also assistant vice president for student affairs, and he edits *Diversity Exchange*, a national magazine published by the university. He is married and has a son and daughter.

The Fraternity tries to surprise the Loyalty Award winner, which is often easy because the recipients tend to be at all the events anyway. After receiving the award, Lunsford tells his introducer, long-time friend Dan McGehee, that he was angry at McGehee for not telling him that he would receive the award. Lunsford, it seems, does not like surprises. Dr. Lunsford, this award should have been no surprise.



Members of Gamma Tau Chapter at Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute enjoy the largest scholarship subsidy in our Fraternity. Members of the chapter who live in the chapter house and excel academically receive a stipend, as do the earners of the highest GPA, the brothers who improve their GPA the most and the officers who attend international events. Some brothers who both devote their time to service of the chapter and make grades receive very substantial checks.

Last year, Senior Chris Normandeau enjoyed a stipend for living in the chapter house and a scholarship to attend the January 2003 Rush Summit in Memphis, Tenn. This fall will mark his second semester-long term as rush chairman, and he has been involved in rush since his sophomore year.

"It's fun getting out there and meeting new people," he says, "giving guys who are Pikes deep down a chance to get what I've got. It's the position in the house where you can make the most difference." The chapter's support of the rush chairman's education has made a difference. The chapter signed 32 men last year, which is a larger pledge class than the entire membership of a good portion of the other 24 Fraternities on RPI's campus.

"At one of the sessions [at the 2003 Rush Summit] when Dar [Sidebotham] was speaking, I came out of it feeling very self-confident. I knew that this upcoming rush was going to be successful," says Normandeau, who, like most students at RPI, studies engineering.

"Not just in rush but in my classes, I've had incredible self-confidence. I got an internship this summer [2003], and I know that [the experiences at the Rush Summit] helped out."

What is an Endowment?

An endowment is a pool of money that is invested with the goal that its investment returns will fund a purpose, typically a charitable purpose, indefinitely. Ideally, the original invested pool of money, or corpus, is never distributed; only the investment returns, or a portion of them, are used to fund the cause. Thus, the endowment is designed to provide funding for its purpose for an unlimited amount of time.

Typically an endowment will distribute a certain portion of its balance – somewhere between 3% and 5% – or a certain dollar amount every year. Any excess investment returns will be reinvested with the idea that it will grow the corpus to counteract the effects of inflation. In the event that the investment returns are less than the targeted distribution, a portion of the corpus will be distributed. This is, as stated earlier, not ideal.

Think of an endowment like a savings account. Instead of spending the principal in the account, you only spend the interest – or a portion of it. If you did this, you would, theoretically, always have the interest to fund your needs. The challenge, of course, is to grow the principal to an amount that will generate sufficient interest to support your needs.

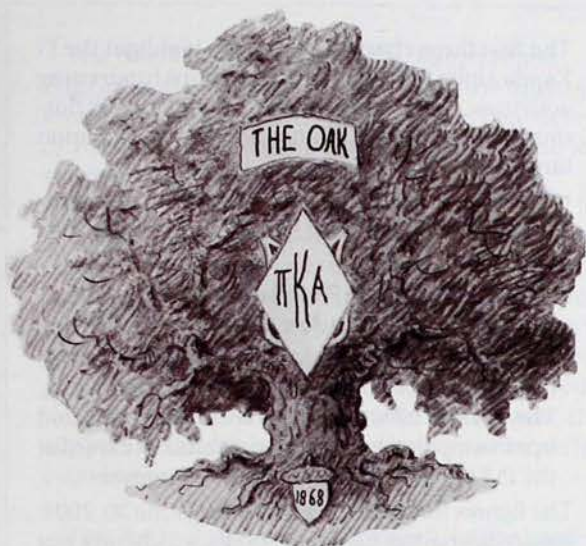

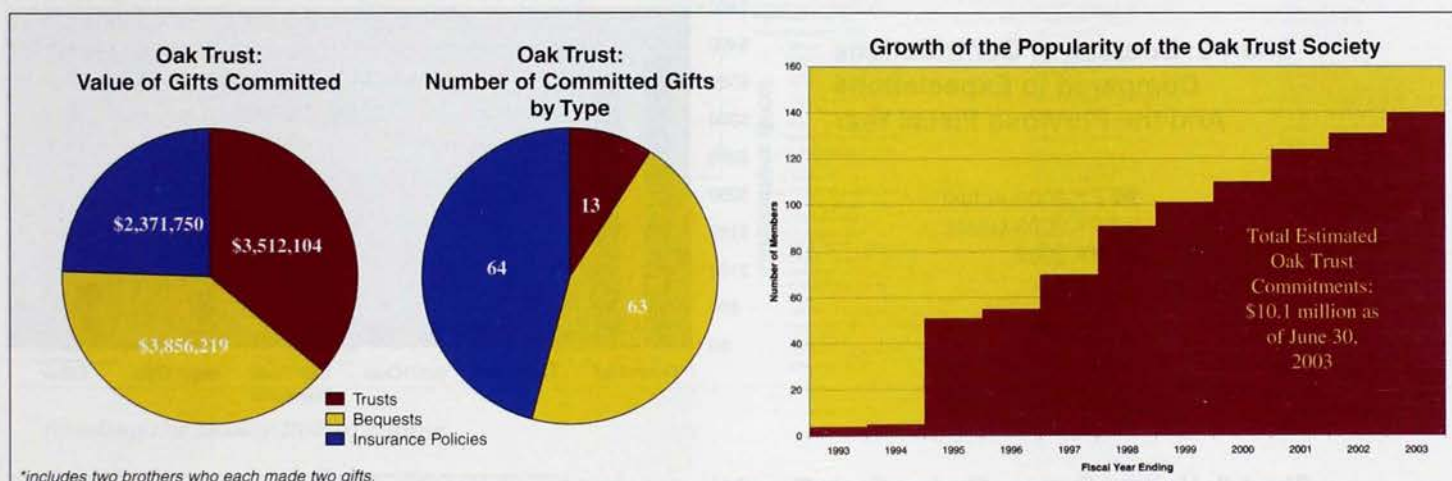

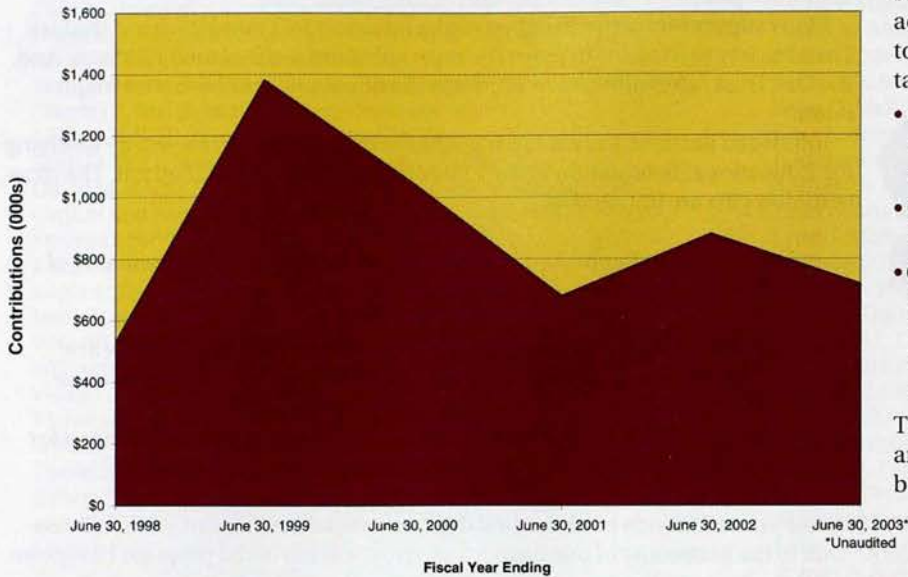

■ FY 2002

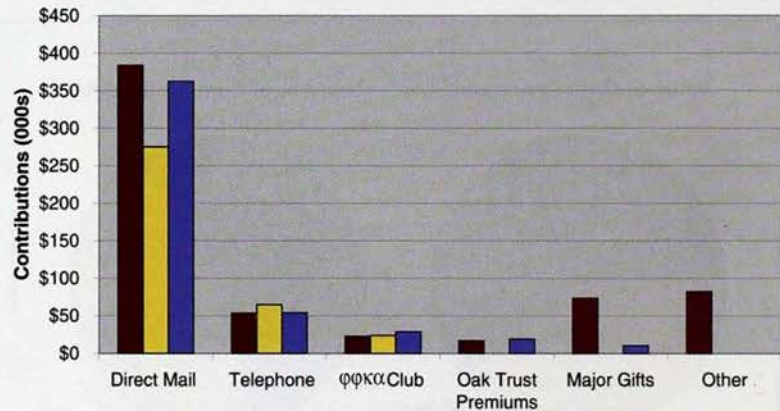
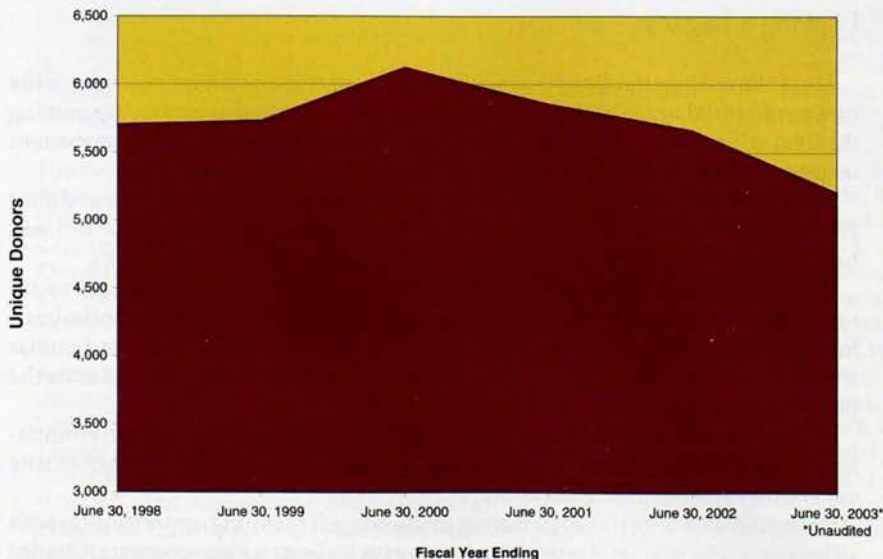


Chart 3: Unique Donors During Each Fiscal Year

"I was genuinely surprised [to receive it] after seeing the accomplishments of past winners," Uebler says. "And, knowing the hard work so many other members put into their chapters, I was sure there were plenty of good applicants."

There were, but Uebler stands out. Uebler graduated with a 3.77 grade point average that earned him a spot on the Dean's list seven of his eight semesters in school. He served the chapter as president, rush chairman, new member educator, community service chairman and campus involvement chairman. He served on the Interfraternity Council as vice president for fraternal affairs and Greek relations board chairman, and in 2002, Uebler was recognized as the university's Most Outstanding Greek Man.

Uebler's resume of service to the Greek system and his community continues beyond the confines of this article.

"Through his soft spoken demeanor Tom made a significant impact on our campus" says Michael Najor, ASU's Greek life coordinator. "Tom is a caring individual who sets a powerful example of someone grounded in solid moral beliefs and a person whose words and deeds exemplify his ritual."

History of the Award

Pi Kappa Alpha first recognized its outstanding graduating senior in 1926 with the Alumnus-Beta Phi Trophy. Administered by the alumni chapter of Buffalo, New York, the award's first recipient was Howard Bell Arbuckle Jr. (*Davidson, Beta '25*). After a twenty-six year lapse, beginning in 1936, the award

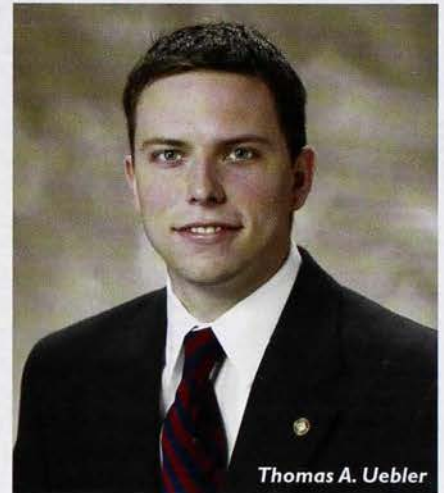
At another occasion, privately, Uebler says, "When people talk about the Fraternity, I think people talk too much about the networking aspect of the Fraternity. Uebler studied prelaw at ASU and plans to attend law school in fall 2004. This fall, he will apply to law schools primarily on the Mid-Atlantic Coast around Washington. When he starts his studies, he will benefit from the \$2,500 scholarship that goes along with winning the Robertson Award.

In the meantime, Uebler will continue his service to the Fraternity, because the International Fraternity has been lucky enough to hire this fine, young man to serve as a chapter consultant for the next academic year, traveling in the middle part of the country from the Atlantic Coast west to the Mississippi River.

As a varsity athlete, he was named as captain of the track and field team his senior year. Gary was also a member of the Dean's list, the ACC Honor Roll, Phi Eta Sigma and Omicron Delta Kappa.

was revived in 1962. Until 1998, the award was known as the Powers Award, in honor of two of Pi Kappa Alpha's most important leaders, J. Pike Powers, Jr. (*Virginia, Alpha 1895*) and David C. Powers (*Tennessee, Zeta '24*). This award is now named the Robertson Most Outstanding Undergraduate Award in honor and memory of Brother Jenkins M. Robertson (*Clemson, Eta Alpha '71*), a much beloved chapter advisor for Epsilon Chapter

at Virginia Tech, who served Epsilon in this capacity until his life was cut short in 1986. While walking to the chapter house for a meeting, he was struck and killed by a drunk driver. The majority of funding for the endowment that provides this annual award was generously contributed to the Pi Kappa Alpha Educational Foundation by Epsilon Chapter alumni in memory of Brother Robertson.

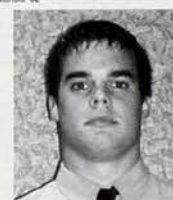

Alabama Alum Focuses on World War II Heroism

Hobart Grooms's new film "For One Englishman" tells an unforgettable tale.

The transition from retired attorney to documentary film producer was at times uncertain and always challenging, but **Hobart Grooms** (*Alabama, Gamma Alpha '50*) made it. His newly released film, "For One English Officer," is the true story of how Gerow Hodges, armed only with his wits and a Red Cross badge, made 15 solo trips into German lines at Lorient and St. Nazaire in Brittany in 1944 and negotiated the freedom of 149 Allied POWs.

"It was a one-of-a-kind event in World War II," said Grooms, former partner in the Birmingham firm, Spain & Gillon, L.L.C. He'd heard the story while serving with Hodges as Samford University trustees. Hodges, declared 4-F due to a football injury, joined the Red Cross. While attached to the 94th Division, he engineered four prisoner exchanges, including that of British SAS Captain Michael R.D. Foot, later Oxford professor and noted WWII historian. Hodges bargained with four high-ranking German officers for Foot's release from a military hospital where he lay dying due to injuries sustained in an abortive escape. Of 100 SAS captured by the Germans, only six survived; Foot was one of the lucky few.

Grooms got to know Foot while the historian was teaching a Jan Term at Samford but it wasn't until Grooms delved into Hodges' files that he saw the possibility of a documentary. "Here were the original German POW lists, photos, correspondence, receipts for Red Cross parcels, cease fire agreements," Grooms recalled, "even a 1938 Michelin map with an overlay showing coordinates where Gerow would meet the German officers who'd escort him blindfolded to enemy headquarters."

Preparing a notebook of his discoveries with a story outline, Grooms presented them to Dr.

Tom Corts, Samford president. Dr. Corts liked it enough to locate an award-winning director, T.N. Mohan, who reviewed the material and asked to do the film. Samford's funding made the project possible.

Locating the POWs was a daunting task but Grooms found 13 in the U.S. and helped organize a film session and POW reunion with Hodges in Birmingham. "We shot 11 interviews in two days. It was

a killer." Filming also occurred in England, Paris and Brittany.

Grooms and Mohan spent days at The National Archives, discovering more photos, footage of the exchanges and even a 1944 newsreel of the St. Nazaire event.

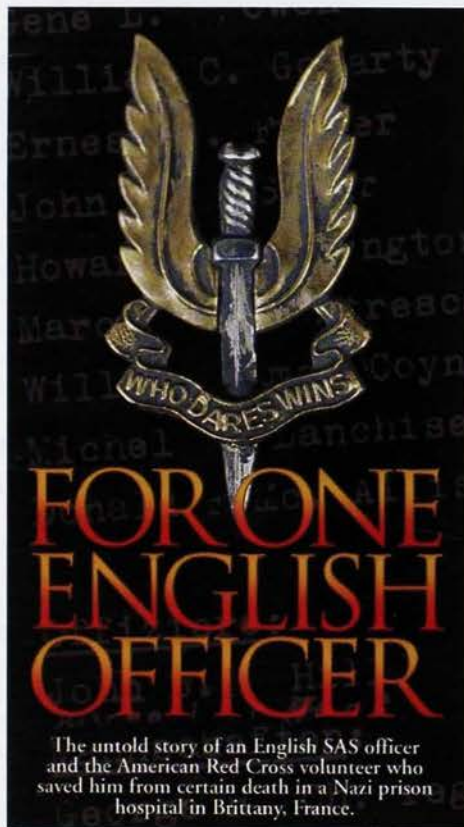
The treatment and narrative went through many re-writes. Weeks of film editing followed. "Our editor was a young Frenchman and the generation gap soon became obvi-

On January 25, 2003, Samford University presented a salute to members of The Greatest Generation, surviving American prisoners of war from the St. Nazaire and Lorient sectors of France, and whose release was won by A. Gerow Hodges. The event was held at the Vestavia Country Club in Birmingham, Alabama.

Twelve World War II veterans from such places as Peabody, Massachusetts, Wenatchee, Washington, and Port Charlotte, Florida came to Birmingham to meet the man who negotiated their freedom from German captors in 1944.

Birmingham attorney Hobart Grooms Jr. organized the reunion after studying the history of the 94th Infantry Division and the 1944 prisoner exchange.

"It's a bit of history," noted Grooms, "that would have been forgotten. We lose 1800 WWII veterans a day. The story had to be told."

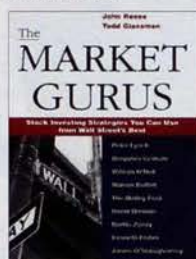

Former Pike Top Executive Receives Tony Award

The sidewalk under the glittering lights of the theater and the marquee advertising the coming production of *the Will Rogers Follies* is paved with gold stars bearing the names of Broadway stars and other performers who have graced the stage of the old showhouse. Barbara Eden is enshrined next to Rufus Thomas.

Odd?

Not exactly. Considering this is the Orpheum Theatre at the mouth of Beale Street in Memphis, Tennessee, those famous serenaders are just right for each other. The theater's tagline, after all, is "where Broadway meets Beale".

And on the far side of Beale, through the door to the left of the box office up the rubber-coated stairs, you'll find a receptionist's desk guarding the offices which unfold down the same kind of narrow hallways—uneven with 75 years of gerrymandered flooring, stacked with old playbills and skirted by out-of-order water coolers—that you would find above the theaters on 45th Street, Seventh Avenue and, yes, Broadway.

And, sitting on a side desk in the office at the end of the maze, skirted itself by stacks of papers, you'll find a silver medallion (about the size of the baseballs that get knocked out of the nearby AutoZone Park), hanging from a crescent-shaped platform, encased in glass.

That, my friend, is a Tony Award.

This particular Tony belongs to **Pat Halloran (Nebraska-Omaha, Delta Chi '62)**, who serves as president and chief executive officer of the Orpheum. "Professionally," he says, "there is no bigger recognition that I could get."

Halloran, a former executive director of the Pi Kappa Alpha Fraternity, earned the Tony through his role as the chairman of the Independent Producers Network, which is an organization of 50 theater presidents controlling 70 North American houses.

IPN produced *Thoroughly Modern Millie* on Broadway, which was an idea the group developed shortly after he took over as chairman four years ago.

"We came up with the idea that we needed to create a show

from beginning to end," he says. Broadway producers essentially act as financiers, and the organization of smaller theaters wanted to protect its financial interests against competing producers and large corporations.

The League of American Theaters and Producers Inc. awarded Halloran the Tony in June 2002, when *Millie* took the title for best production and scored five other Tonies at the annual awards ceremony. But Halloran didn't exactly expect to win.

"We were up against *Mamma Mia*," Halloran says. "I thought *Mamma Mia* would beat us, because I love *Mamma Mia*, frankly."

In fact, he wasn't even there for the big moment, and the trophy itself didn't make its way to this desk until just a few months ago.

"I usually attend [the Tony Awards show], but I was speaking at my Delta Chi Chapter of Pi Kappa Alpha's 50-year reunion, which I had committed to attend," Halloran says. "A friend called me from the stage and said, 'You're not going to believe this'"

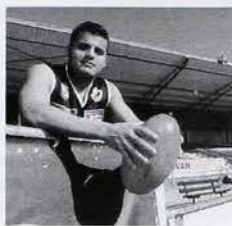

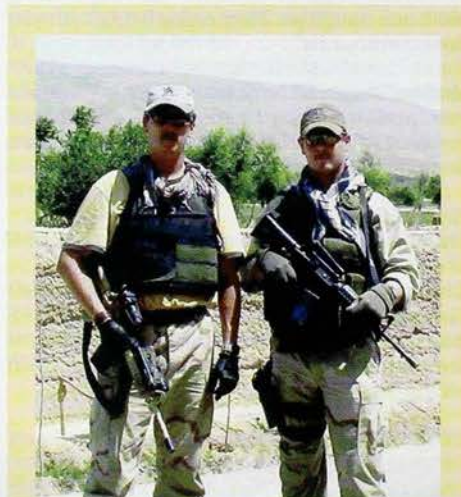

Senator J. Strom Thurmond (South Carolina, Xi '59)

First Baptist Church in Columbia, South Carolina, is a large downtown church. On Tuesday, July 1, 2003, it was packed for a service "Celebrating the Life of J. Strom Thurmond, December 5, 1902 - June 26, 2003". The coffin containing his body had been resting in the rotunda of the State House of South Carolina for several days while thousands streamed by to see him one last time.

From his hometown of Edgefield, where he was born and where he died, to Clemson, where he attended college, and to every nook and cranny of South Carolina his death was marked with lowered flags, small bunches of hand picked and personally arranged flowers and large elaborate bouquets and wreaths; the tributes piled up quickly.

Thurmond attended local schools in Edgefield before going to Clemson Agricultural College of South Carolina to study education. While at Clemson, he ran track and won a number of events. Clemson, at the time was all male and all military. Upon graduation, Thurmond received a commission as a second lieutenant in the U.S. Army and entered the reserve. In 1923 after graduation, he taught and coached in the high schools of McCormick and Ridge Springs. He returned to Edgefield and continued as a high school coach and teacher. In 1929, he ran for the office of local school superintendent and won. Almost immediately, he began reading the law under the tutelage of his father and was admitted to the South Carolina bar in 1930.

Most people living today know Thurmond as a Republican. It is hard to remember that in 1932 he was tireless in support of Franklin Roosevelt. In that election Thurmond was sent by his neighbors to Columbia as a state senator where he served until 1938. From that position, he became a state circuit judge. It was a time when African Americans rarely were seated as jurors. Thurmond, as a judge, was no exception.

By the time World War II erupted into American life in December of 1941, Thurmond was a first lieutenant. He was commissioned into the First Army and was with the 82nd Air Borne Division in the Normandy landing. He won five battle stars, eighteen decorations including the Bronze Star, the French Croix de Guerre and the Order of Crown (Belgian). His great regret from the European theatre was that the United States forces were not allowed to fight on into Berlin. When hostilities ceased in Europe, Thurmond was transferred to the Pacific theatre and was in the Philippines when World War II ended. After the war, he would remain in the Army Reserves until he retired as a major general. One of the im-

ages of his funeral was his coffin covered by a United States Flag with the major general's flag following the horse drawn caisson.

Returning home after the war, Thurmond was elected to be a candidate for governor of South Carolina in the Democratic primary, which in those days was tantamount to election. He had beaten a pool of nine others. As governor his 'new deal' learnings were obvious. Among those accomplishments were the legalization of divorce, the extension of public welfare to dependent children to the age of 18, the increase of the state public school year to nine months and the creation of a state Probation, Parole, and Pardon Board.

He broke onto the national scene when he led the South Carolina delegation out of the Democratic Party convention in 1948, in protest over a strong civil rights plank in the party platform. Almost immediately remnants of Democratic parties in most southern states met separately and formed the States Rights party.

Thurmond was chosen to run for President and vowed to campaign in every state of the Union. He did and carried Louisiana, Mississippi, Alabama, and South Carolina, which was not enough to cause the choice of president to be thrown in the U. S. House of Representatives where each state would have one vote. While Thurmond would say, in later years, that the issue was one of federalism (states' rights) versus big government, his real appeal was segregation.



Shortly before that event, Thurmond married for the first time. Jean Crouch, a former beauty queen and Thurmond's secretary, accepted his written proposal. He was forty-four years old and she was twenty-two years old. In 1960, Jean died of a brain tumor. They had no children. It was during their marriage that Thurmond ran for the United States Senate as a write-in candidate in the 1954 election to determine who would be the state's second senator. In a lopsided election, Thurmond garnered sixty-three per cent of the vote. It was a spot he would remain in almost half a century.

His place in American history was assured when in 1964 Thurmond switched from the Democratic to the Republican Party to support Barry Goldwater for president. He would be a party stalwart for the rest of his days. As it became obvious that the will of the United States was for an end to legal segregation, Thurmond changed his stance and was the first U. S. Senator from the South to hire African-Americans onto his staff. South Carolina Senator and leader of the coalition of African-American legislators Kay Patterson was quoted in the Greenville News, Greenville, South Carolina, "Once he gave up the segregationist philosophy and started serving all the people of South Carolina, I've always supported him." Patterson delivered a eulogy at the Senator's funeral.

Thurmond married a second time at the age of sixty-six. His bride was a twenty-two year old beauty queen, Nancy Moore. On the occasion of the dedication of the Strom Thurmond Center of Clemson, she fondly laughed that one of the quips at their wedding was a line "Strom Thurmond's third wife has just been born in Aiken". Nancy and Strom had four children, two sons and two daughters. One daughter was killed by a drunken driver, but the other three and Nancy were by his side when he died.

During his career, Thurmond became a Pi Kappa Alpha through Xi Chapter. He served with Thad Cochran (Mississippi, Gamma Iota '56) as the joint chair of the Washington 1982 convention. I will remember him at one of Eta Alpha's Founders' Day events. The chapter had asked him for his formula for success. He had, he said, ten rules. When he reached number nine he grinned and advised the brothers and their guests to 'exercise every day'. And number ten is 'Eat your vegetables. They are good for you!' The house came down cheering. Now this legend, this American icon has entered Chapter Eternal.

As he was being remembered by colleagues, Thurmond was honored by U.S. Senator Joseph Biden, who Thurmond specifically asked to speak. Biden closed, "Goodbye Mr. Chairman. This meeting is adjourned."

Richard A. Gump
(Texas, Beta Mu '35)

Richard A. Gump, one of the founding partners of Akin Gump Strauss Hauer & Feld LLP, entered Chapter Eternal on June 21, 2003.



Born in Tulsa, Oklahoma, Gump was raised in Dallas, Texas. He received his B.B.A. in 1939 and his LL.B. in 1940 from the University of Texas, after which he joined the Federal Bureau of Investigation as a special agent. He served as an agent for five years before returning to Dallas to open Gump & Strauss with fellow FBI agent Robert S. Strauss. One of Dallas, Texas' largest and most powerful law firms, Akin Gump now has over 900 employees and offices across Texas, as well as in Washington and key international cities.

Before his retirement, Gump focused on general law matters and labor and employment issues. He organized and served as director and general counsel of the Pipe Line Contractors Association from its inception.

Gump served on the executive committee of the Chancellor's Council for the University of Texas and was a past president of both the Dallas Club and the Northwood Club. He was a member of the State Bar of Texas, the District of Columbia Bar, the Dallas Bar Association and the American Bar Association.

Several of Gump's relatives followed his brotherhood in Beta Mu Chapter at the University of Texas, including his brother, Harry A. Gump '40, and nephews, William D. Gump '73 and Harry A. Gump Jr. '76.

the board of Hoover City Schools Foundation. He served on the board of deacons and as an elder at Briarwood Presbyterian Church.

James C. Hill (Tennessee, Zeta '49)

James Clifford Hill entered Chapter Eternal on May 5, 2003, at his home in Maryville, Tennessee. Hill, better known as "Cowboy", was a distinguished graduate of Maryville High School, Class of 1947, where he excelled in all sports. He received his bachelor of science degree from UT in 1951. While at the university, he was a letterman in football, baseball and track. "Cowboy" was an outstanding defensive back on the national championship football team in 1951. It was his stellar defensive play that led the Volunteers over the Texas Longhorns in the 1951 Cotton Bowl.

Following his graduation from Tennessee, Hill was drafted by the Detroit Lions and played professional football with the Lions and Pittsburgh Steelers. Following his illustrious career in professional football, he owned and managed Minton's department store in his home town. He served his country with honor as a colonel in the United States Army Reserve.

Hill served his community and state as a member of the Maryville City Council, chairman of the Tennessee Selective Service System, chairman of the Tennessee Conservation Commission and a director on the boards of the Blount National Bank and First American National Bank. He was an Eagle Scout, a member of the First Baptist Church, the Kiwanis Club and the University of Tennessee "T" Club.

S. Howes Johnson
(Duke, Alpha Alpha '59)

S. Howes Johnson entered Chapter Eternal on April 10, 2002. A former president of Alpha Alpha Chapter at Duke University, he graduated in 1962 with Honors in Economics. Johnson served in the U.S. Navy during 1962-64 in Cuba on the USS Little Rock during the Cuban Missile Crisis in Guantanamo Bay, Cuba. Afterwards, he graduated from the University of Kentucky Law School in 1967. Johnson was a prominent attorney in Paintsville, Kentucky for 34 years, serving as City Attorney 1958-59. He is survived by father, William A. Johnson; wife, Harriet Hester Johnson; daughter, Jan



J. Patton; and grandson, William Joseph Patton.

Robert Montford McFarland, IV
(Davidson, Beta '59)

Robert Montford McFarland, IV died May 27, 2002 of non-Hodgkins lymphoma. He was born December 4, 1940 in Atlanta, Georgia to the late Robert M. McFarland, Jr. (*Georgia Tech, Alpha Delta '19*), Assistant Treasurer from 1919 to 1933 and Executive Secretary from 1933 to 1940, and the late Mary Palmer Caldwell. He was predeceased by a brother, Robert M. McFarland, III. His grandfather, John W. Caldwell (*Hampden-Sydney, Iota 1894*), was National Chaplain from 1924 to 1928. An uncle was William M. McFarland (*Georgia Tech, Alpha Delta '32*). His grandfather, Wallace T. Palmer (Southwestern, Theta 1885), was National Chaplain 1904-1908. McFarland had the privilege of being initiated in March 1959 by his brother John Caldwell McFarland (*Georgia Tech, Alpha Delta '53*), who is the father of John K. McFarland (*Rensselaer, Gamma Tau '89*).

McFarland was a graduate of Davidson College, where he was vice president of Beta Chapter. He earned a master's degree at the University of Georgia and was elected to Phi Kappa Phi and Phi Beta Kappa. He studied Spanish at the Defense Language Institute in Monterey, California, and at the University of Hartford, and in 1996 spent a summer program in French at the Sorbonne in Paris. He served four years in U.S. Army Intelligence, including service in Thailand as a captain. In 1970 he joined The Hartford Insurance Group with underwriting and management assignments in Rochester, New York; Richmond, Virginia; and the Home Office in Hartford, Connecticut, was elected secretary in 1978 and was later the director of commercial lines strategic planning. McFarland was a chartered property casualty underwriter. After early retirement from The Hartford in 1996, he earned Connecticut certification and taught French and Spanish in Granby, Connecticut, in 1997-1998. He also served as president of the Alliance Francaise de Hartford. He is survived by his wife of 36 years, Patricia Walter McFarland, a son, Robert Montford McFarland V, a daughter Pamela McFarland Hiller, his brother, John, and four grandchildren. A memorial service was held at Columbia Baptist Church, Falls Church, Virginia, with a graveside service with military honors and burial at West View Cemetery, Atlanta.

M. L. "Hap" Gwaltney
(Auburn, Upsilon '68)

Hap Gwaltney entered Chapter Eternal on May 23, 2003. He was a family man, friend, fraternity brother, professional, and church leader. His wife, Diana, and their children, plus family and lots of friends survive him.

Gwaltney graduated from Shades Valley High School and Auburn University. At Auburn, he served as a senator in Student Government and was inducted into the ODK Leadership Honorary. His professional contributions included service as vice president of Daniel Corporation, responsible for development of Greystone Golf and Country Club. One of his many honors was Alabama Realtor of the Year. Gwaltney served as president of the Birmingham Board of Realtors, director of the National Association of Realtors, and on

James V. Otto
(Kansas State, Alpha Omega '43)

James V. Otto entered Chapter Eternal on May 29, 2003 in Salina, Kansas.

Alpha Omega Chapter owes much to Jim Otto and his tireless work on behalf of the Fraternity. A leader as an undergraduate and as an alumnus, Otto spearheaded efforts to finance and construct the current chapter house in the late 1950s. He was instrumental in the development and funding of two Alpha Omega Scholarships, and as he courageously battled cancer, he chaired the current fundraising campaign to renovate the chapter house.

"You can point to all the good things that have happened to Pi Kappa Alpha at Kansas State University in the past 50 years, and directly involved in all those events was Jim Otto. A lot of people talk the talk. Jim Otto walked the walk," said Mike Riley, current president of the Alpha Omega House Corporation.

Born July 20, 1923 in Riley, Kansas, Otto was president and grain merchant for Wright Lorenz Grain Company for over 32 years, retiring in 1994. He had served as a Navy pilot during World War II.

Survivors include his wife of 55 years, Loretta "Bunny", two sons, three daughters and six grandchildren.

A community leader, Otto was a member of St. Mary Queen of the Universe Catholic Church, Salina Country Club, and the Kansas State University President's Club. He also served on the endowment committee for the Sacred Heart Junior/Senior High School.



Donald T. Regan
(Randolph Macon, Iota Zeta '96)

Donald T. Regan entered Chapter Eternal on June 10, 2003. Regan was best known for his service to the United States as both chief of staff and treasury secretary during the Ronald Reagan administration. From 1985-1987, Regan was the senior advisor to the President and the man in charge of the day-to-day White House operations.

Regan was proudly welcomed into the bonds of Pi Kappa Alpha as the special initiate



at the 1996 International Convention. Daniel W. Corah (*Colorado State, Epsilon Theta '83*), Pi Kappa Alpha's executive real estate officer, recalls, "I picked Donald Regan up at the airport and took him to the Convention where he was initiated in 1996. His grandson, Donald Lefevre (*Randolph Macon, Iota Zeta '96*) was an undergraduate member at the time and had the distinct honor of participating in the initiation of his grandfather. Having been both chief of staff for Ronald Reagan as well as Treasury secretary, I asked him if he preferred 'Mr. Secretary'? He replied, 'No, as the former chief of staff, most people just call me Chief.' He was also a personal friend of Medal of Honor recipient and past Pi Kappa Alpha Educational Foundation trustee Brigadier General Louis H. Wilson (*Millsaps, Alpha Iota '39*).

As the secretary of the Treasury from 1980-1985, Regan was instrumental in formulating and implementing national economic policy. He played a key role in the development and passage of the Economic Recovery Tax Act of 1981 and helped develop the Tax Reform Act of 1986 which reformed the nation's system of taxation.

Prior to serving in the Reagan administration, Regan was one of the most recognizable names on Wall Street. He joined the firm known as Merrill Lynch & Co. after serving a tour of duty as a major in the United States Marine Corp. In 1968, at age 50, Regan became the youngest man to ever be named president of the Merrill Lynch company. In 1971, he was elected chairman and executive officer and served in this capacity until joining President Reagan's staff.

During his years at Merrill Lynch, Regan led the firm to becoming a major player in the competitive financial institution industry. Because of his accomplishments, he was inducted into the Business Hall of Fame and served as vice chairman of the board of directors of the New York Stock Exchange.

Regan was born in Cambridge, Massachusetts in 1918 and graduated from Harvard in 1940 with a bachelor's degree in English. He is survived by his wife, Ann, four children and nine grandchildren.



Dan Storey
(Western Ontario, Iota Omega '98)

On Sunday June 15, 2003 Brother Dan Storey of Iota Omega Chapter tragically joined Chapter Eternal as result of a motorcycle accident at the age of 26. Originally from St. Mary's, Ontario, Dan was teaching English in Thailand at the time of the accident. He has left many family members, brothers and friends who forever will remember his way with people. He was truly a person that others admired, and all are grateful to have known him. "Storey" was an accomplished athlete, with a passion for hockey. He could always be counted on, and was there with a smile. Forever we will miss him.

Robert Gray Wallace
(Memphis, Delta Zeta '50)

Robert Gray Wallace entered Chapter Eternal on June 2, 2003. Wallace graduated from Tech High School in 1944 in Memphis and then joined the Army to serve in World War II. Afterward, he graduated from the University of Memphis. In April 1951, he went on active duty with the 516th (now the 463rd) troop carrier wing at Memphis Air Force Base but applied for an Army Commission a few months later. In July 1952, at Fort Knox, he was made a second lieutenant in the armored branch. In 1962-63, he served a tour of duty at the University of Missouri-Columbia where he earned a master's degree in military history. WHY I PLEDGED:

Scott A. Russell (Kansas, Beta Gamma '85)

Scott Russell is a witty and jovial man who has demonstrated his love of Pi Kappa Alpha throughout his history with the Fraternity. As an undergraduate, he served Beta Gamma Chapter as president and rush chairman. As an alumnus, Russell served in various capacities as a member of the Pi Kappa Alpha Memorial Headquarters professional staff, including chapter consultant, director of chapter services, director of alumni affairs and Educational Foundation Annual Fund director. He is a member of the Educational Foundation's *Oak Trust*. Professionally, Russell is the director of public affairs at HNTB Corporation, an architecture/engineering/planning firm in Kansas City, Missouri. He serves on the board of directors of the International Association for Public Participation, and on the board of directors as accreditation chair for the Greater Kansas City Chapter of the Public Relations Society of America. He and his wife, Kristin, reside in Kansas City with their two sons, Matthew and Adam.

The *Shield & Diamond* caught up with Russell at a reunion of Pi Kappa Alpha past staff, and asked him to tell us about his experience in joining the Fraternity:

What first attracted you to Pi Kappa Alpha?

In the fall of my senior year in high school, I started receiving piles of letters from fraternities at the schools I was considering. All the letters were variations on the same theme: we're the best, most connected, smartest, biggest, etc. The Pikes at KU distinguished themselves to me when Mike Gill '83 and Darren Allen '83, the two rush chairmen, actually visited me in my hometown. The extra effort they made to meet me in person and the

excellent "sales" job during our meeting was enough to sell me on the KU Pikes. I was so impressed that I called them two days later to pledge – before they had asked!

What rush techniques did the Pikes at Beta Gamma Chapter use?

In my experience, the best Beta Gamma rush chairmen have always understood the value of seeking out and making one-on-one connections with promising prospects during the open rush period. KU had a big formal rush at the beginning of the school year and we always got some top notch pledges through it. But the vast majority of every great pledge class came out of the open rush period and came as a result of focused one-on-one recruitment. Not rush parties, not alumni recommendations, but creative and proactive networking among peers and one-on-one recruitment.

Also, our best rush chairmen were great record-keepers. We knew who our prospects were, where they were, what they were interested in and who among us had the best connections or mutual interests. We tracked our contacts and planned when and how we would close the deal.

Finally, while recruitment is a responsibility of every pledge and member of the chapter, nothing could replace a good rush chairman. The right rush chairman, supported by officers and other chapter leaders, is absolutely essential to a successful recruitment effort. Of

all the positions we selected, the rush chairman always received the most attention.

What role has Pi Kappa Alpha played in your life beyond college?

Pi Kappa Alpha has played an unusually strong role in my life. After graduation, I went to work as a chapter consultant for the fraternity. Six years later, I left staff having served as annual fund director, director of services and director of alumni affairs. In the intervening years, I traveled all over the country, met some of the finest men I know to this day and, most importantly, met my wife. Needless to say, Pi Kappa Alpha had an influence on me that extended beyond my collegiate experience.

Why is rush so important?

In 1984, Beta Gamma Chapter was not the biggest, richest or smartest chapter on campus. In fact, in many ways, the KU Pikes were struggling to reestablish themselves as a campus force. But with all their shortcomings, they had the most important raw material of any great fraternity chapter: capable men committed to a vision of a great fraternity. And they knew that a key to fulfilling their vision was a focus on recruiting the best men they could. At a time when their resources were very limited, they poured their time and treasury into their rush effort and I believe (immodestly perhaps) that their efforts paid off. Over the next several years, a chapter that had fewer than fifty grew to more than 150. And because we continued their tradition of recruiting the best, we were not only among the biggest – we were among the best, if not the best. In my mind, my experience proves beyond question, rush is the basic building block of Pi Kappa Alpha and the key to a great fraternity.
