

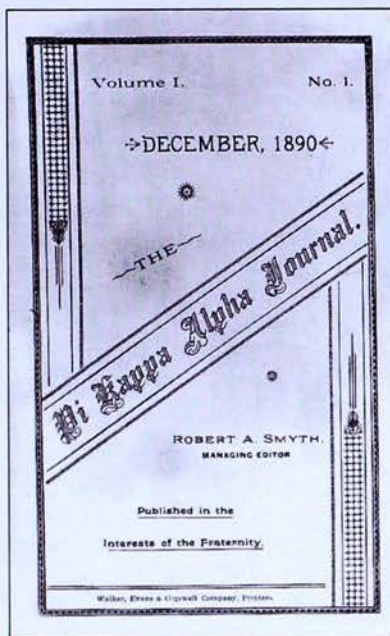

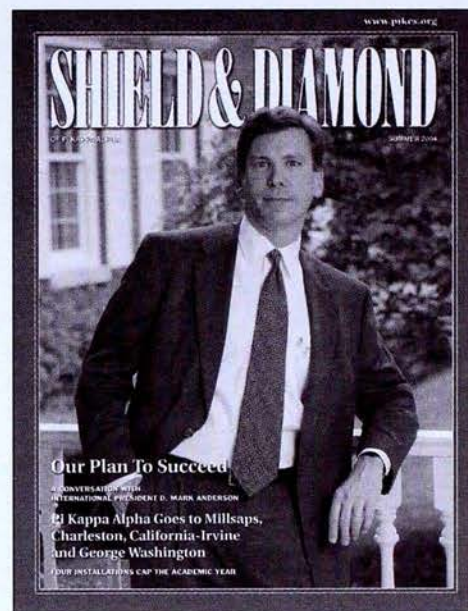


Shield & Diamond of Pi Kappa Alpha

St. Louis, Missouri was the host city for the 2004 International Convention.

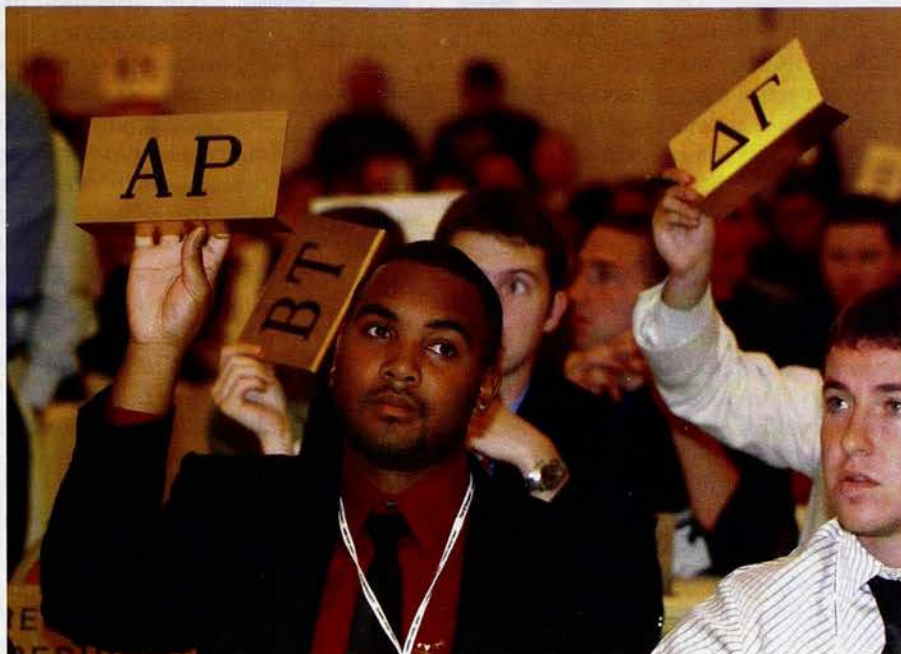

It is an honor to share our convention experience with you in the first "From the Supreme Council" column. Having never attended a convention prior to 2004 in St. Louis, we were enthusiastic and anxious for many reasons.

We were each chosen to serve on different committees at convention, and as always, it was a chance to interact with brothers from across North America sharing many different Pike experiences. We heard from the International Rush Advisory Committee that initiations were up 10% this year, a true testament of all our hard work. We also heard International Historian Dr. Jerome V. Reel (*Tulane, Eta '57*) speak on the Fraternity's Ritual and Dr. Jerry W. Askew (*North Carolina, Tau '73*), president-elect of the Educational Foundation, speak on effective leadership. The legislative portion of the weekend, however, is what makes Convention such a special event.

Our committee experiences were very different, but rewarding. The Nominating Committee (of which Matt was a member) was charged with identifying five alumnus members to lead the International Fraternity for the next two years on the Supreme Council. Serving on this committee enabled Matt to gain a perspective on the Fraternity unlike any other. The incredible insight he gained was key to the complicated process of slating a Supreme Council to be elected by the delegates. The Membership Committee (on which Mike served), like many of the other committees at Convention, oversaw legislative proposals that required discussion and consideration before being brought to the delegates for approval. This committee spent most of its time reviewing the Fraternity's newest initiative, the *True Pike*. The *True Pike* stems from the *Return to Values* initiative in providing a first-person action plan and expectations for each individual member of Pi Kappa Alpha. The delegates were extremely enthusiastic about

the *True Pike* proposal, and we believe it will have a profound impact on everything we do as brothers in Pi Kappa Alpha. However, an unexpected highlight of the weekend for us was the opportunity to meet so many alumnus brothers—we otherwise might not have had such an opportunity. It is truly amazing to witness so many men taking time from their very busy lives to level with 18- to 22-year-olds. It is a true testament to the "bigger picture" within the bonds of our Fraternity. Knowing that we are an elite group of men formed to serve a purpose of greater good is motivation to make ourselves, our fellow brothers, and our chapters better in all relationships and pursuits.

Since hearing our names announced at the final banquet as the new Supreme Council undergraduate vice presidents, we have been humbled and at the same time elated. Knowing that there are approximately 200 active chapters within the bonds of our beloved order, which encompass upwards of 10,000 undergraduates, it is amazing to think that we were selected from so many other well qualified and capable men, many of whom we worked very closely with in St. Louis, to lead our Fraternity.

We are well aware of the responsibility and expectations of our position and we welcome the challenge. We cannot put into words how honored we are at the position to which we have been appointed, and we look forward to the upcoming year. The alumnus brothers on this Supreme Council, like those who have served on all Councils before it, bring a wide range of talents and experience in the Fraternity. We are excited to work with them for the betterment of Pi Kappa Alpha. The outlook for our future is bright, and we are honored to work with the entire Fraternity to help ensure that our vision becomes reality. Thank you once again, and we look forward to serving you all to our fullest potential.

EVP Orians Announces Departures, Additions to MHQ Staff

Executive Vice President Raymond L. Orians has reluctantly announced the departure of Recruitment Director **N. Ryan Flickinger** (*Southern Illinois, Iota Mu '94*) from the Memorial Headquarters staff. After eight years of successful service, including stints as chapter consultant, director of expansion, director of marketing and recruitment officer, Flickinger has accepted a position with Omega Financial, Inc. in their alumni services division, managing capital campaigns and fundraising efforts for fraternities and sororities across the nation. He leaves the Memorial Headquarters after guiding the Fraternity to one of its most successful recruitment campaigns in history; Pi Kappa Alpha's 9.5% improvement in initiations was the largest increase in 15 years. During Flickinger's tenure and thanks to his leadership, the Fraternity installed 34 chapters and initiated more than 29,000 members. He and his wife, Jennifer, will continue to reside in Memphis, Tennessee.

The Fraternity is saying goodbye to **Justin A. Buck** (*Southeast Missouri State, Epsilon Iota '96*) after four years of service on staff. He spent the last two years in the real estate department as the director of real estate. Prior to that, Buck oversaw the Fraternity's expansion department, and the year before that he was a chapter consultant. Executive Real Estate Officer Dan Corah (*Colorado State, Epsilon Theta '83*) said, "Justin provided excellent work in all facets of the real estate department, helping us advance the cause of acquiring and maintaining competitive housing throughout the chapter ranks. With the lower interest rates of late, he also coached several groups through their refinancing efforts, helping them capture good rates that will save those chapters thousands of dollars over the long run. Not to mention all the great work he did as a chapter consultant and then with the successful expansion projects he oversaw, Justin will be sorely missed on our staff." Buck will attend the University of Miami, Florida this fall where he will pursue his MBA.

He will oversee all educational programs and materials, service the loan sites requiring extra attention, and assist with the promotion and maintenance of all real estate department programs. Halbrook joins Executive Real Estate Officer Corah, Senior Director of Real Estate Clint Bartman (*Illinois State, Kappa Alpha '94*) and Coordinator of Real Estate Programs Heather Huffman in the real estate department.

Banner Year Increases Focus on Recruitment

After a renewed emphasis on recruitment over the past year, Pi Kappa Alpha is celebrating one of the Fraternity's most successful recruitment periods in history. During the 2003-04 academic year, Pike chapters and colonies signed 5,567 pledges and 4,582 initiations, resulting in a 9.5% and 8.6% increase respectively.

This success can be attributed to the hard work and dedication of Pike chapters across North America which focused on recruitment 365 days out of the year. Recruitment was also a primary focus for Fraternity staff and volunteers; from Pike University programming to consultant visits designed specifically with chapter growth in mind, to alumni advisors guiding chapters on a local level.

With the new academic year ahead, it is time to raise the bar a little bit higher, to set new goals just out of reach, and to refocus energy again on recruitment. While Pi Kappa Alpha experienced great improvements, so did many other national and international fraternities.

With a focus on growth for the organization, the Fraternity has named **J. Burke Smith** (*Alberta, Lambda Epsilon '00*) as di-

rector of recruitment.

Smith has served the Fraternity previously as director of expansion and as expansion consultant. He will research Pi Kappa Alpha's target market, analyze trends, enhance our educational tools and facilitate training sessions for consultants and chapter leaders. One improvement already made this year was to increase the depth of recruitment training early in the consultant training program, in order to be more effective in helping chapters with summer rush and with fall rush preparation. Smith will also continue to focus on the Fraternity's expansion efforts.

Pi Kappa Alpha has established short term and long term growth objectives, both in terms of quality and quantity. While each year specific growth targets are outlined, Pi Kappa Alpha's overall goal is to have the largest market share of any men's social fraternity, helping Pike to be the number one leader in the Greek world.

Our Gateway to the Future

The 2004 International Convention

St. Louis gained notoriety in 1803 when Meriwether Lewis and William Clark embarked on their expedition of the Louisiana territory. Since the construction of the Gateway Arch, the city has become identified with that icon that links both east and west of our nation and embodies the spirit of prosperity and what lies beyond. Pi Kappa Alpha will look back upon the 2004 St. Louis International Convention as one that brought brothers together from all over North America with the unique spirit of St. Louis, of the future and prosperity.

As the hotel lobby began to swell with the influx of undergraduates and alumni representing one-hundred and seventy two chapters and five colonies, stories were exchanged of travel and successes of the last year, and friendships were renewed. While for most it was their first International Convention, almost all attendees had attended other Pike University conferences. "One of the best aspects of Pi Kappa Alpha is the long lasting friendships that are developed when we come together at Pike University events," said Educational Foundation Director of Annual Giving George C. Miller (*Delta State, Zeta Beta '97*). He also commented that what he most enjoyed about convention is "the interaction with undergraduates as they learn programming ideas that they can take back and implement at their own chapters."



Wednesday's opening session set the tone for the week. Executive Director Eric P. Wulf (*Iowa, Gamma Nu '93*) welcomed all to the convention, the 64th since the first at Richmond, Virginia in 1874. "We will be planning for the future," Wulf said in reference to the duties that each legislative committee would

undertake, and the importance of the legislative process to the International Fraternity.

Pi Kappa Alpha places the destiny of the International Fraternity faithfully in the hands of its undergraduate members. Over the course of the convention, five legislative committees (Constitution, Finance, Governance, Membership and Resolutions) met to review and debate legislation designed to move Pi Kappa Alpha into the vanguard of the fraternity world.

After extensive work by each of the five committees, their hard work was presented to the convention floor for final determination. The committee process led to three of the most dynamic initiatives to be undertaken by any fraternity. The first, from the Governance committee, was the streamlining of the Fraternity's Constitution & Laws. The effect of this legislation is to reduce what was the Constitution & Laws of Pi Kappa Alpha to more efficient documents that allow flexibility for our leadership, while still preserving the power of the undergraduate chapters. This initiative was passed with overwhelming support by the chapter delegates.



The second great proposal of the 2004 Convention was the adoption of Pi Kappa Alpha's new membership program. Entitled the *True Pike*, this initiative builds upon the work of the *Mission, Vision and Creed* and delivers a more tangible expectation of our members, chapters and alumni (see page 10). This as well was overwhelmingly adopted by the delegates to the convention.

Finally, the third historic legislative change was a complete restructuring of the Fraternity's fee structure. Beginning July 1, 2005, chapters will no longer be billed pledge fees, initiation fees and annual dues; instead, all chapters will be assessed a base chapter fee of \$2,600 and a one-time membership fee of \$260 per initiation. As a result, Pi Kappa Alpha will be the only fraternity that does not require a fee to pledge. While this was one of the most hotly debated proposals at the convention, in the end more than two-thirds of the undergraduate delegates voted in favor of the change (undergraduates are solely responsible for voting on Fraternity fees). Delegates agreed that the new structure will reduce the administrative burden of roster management, provide greater local fee flexibility and provide incentives for chapters to recruit more quality members.



The convention was also a time for reflection as the Fraternity paid tribute to those brothers who have entered Chapter Eternal, with particular reverence given to our brothers who made the ultimate sacrifice in defense of our nation. The Gold Star Memorial gave special recognition to the men of Pi Kappa Alpha who have died in the past two years and honored those still fighting for our freedom around the world. Delta regional president and captain in the United States Air Force, Dr. Carl Anthony 'Trey' Labella III (*Delta State, Zeta Beta '94*) said our men in the armed forces embody "the value of service, introduced by the founders, and the humility taught in the ritual". It was evident that Pi Kappa Alpha continues beyond our collegiate years and is truly a lifelong journey.



Pi Kappa Alpha takes time each year to honor those members of the Fraternity who

represent the highest ideals and commitment to excellence.

The Educational Foundation recognized Jeffrey K. Lorch (*Columbia, Iota Lambda '01*) with the Robertson Most Outstanding Undergraduate Award (see page 61) and inducted six outstanding PKA alums into the Order of West Range: Jack E. Bowsher (*Illinois, Beta Eta '50*), past director of education for IBM; Joseph R. Brown (*Kansas, Beta Gamma '50*), past CEO of Black & Veatch Architects Inc.; L. Owen Brown (*Auburn, Upsilon '61*), past president and COO of Sun Microsystems; Richard J. Seitz (*Kansas State, Alpha Omega '39*), decorated war hero; Jeffrey C. Taylor (*Massachusetts, Theta Mu '79*), founder and CEO of Monster.com; and Marvin D. Dennis (*Illinois, Beta Eta '55*), president of Dennis and Company LLC, a financial consulting firm. The character of these distinguished alumni epitomizes the values of the *True Pike*. Each, in addition to his personal success, remains true to the belief that man's purpose is a higher one.

The announcement of Marvin Dennis' induction into the Order of West Range was the first of two major surprises to award recipients. A well guarded secret, as Brother Dennis was announced he was visibly moved by the honor, and received a standing ovation for his contribution to the International Fraternity. "How valuable and rewarding it is to give," Dennis said. Brother Dennis has served the Fraternity as Educational Foundation president, and his generous lead gift has helped endow Pi Kappa Alpha's premier leadership conference: the Chapter Executives Conference (formerly the Chapter Presidents Conference).

The Fraternity continued to honor alumni by awarding Chad Holliday, Jr. (*Tennessee, Zeta '67*) with the 2004 Judge Elbert P. Tuttle Distinguished Achievement Award. This annual award recognizes that alumnus member of the Fraternity who has distinguished himself in public service. As chairman of the board and CEO of DuPont, Brother Holliday has brought the values of Pi Kappa Alpha, which he learned through Zeta Chapter, to one of the largest companies in the world.

The last individual award bestowed upon an alumnus member was the second surprise. The Loyalty Award is bestowed annually to recognize significant support and loyalty that a brother has provided to the Fraternity at the local or international level. For 20 years, Raymond L. Orians (*Memphis, Delta Zeta '66*) has served Pi Kappa Alpha as its executive vice president. His character, vision, and consistency have provided Pi Kappa Alpha

Judge Elbert P. Tuttle 2004 Distinguished Achievement Award

CHAD HOLLIDAY, JR. (*Tennessee, Zeta '67*) received the 2004 Judge Elbert P. Tuttle Distinguished Achievement Award. He is also a 2000 recipient of the Pi Kappa Alpha Educational Foundation's Order of West Range. Holliday joins the ranks of past Distinguished Achievement Award winners that include national champion football coach Bobby Bowden (*Samford, Alpha Pi '49*), Denver Broncos owner Patrick D. Bowlen (*Oklahoma, Beta Omicron '63*) and former president of American Express Financial, the late R. Craig Hoenshell (*Nebraska-Omaha, Delta Chi '63*).

Holliday, 56, is the chairman of the board and chief executive officer of DuPont. He is the 18th executive to lead the company in more than 200 years of DuPont history. Holliday became CEO on February 1, 1998 and chairman on January 1, 1999. Previously, he served as executive vice president and member of the Office of Chief Executive. He was also chairman of the DuPont Asia Pacific region.

In September 2002, Holliday was appointed by President George W. Bush to serve on the National Infrastructure Advisory Council. He was also elected chairman of the Business Council in 2002. Holliday is past chairman of the World Business Council for Sustainable

Development (WBCSD) and the Society of Chemical Industry – American Section. He also serves on the board of directors of *HCA* and *Catalyst*. He is a senior member of the *Institute of Industrial Engineers*.

Under Holliday's direction, DuPont established the mission to achieve sustainable growth – increasing shareholder and societal value while decreasing the company's environmental footprint. The company has a three-part strategy: deliver new products through the power of integrated science, vigorously pursue knowledge intensity in all businesses, and significantly increase productivity by using Six Sigma methodology.

Holliday says, "We will never compromise our core values – safety and environmental excellence, integrity, high ethical standards and treating people fairly and with respect. They are our foundation. We must continually strive to find ways to enhance them."

Since his initiation in 1967, Brother Holliday has continued to stay involved with both his chapter and the International Fraternity. As an undergraduate, he served Zeta Chapter as house manager and president. He is a member of the Pi Kappa Alpha Educational Foundation's Garnet and Gold Society.

Holliday and his wife, Ann, live in Wilmington, Delaware. They have two adult sons, Scot and Chad.

with exemplary leadership, such as no other fraternity has been able to employ. It was obvious that Brother Orians was deeply moved by the unexpected announcement of this award and the emotion grew as the ten past national and international presidents of the Fraternity rose behind him, and reflected on his contributions to the Fraternity and their successes. "The Fraternity pays back more than we can give it," Orians said in accepting the award. He pointed out that Pi Kappa Alpha was a family and he was involved in a partnership with his lovely wife, Paige, who was immediately whisked to the stage and serenaded with a rendition of *The Dream Girl of Pi Kappa Alpha* (also see page 13).



The Honorable Pete A. Sessions of Texas (*Southwestern, Alpha Omicron '76*) gave the keynote address at Saturday's Pike University Awards Luncheon. True to the spirit of the entire week, Congressman Sessions reiterated the importance of achievement with integrity. He challenged everyone to think big, to "take that which you have been given and do something with it". Pi Kappa Alpha, much like the United States of America, is the realization of the dream of a few. That dream has spread to many, and continues to evolve and grow with high purpose and expectation.

D. Mark Anderson (*Wofford, Nu '76*) also addressed the convention as he prepared to say goodbye as international president. He continued to emphasize what has become the vision of Pi Kappa Alpha, that "values are the most important

measure of a man". What it means to be a ΠΚΑ is simply commitment to accomplish those goals which make us work a little harder, to collectively be able to control the destiny of the Fraternity, and to realize that our purpose is powerful and significant.



The Pi Kappa Alpha Fraternity annually recognizes outstanding chapter achievement with the presentation of the Fraternity's International Awards. The highest recognition that a chapter can receive is the Robert Adger Smythe Award. This award recognizes

those chapters that have demonstrated overall chapter excellence and outstanding achievement on their campuses—making this group the "best of the best" within Pi Kappa Alpha. This year, 14 chapters were presented with a coveted Smythe trophy (also see page 12). The winners cumulatively donated nearly 74,000 man hours of community service, and held an average chapter GPA of 3.02. On average, these groups initiated 88% of their pledge classes, ranked first in campus-wide intramurals, had 95% of their members involved in campus organizations other than Pi Kappa Alpha, and are the largest fraternity on their respective campuses.

As the winners were announced one by one, each chapter was ecstatic with their recognition. At the same time every chapter that had been named a finalist and Excellence Award winner became more and more anxious, with the field narrowing as fewer and fewer Smythes were left to be distributed. As the thirteenth Smythe was awarded to Delta Theta Chapter (*Arkansas State*), 33 chapters hung in the balance. The tension in the air for these chapters was mixed with the outpouring of celebration from the previously honored groups. Finally, and for the first time in their history after receiving two Excellence Awards in a row, and five in the chapter's history, Zeta Sigma (*Florida Institute of Technology*) was announced as the final recipient of the Robert Adger Smythe Award in 2004. Emotional as they received their trophy, the Zeta Sigma members were elated with their success. "This is the culmination and result of years of dedication and hard work by our

Here, in brief, are the 2004 Order of West Range inductees:

Jack E. Bowsher (Illinois, Beta Eta '50)

Prior to his retirement, Bowsher served as director of education for IBM Corporation. As an undergraduate, he served Beta Eta Chapter as treasurer and rush chairman. Bowsher has authored several books on education, including *Fix Schools First: Blueprint For Achieving Learning Standards*, and he currently serves on the advisory board of the Graduate School of Business at UCLA. Over the years, he has remained active in the alumni affairs of Beta Eta Chapter. He is a member of the Educational Foundation's Shield & Diamond Society. Jack's twin brother, Chuck, a 1950 initiate of Beta Eta, is also a member of the Order of West Range. Bowsher and his wife, Charmian, reside in San Diego, California.

Joseph R. Brown (Kansas, Beta Gamma '50)

When It Comes to Ray Orians, Loyalty is No Surprise

PIKA'S CEO HAS GUIDED AND SERVED THE FRATERNITY FOR ALMOST FORTY YEARS.

RAYMOND L. ORIAN (*Memphis, Delta Zeta '66*) has been with the Fraternity for so long that most of us don't remember a time when he wasn't a key player in Pi Kappa Alpha's affairs. In 1995, his good friend Jerry Askew (*North Carolina, Tau '73*) said of him, "Who among us doesn't have a 'Ray story'? The measure of his impact on our lives lies in both our personal experiences and the fact that over the past years, during which Ray, more than anyone else, has been a constant, PiKA has attained a status among college fraternities reserved for the very, very best."

In 2004, as Orians marks his 38th year as a member of Pi Kappa Alpha, he has been honored with the Fraternity's Loyalty Award for his dedication and service.

How did Ray Orians come to be a part of Pi Kappa Alpha? In a 1995 interview, *Shield & Diamond* asked, "How did you get associated with Pi Kappa Alpha as an undergraduate at Memphis State [as the University of Memphis was then known]?" Orians replied, "I had every intention of pledging Kappa Alpha Order. After all, all my older high school buddies were members there. But fortunately, I decided not to go through formal rush. Open rush provided me the opportunity to get to know members of various fraternities in a more relaxed atmosphere. One PiKA member in particular, a scholastic All-American football player, took me under his wing and made it a point to introduce me to practically every member in the house. I was impressed not only with him, but also with the many members of different backgrounds, who obviously had a common bond and goals. All of a sudden, the choice became easy."

Kappa Alpha Order's loss was Pi Kappa Alpha's gain.

Orians applied for a part time position with the Memorial Headquarters at 577 University Boulevard in Memphis, Tennessee on October 11, 1966. He was a sophomore at the University of Memphis, and had been an initiated member for ten months. Orians began work as an auditor in the accounting department. He graduated in 1970, and ac-

cepted the position of director of housing. He would work in that capacity until May 1984, acquiring a knowledge of Greek real estate and finance that is unrivaled in the fraternity world.

Following the departure of Executive Director Richard L. Murgatroyd (*Ohio State, Alpha Rho '56*) from the professional staff, the Supreme Council appointed Orians to the post of acting executive director in 1984. National President Joseph J. Turner (*Clemson, Eta Alpha '70*) remarked, "Ray's experience on staff will provide the necessary continuity and leadership during this transition." He was subsequently

appointed executive vice president in May 1984.

Orians has either directly or indirectly affected each member of the Fraternity. When Past National President William N. LaForge (*Delta State, Zeta Beta '69*) and his wife, Nancy, were the proud parents of a new son, Orians sent a framed coat of arms and a pledge pin to the youngster. Clayton LaForge (*William and Mary, Gamma '03*) was present at the 2004 Convention to see Orians receive his Loyalty Award.

On the local level, Orians serves on the house corporation for Delta Zeta Chapter. The University of Memphis recognized Orians as the Outstanding Greek Alumnus of 1994. Orians is a past president of the Fraternity Executives Association, elected by chief executives of all national fraternities and sororities. He also served as president of the Coalition for Freedom of Association, an action group of several national fraternities and sororities and other student organizations, which attained federal legislation for the right of students to freely associate. Orians is a member of the Educational Foundation's Shield and Diamond Society and the Oak Trust. He and his wife, Paige, have two children, Aileen Orians McKellar, and Jeffrey M. Orians (*Memphis, Delta Zeta '97*), and two grandsons, Chase and Cole McKellar. Orians is joined in his Delta Zeta Chapter membership by his brothers, Richard '68, Michael '81, Steven '81, and Robert '83.

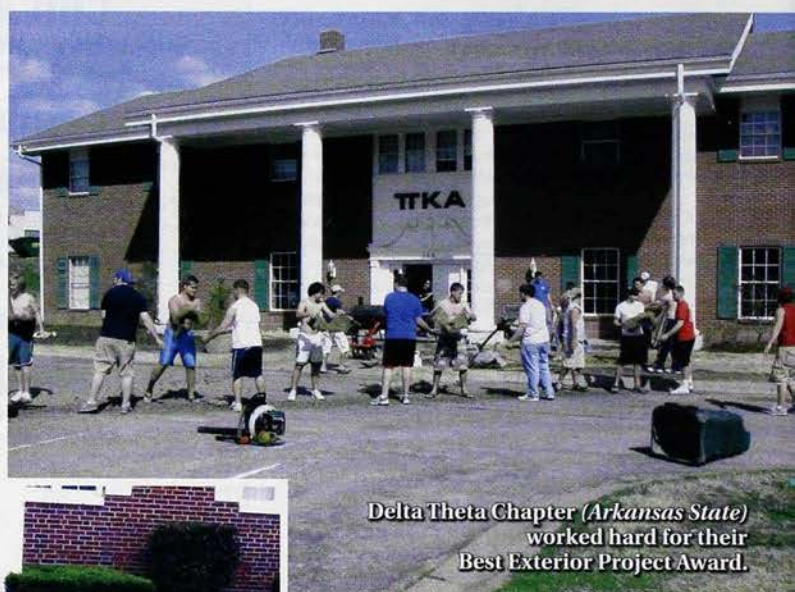

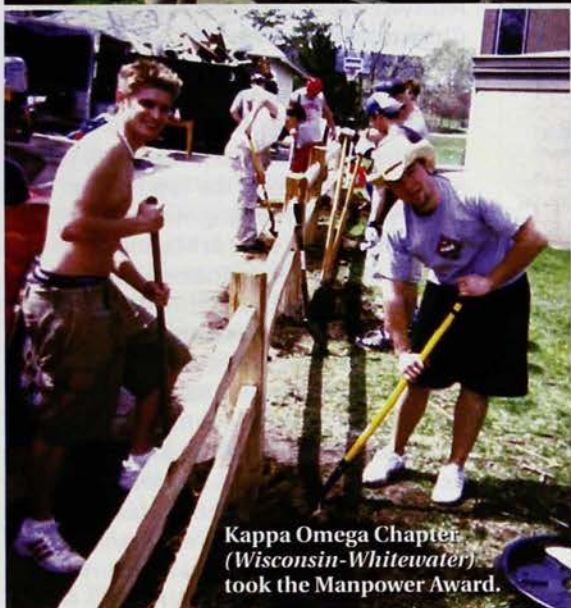

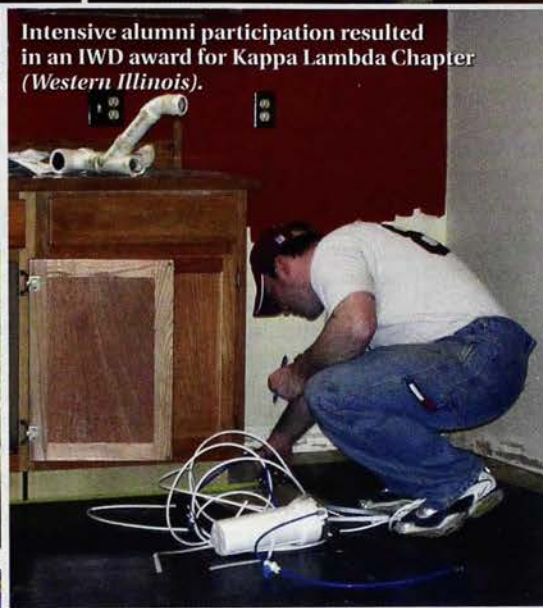

New York City Alumni Association Prepares For Chartering

From chapters across North America, thousands of Pi Kappa Alpha brothers call New York City home. And while many Pikes enjoy the benefits of an alumni association at their respective chapters, there was a void to be filled in the greater New York region. With many New York Pikes working and living quite a distance from their undergraduate schools, there was little opportunity for post-graduate involvement. It was a challenge for New Yorkers who went to school in Ohio, Florida, or Texas to participate in alumni events. Editor's Note: Forty-four years ago at the 1960 National Convention in Miami, Florida, Pi Kappa Alpha officially declared membership open to all qualified young men, removing the 'white only' clause from the Fraternity's constitution. While minority membership was not unknown in Pi Kappa Alpha – Charles W. McClellan, a Cherokee Indian, was initiated by Rho Chapter at Cumberland in 1899, and Yutoka Minakuchi (Transylvania, Kappa 1902) served as chapter correspondent to Shield & Diamond – the nation in the early 1960s was emerging from a long period of segregation. The effort to defeat the 'white only' attitude was strongly championed by Alpha Tau Chapter from the University of Utah. The following is a look back at their efforts to implement that change in the early 1960s.

James E. Cannon (Utah, Alpha Tau '60), wasn't sure what he wanted to do when he first entered the University of Utah on a warm September day in 1960.

During fraternity rush he expected to join an older student he respected from East High School in Salt Lake City, who had joined another fraternity a couple of years earlier.

But fate has a way of interceding.

"Going into the Pi Kap house just seemed right," he recalled about why he joined Pi Kappa Alpha.

Jim enjoyed his first year of college, especially the social aspect of the U of U's strong Greek system. Alpha Tau counted over 100 dues paying members on its rolls then, ranging from party boys to Phi Beta Kappa's, as well as a pledge brother, Ross Anderson '57, who would become one of the youngest national presidents of PiKA in 1972.

There was a slight change in both of their time lines when The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints changed its missionary policy for young men, lowering the age requirement from 21 to 19.

"When I got called into my bishop's office and asked about going, the timing caught me a little off guard," he said. "I thought I had plenty of time to get ready."

Six months later, he had his affairs in order and was ready to embark on a 2½ year mission to West Germany.

It was a different country that he returned to in the summer of 1963.

Older and more mature, Jim had a better grasp of what path he was going to take when he returned to the U of U

that fall. He also had a new Volkswagen bug he had shipped over from Germany to tool around campus in.

But life was not going to be a smooth road for the 22-year-old student.

"It was a time of turmoil in the country, and my life," he said, with a growing unrest by the nation's youth against the escalating war in Viet Nam, social change towards civil rights in America, and the assassination of President John F. Kennedy.

"There was a lot going on just after I got back, and life wasn't as care free as when I left," he said.

With new responsibilities at home and a heavy class load, Jim was content to attend chapter meetings each week and the social life it brought with it, but he did not think he had the time or energy to take on official duties at the chapter.

So he was a little surprised when he was nominated in December for chapter president for 1964.

Fraternities in Utah have a unique juggling act they need to balance to attract and keep the best men on campus. That balance involves returned missionaries like Jim and Ross who don't smoke or drink, with more traditional students.

"Jim was considered the perfect balancing act to keep the house on track," Nicolaysen noted.

So Jim tossed his hat in the ring and was elected chapter president. He immediately began wrestling with the 'white only' issue.

PIKA's fall pledge class had a number of outstanding young men, including one from Ogden, Dennis Miya '64, whom the house was delighted to pledge.

"He was just a quality young man whom everybody liked," Jim said, "and the only difference between Denny and the rest of his pledge class was he was Asian."

Like Jim, Denny was drawn toward the diversity of the brothers at the Pi Kap house that made it seem comfortable, despite a strong rush from the Betas.

"I still maintain friendships from the fraternity," Denny said. "It also taught me a valuable lesson in that you do not prejudice people."

Pi Kappa Alpha had removed the fraternity's 'white only' clause from the books in 1960, but unofficially, it was still being observed in many places.

"The Beta's (at the U) had already dealt with the 'white only' issue a couple of years before, and it was just a matter of time before the Sigma Chi's were in the same boat as us," said Jim.

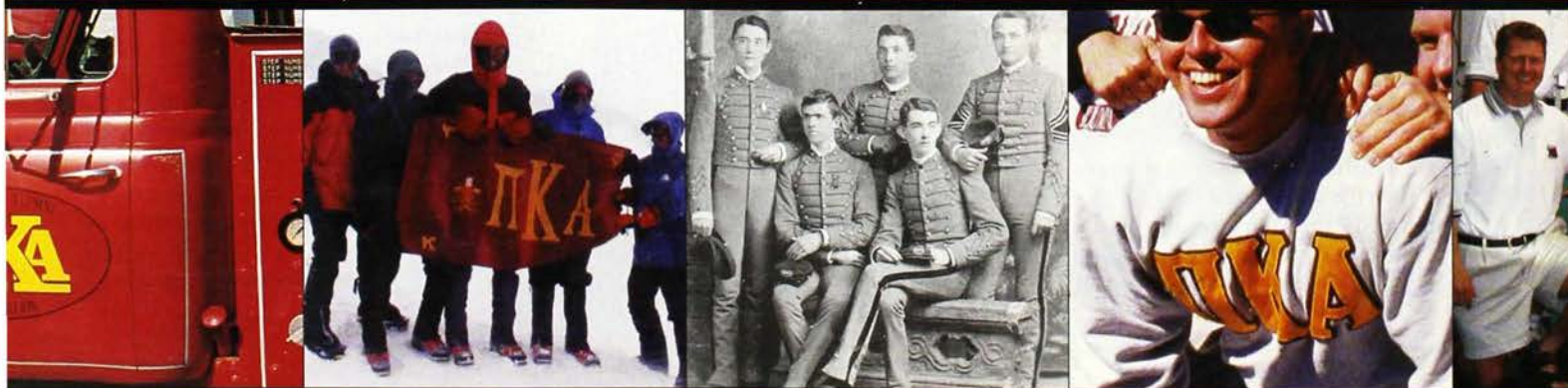

In fact, it was Denny's cousin who had broken the color barrier at the Beta house two years before.

"We knew it was going to be an issue when I pledged," said Denny, and looking back, "it would have been easier to pledge Beta and avoid the whole issue. At the time, it seemed overwhelming."

"We knew when we pledged him it was going to be an issue" remembers Gary Nicolaysen '61. "He was just a fine young man we thought would fit in with the rest of the fraternity."

Despite the national position approved by the convention in 1960, there was still a lot of resistance to the pledging of non-white students.

"The house met with Denny to see what he wanted to do," Jim said. "We told him we really wanted him in the house and we didn't want him to think he was just being used as a pawn in a political ploy."

"We told him if he wanted to drop, we would support that," Jim remembers, "and we warned him it wasn't going to be easy. We talked to him several times and each time he insisted he wanted to continue."

"I appreciated the stance the chapter took," recalled Denny.

Normally, the house held an open vote on pledges, but opted this time to do secret votes to get a true feeling of where the house stood.

There is a note of pride when Jim said that all three separate votes were unanimous.

As a chapter, the house decided to come up with a plan to promote the official change in racial attitudes at the national convention in Denver that summer. It was decided that direct contact with the other chapters was the best option.

"I dropped out of school for spring quarter," Jim said, "the house came up with \$200 for expenses, and I headed east."

Jim's first stop was in Tulsa, Oklahoma to meet with Joe C. Scott (*Oklahoma State, Gamma Chi '39*), the Fraternity's national president at the time.

"He was as gracious as you can imagine," Jim said, "We discussed what our position was and why, and he even gave me a big Rand McNally Road Atlas with all the chapter houses identified."

Back in Utah, the house devised a telephone campaign to the various chapters around the country to drum up support to promote the change in national attitude at the 1964 Convention in Denver.

At the convention, a chapter-initiated resolution was passed, opening the door for all qualified young men to belong to the Fraternity, while leaving it up to each chapter to determine who that might be.

"I think everyone can look back and say 'we did the right thing'," Denny said. "They made it work."

Jim returned to the U to complete his degree in political science with an eye toward law school.

He sent a few applications to some out of state schools, including Harvard, but didn't think he had much of a chance. He was shocked when he was accepted to Harvard Law School in 1966.

Alpha Tau brother Rod Decker '60 agreed. "I'm sure it was something the Harvard acceptance committee had to consider when someone who helped break the color line wants to come to your school."

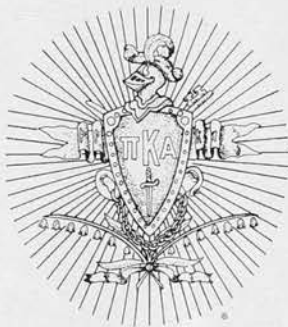
Jim Cannon graduated from Harvard Law School in 1969 and after 10 years in New England, practices business law in Salt Lake City.

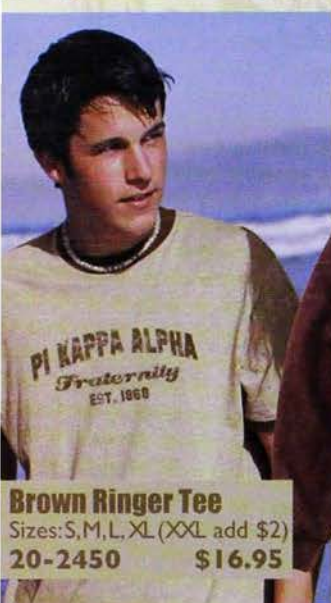

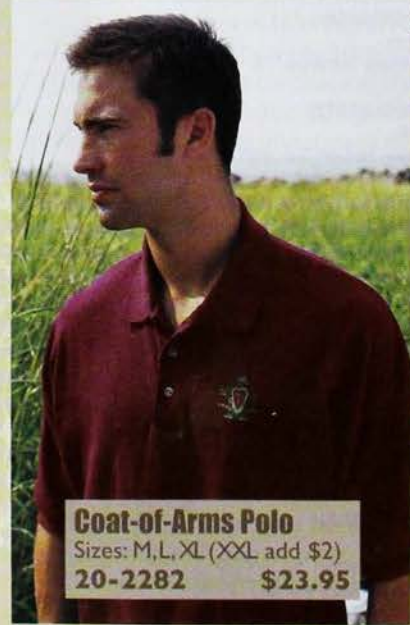

The Year in Review

This past year has been one of reflection and planning for Pi Kappa Alpha. The Fraternity's Strategic Plan was unveiled at the 2004 Chapter Presidents Conference. This plan, which incorporated the input of all arms of the Fraternity, sets Pi Kappa Alpha's course for the 21st Century. In it, we are aggressively committing to the continued growth and excellence of Pi Kappa Alpha, consistent with our mission, vision and creed.

We are also encouraged by what we see to be a continuing upward trend in overall fraternity membership, and in Pi Kappa Alpha in particular. Our impressive recruitment results over the past year should keep Pi Kappa Alpha on top in terms of average pledgings and initiations per chapter – one of the best measurements of overall fraternity strength.

Leadership Programs

History was made this past year in the launch of Pi Kappa Alpha's new leadership program, Pike University. Pike University was created with a goal of providing superior educational programs and support to Pike members, chapters and volunteers, and advancing Pi Kappa Alpha through the delivery and inculcation of the Fraternity's mission, vision and creed. Overall, this ambitious undertaking was a terrific success.

In its inaugural year, more than 1,300 undergraduates from nearly 90% of Pi Kappa Alpha's chapters and colonies participated in at least one of eight Pike University events. Total Pike University attendance was 1,704. This total includes more than 1,000 participants in the new Leadership Summits, 350 attendees at the Officers Leadership Academy and a record-setting crowd of 300 at the Chapter Presidents Conference & Rush Summit.

Feedback from undergraduate participants was especially strong. 94% of attendees rated their chapters' perception of Pike University as positive, and 83% responded that the Pike University events were significant improvements from events in previous years.

International Education Advisor Mike Hayes (*Theta Omicron, Indiana State '82*), assisted by former staff member Mark Dziatczak (*Delta Nu, Wayne State '91*), Great Lakes Regional President Kevin Virta (*Epsilon Psi, Western Michigan '83*), and Educational Advisory Committeeman Pat Haun (*Delta Omega, High Point '89*) were the primary engineers of Pike University's curriculum strategy, and selflessly traveled across the country serving as the backbone of this year's faculty. The Fraternity is blessed with an outstanding cadre of alumni volunteers, and Pike University could not have been successful without their time and talents. Thanks to all those alumni who served as faculty this past year.

Chapter Services

The services department continued its support of Pike chapters, members and advisors throughout the past year. The department is charged with meeting the growing needs of Pike chapters by developing innovative chapter programming and leadership training while providing effective consulting services to our members.

With six consultants servicing Pike chapters this past year, the Fraternity made 234 visits to 207 chapters across North America. We were also able to conduct 33 developmental visits to chapters that requested additional assistance from the Memorial Headquarters Staff.

Eight new consultants joined the Memorial Headquarters Staff this summer and the Fraternity is excited to build upon the successes of the past year. Please feel free to contact your consultant or the director of services with any questions.

Recruitment

Pi Kappa Alpha continues to be a recruitment leadership amongst North American fraternities. Recording nearly a 9% increase in pledges and an 8% increase in initiates this last year, Pi Kappa Alpha is witnessing its highest growth numbers in 15 years. A restructuring of the recruitment department during the 2003-04 academic year, led by Recruitment Officer Ryan Flickinger (*Southern Illinois, Iota Mu '94*), resulted in two expansion consultants and one recruitment consultant. This allowed Pi Kappa Alpha to focus its resources on improving the recruitment performance of our existing chapters and colonies as well as expanding to new campuses across the country.

Pi Kappa Alpha continues to be aggressive in its expansion efforts with four projects scheduled for the fall and another two confirmed for the following spring. Included in those plans are colonizations at Indiana University (*Delta Xi*), Boston University, University of Texas-Arlington (*Eta Upsilon*), and Rogers State University in Claremore, Oklahoma.

The recruitment department continues to work with area chapters, alumni, universities and existing colonies in an effort to add strong chapters to our existing ranks as well as increase the overall size and influence of Pi Kappa Alpha and our chapters. Former Director of Expansion Burke Smith (*Alberta, Lambda Epsilon '00*) has assumed the position of director of recruitment and will work closely with the rest of the Fraternity staff to ensure that Pi Kappa Alpha continues to be the recruitment and expansion leader of the fraternity world.

Real Estate

Housing is one of the major components of the Fraternity's Overall Strategic Plan; and as such the Housing Commission and Real Estate Department are charged to "enhance the competitiveness, condition, and management of the organization's housing stock in a manner that draws alumni and undergraduates together in furtherance of the organization's mission."

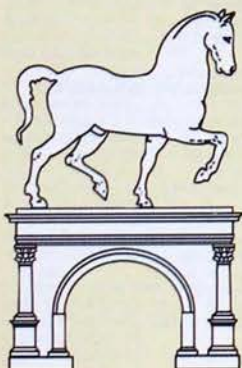
Chapters and house corporations own or otherwise occupy some form of real estate at 170 locations throughout the United States and Canada. It is important that these assets be managed in a manner that enhances the image of the Fraternity and grows the equity for the benefit of both current and future generations.

Our overall loan program, through the Chapter House Fund, is still the most tangible program we administer, making loans typically in the range of \$25,000 to \$250,000. In the last two years, the Housing Commission committed, modified, or refinanced loans to house corporations consisting of over \$1.6 million in new money, of which \$633,304 was done in this last fiscal year. One of our more recent lending vehicles is the capital campaign loan program, which provides seed money to hire a qualified professional fund raising service. This converts a relatively small loan into a large amount of capital being raised – for example, this year at Alpha Omega Chapter at Kansas State University, our initial \$20,000 loan ended up generating over \$850,000 in alumni donations for the renovation of their beautiful chapter house. New this year is a loan program that is a component of our recently adopted "Life Safety Programs", through which we provide low interest loans for the installation of certain life safety equipment like fire sprinklers and hardwired smoke and fire alert systems.

The group property insurance program now has 65 participating locations, representing over \$63 million in total coverage. The purchasing power of the group has saved house corporations thousands of dollars, while providing a comprehensive set of coverages that is far superior to what could be obtained on an individual basis.

Since its creation in 1997, International Work Day has grown more each year and has become an annual tradition for many chapters. This synergistic program combines real estate improvement projects with an alumni and parent relations event. This last year was the biggest ever with 95 chapters participating, involving 3,962 people conducting 490 individual projects at an estimated value of \$279,864. In these first seven years, over 412 events have been hosted, with 15,217 students, parents, guests and alumni accomplishing 1,753 individual projects, totaling an estimated \$1,026,705 in improvements. Through our various electronic vehicles, such as the vast array of information available at the real estate portion of the Fraternity's website, the electronic monthly newsletter "The Pike House Link", and a new program titled "PILLARS OF SUCCESS" which facilitates both goal setting and the attainment of those goals, we are developing better ways to communicate with and assist groups in achieving their real estate dreams.



WHITE HORSE HOLDING CORPORATION

The White Horse Holding Corporation holds title to real estate on behalf of the Fraternity. Through the Holding Corporation and two other local house corporations, over which the Housing Commission has governing control, the Commission and the Real Estate Department now oversee the management of ten properties.

Communications

The Fraternity's official web site is continually updated and revised, providing Pi Kappa Alpha's public with the latest in Fraternity news and resources. The web site, www.pikes.org, is the primary source of Fraternity information for many undergraduates and alumni.

The Fraternity's monthly publication, the *Forum*, is distributed entirely via email, allowing the Fraternity to send a copy of the *Forum* to each pledge, member, alumnus and Greek advisor/dean of students who has provided the Memorial Headquarters with a valid email address. Each edition of the *Forum* also remains archived for one year on the Fraternity's web site.

An interim, soft-cover printing of the *Garnet & Gold*, produced during 2003-2004, provided chapters with an economical version of the Fraternity's reference manual. Plans are underway to reintroduce the traditional hard bound book beloved by members in the near future, with new and updated contents.

A new printing of the *Ritual* was published this year, incorporating all changes authorized by the 2000 Atlanta Convention, and adding historical notes on the ceremony's development.

The *Shield & Diamond* magazine, now in its 112th year of publication, continues as a leader among fraternity publications, and serves as the Fraternity's most effective and popular communication vehicle. This year, circulation increased nearly 7 percent with a total of 311,452 copies mailed to the Fraternity's readers. The *Shield & Diamond* also reaches a wider audience through its online version.

From the President of the Educational Foundation

Dear Brothers,

As I end my final term as a Trustee of the Educational Foundation after 13 years of service, I fondly reflect on all of its success over that time. Overall annual contributions have grown close to \$1 million from \$360,000 in 1991, and the Foundation's asset base from which it generates grants to support the Fraternity has grown to \$6 million. It has established endowments for the Fraternity's leadership programs – the largest of which, the endowment for the Chapter Executives Conference, generates \$25,000 every year to offset its costs.

Each chapter now has an endowment account it can use to help send its members to Pike University. In 1993, we launched the Oak Trust Society, through which loyal brothers have committed over \$10 million in estate gifts to the Foundation, and in 1994 we launched the φφκκ Club to get students in the habit of giving. Last year, 1,100 students joined. And last year, the Foundation launched its newest initiative, the President's Council, described on page 56.

Jeffrey Lorch Named Top Graduating Senior

Jeffrey Lorch (*Columbia, Iota Lambda '01*) says many students come to Columbia University, simply because they want to live in New York City. Jeff himself came there from France, where he graduated from high school. And he came to the Fraternity because he felt that Columbia's big city opportunities overshadowed its campus life.

Four years later, he came to the 2004 International Convention in St. Louis, where the Fraternity presented him the Robertson Most Outstanding Undergraduate Award.

"At Columbia, you had intelligent kids," he says, "but when you came down to it, sometimes their values and their interactions with other people were very artificial. Because it was a competitive environment, less emphasis was placed on respecting one another. More emphasis was placed on, 'I'll do whatever will get me ahead faster.'"

"[The Fraternity] offered us a place to form deep friendships based on things other than, 'What could give me an advantage,' he says. "Our moral compass was not defined by what was convenient."

He learned this early, when an illness while pledging kept him in the hospital intermittently for two months. "My Fraternity brothers visited me every day," he says. "And after I had a surgery, somebody was there constantly for six days straight."

Lorch served the chapter as an officer and helped form the chapter's first internal judicial board concerning member conduct.

He recalls a professor who said the purpose of college was not only to learn about concepts, but also to reinforce those concepts in outside activities. "Within the J-Board we had great debates regarding fairness, equality and justice," he says.

After a four-week business-school boot-camp at Dartmouth, Lorch entered a master's program at Harvard, through which he will continue his undergraduate exploration of Middle Eastern studies.

Lorch first got interested in the Middle East when an opportunity within his church led him to a refugee center in Rome, Italy, during the summer before his senior year in high school. Many of the refugees had fled the Mid-East and Balkan States.

During the summer before his college senior year, Lorch interned at the U.S. Embassy in Cairo, Egypt, where he worked on fraud detection and custody issues. He says he's interested both in a business career and in devoting a significant portion of his life to public service, when he completes the Harvard program.

In his award acceptance speech, Lorch said, "When they describe [namesake] Jenks [Robertson], they don't include qualities one would put on a resume – those that we too-often consider the measure of a man. They talk about his values."

The Robertson Award provides the Fraternity's top graduating senior with a \$2,500 scholarship to pursue graduate studies. Four finalists also received \$500 scholarships.

Finalist Cory Falcon (*Louisiana State, Alpha Gamma '00*) has been inducted into 11 honor societies and completed a two-week medical mission to Nicaragua.

Finalist Jason Hehl (*Old Dominion, Zeta Iota '02*) graduated *magna cum laude*. He is an Eagle Scout and previously served as a medic in the Army, including six months in Kosovo.

Finalist David Owens (*Washington, Beta Beta '01*) delayed standing offers of law school admission from both Harvard and Stanford to teach in a poor Los Angeles school district for two years.

The 1979 Outstanding Senior 25 Years Later

1979 Powers Award Winner Brad Anton (*Virginia Tech, Epsilon '75*) says he could hardly believe that he had won the award, but the check – then \$500 – came right when he needed it.

Anton, who came from a modest background, had to move himself on his Yamaha XS1100 motorcycle across the country to CalTech for graduate school, and he was out of funds until his research assistantship began.

With a 4.0 GPA, Anton was the top student in the Virginia Tech College of Engineering.

His ticket to Virginia Tech had been the co-op program, where he spent alternating semesters studying on campus and apprenticing for private companies. But, being only a half-timer in Blacksburg kept him from holding a chapter office – until his last year when he put together two consecutive semesters and served as chapter president.

In 1985 after he had earned his master's degree and Ph.D. from CalTech, Anton won a prestigious research fellowship in Germany, and since then, he has taught at Cornell University.

He teaches thermodynamics, reaction engineering and applied mathematics, and serves as co-advisor to the university's Formula SAE racing team (in which students build and race Formula 1-type cars), which recently won its eighth world championship in 18 years of competing.

Anton meets a group of his Epsilon Pike brothers every year for a golf-playing / old-lies-telling weekend, recently held at Pinehurst. He has been married for five years to his wife, Susan, and has a two-year-old son.

We give the scholarship to the torch bearers who will attend leadership training and who want to make a difference in Pi Kappa Alpha. We give the scholarship to members who would make the Eatherly Family proud.

Chad often said, "Build your hopes on things eternal, for they are the things that will never break." The men of Alpha Nu have built the hopes of our new members on Chad's legacy. They too can learn the meaning of leadership and the values that flowed so easily through his veins.

The Eatherly family and Alpha Nu brothers can rest easy knowing that Chad Eatherly will never be forgotten.

Tom Olsen, Pike University and How You Can Help Your Chapter

In March, Tom Olsen (Illinois, Beta Eta '02) attended his third Pike University event, and he received his official Pike University certification. During the most recent year he served as the chapter's President, and he attended the Officers Leadership Academy, the Chapter Executives Conference and the Chicago Leadership Summit.

Beta Eta Chapter has dramatically improved over the past few years. Five years ago, the chapter foundered with low membership, initiating only 18 men in 1998 and only 16 men in 1999. The house was in disrepair, and the boys were in hot water with university administration.

However, our Beta Eta brothers turned it around. In fact, the chapter won the Harvey T. Newell Award for the most improved chapter in 2002, and, Olsen now counts 140 men as his chapter brothers.

Olsen wasn't sure about fraternities in August 2001 when he arrived in Champaign, and he waited out on Fall Rush.

"The University of Illinois is a big school, and I wanted to settle in," he says. "Then, I realized that I wanted something more. The university can only give you one type of education."

He met some Pikes in his classes who invited him over to the chapter house, and he learned he shared similar interests and values with the members of Pi Kappa Alpha. And, we lucked out and got Olsen for the Spring 2002 pledge class at Beta Eta.

Pike University

At the August 2003 Officers Leadership Academy, the International Fraternity launched Pike University as its leadership education umbrella. The Fraternity had been hosting similar leadership events for years, but the Pike University initiative represented a paradigm shift.

Regional Leadership Summits feature two tracks, one on general leadership and personal motivation, rivaling a professional development seminar. The other track covers the nuts and bolts of management and general chapter operations. Even at this entry-level event, there are two distinct tracks with enough information to merit at least two years of attendance.

The other national leadership events build on the lessons of the Leadership Summits and teach our brothers advanced leadership skills. They also teach our broth-

ers the specific skills they need to be chapter presidents, treasurers and rush chairmen.

All these events are planned by the Fraternity's professional staff, and the lessons are delivered by a qualified stable of volunteers. The students are also exposed to some amazing speakers. At the latest Convention alone, the attendees heard spellbinding speeches from Jack Bowers, former senior executive at IBM; Owen Brown, startup president of Sun Microsystems; Chad Holliday, chairman and CEO of DuPont; Pete Sessions, U.S. Representative from Texas; and Jeff Taylor, founder of Monster.com.

Olsen says it's hard to leave an event without being enthusiastic about the Fraternity, and he prizes the leadership experience afforded him by the Fraternity.

"I've been able to learn so much more about how to deal with people, how to communicate and how to handle situations," he says. "I've probably gotten much more [out of the Fraternity] than I learned in school. [Being chapter president] has been a fun ride - one of the coolest things I've ever done."

That's what our organization is all about. Fortunately, you can help sharp young men like Tom Olsen learn about leadership, experience the full potential of their office and help their other Fraternity brothers realize the best possible Fraternity experience.

The Educational Foundation maintains endowment accounts for each chapter that it can use to send its members to Pike University events every year. Remembering My Son

My son Ryan turned out to be quite studious, athletic and friendly. He could be funny and witty, but he could also be quite serious. For example, when he was frustrated with a bad high school calculus teacher, he bought the *Calculus for Dummies* book. He earned an A.

By the time he was nine, he had set his sights on attending Florida State University. He was so serious that any grade short of an A seemed like a failure, and mostly he brought home A's.

He became part of the National Honor Society. He excelled at baseball and loved pole vaulting. (The pole vaulting scared the daylights out of me.)

On move-in day at FSU, the whole family roared to Tallahassee in two cars, but my daughter and I waited for an eternity for Ryan and his mom to arrive. When they finally arrived, Ryan got out of the car laughing.

"Dad, look what I got," he said. It was a speeding ticket. Ryan was looking forward to college life.

In his first term, Ryan pulled a 3.5 GPA and made the Dean's list. The re-colonizing Pike chapter had also extended him a bid to participate. He thought the fire truck imagery was cool.

But, on March 20, 2000, the future came to screeching stop. While playing softball, a thrown ball struck Ryan in the temple, and he was killed playing his favorite sport.

On February 17, 2001, the Fraternity chartered the FSU colony as the revived Delta Lambda Chapter, and Ryan and I were initiated together in a special ceremony. I will never forget the camaraderie that was displayed that morning, and I appreciate all the men who took part in it.

On March 5, 2004, FSU named Ryan as an honorary alumnus in special ceremony, where we also named Joel Medgebow as the first recipient of the Ryan L'Homme Delta Lambda Memorial Scholarship.

When you lose a child there is no closure – just the long, life sentence of dealing with grief and missing out on what the child would have made of himself. Ryan's last dream was to become an astronaut. My way of dealing with the loss is to talk about Ryan, the Pikes and losing a child.

total. The students can use the grant to cover tuition, travel and lodging expenses at qualified Pike University events.

The remainder of the funds in the account, all additional earnings and new gifts will remain as principal so that the grant will be available every year and so that it will have the potential to grow with inflation.

However, please remember that the \$10,000 mark is just the starting line. As the endowment grows with future gifts, the grants will increase in impact, and more and more brothers, like Tom Olsen, will be exposed to leadership training, without having to take money out of their pockets.

"These events are a real revelation," he says. "You see these successful men come back to share their experiences. It shows how much it means to them. That's been the most incredible thing. It left me with a sense of awe. You hear, 'Once a Pike, Always a Pike,' but here you actually see it."

Please help other young men see it, too.

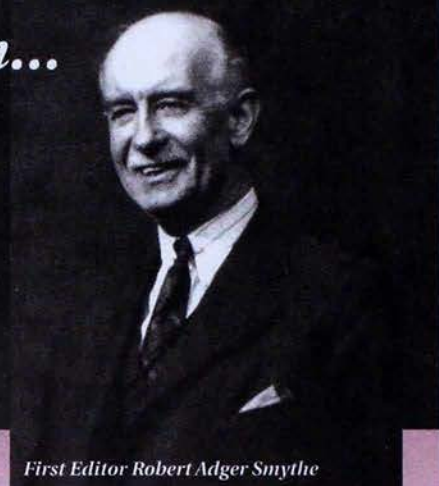

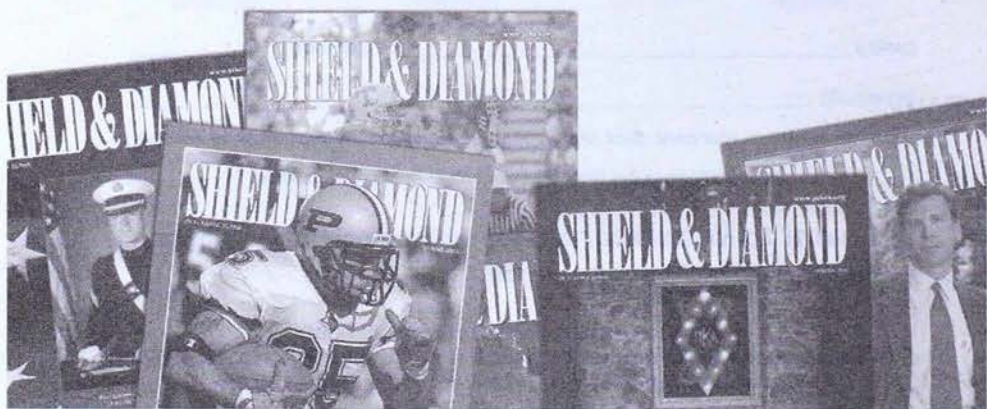
