

The Secret of Success? Dare to Fail

I am a failure. What's more, I'm proud of it. In fact, I believe that whatever success I may have achieved in my life I owe to my failures. Confused? I don't blame you.

As the father of a college freshman and a high school junior, I am painfully aware that my generation has

done yours a great disservice. We have put unprecedented pressure on you to succeed at a young age. What's worse, we have instilled in you a great fear of failure. I went off to college not even knowing what I wanted to study; you were expected to have resumes packed with impressive achievements before even applying to college. Most colleges add to the pressure, emphasizing the need for top grades and extracurricular activities in order to ensure the most lucrative employment after graduation. The clear lesson is that your job defines your success.

Your Fraternity wants you to succeed as well, but we challenge that one-dimensional definition. Our careers are important, but there must be more to life than our jobs, and much more to our jobs than how much we get paid. The Fraternity also discourages fear of failure, embracing failure as the best way to learn and grow.

So let us begin by defining what success is, and what it is not. The media bombards us with the notion that success is all about money and prestige. Athletes are paid obscene salaries and worshiped as role models despite widespread use of illegal drugs and disturbing levels of domestic violence. Musicians are paid and idolized even more, as they rack up a seemingly endless succession of failed marriages, criminal misconduct and substance abuse. The problem with the media's definition of success is that it is based on the opinions of others. New York Times columnist Anna Quinden points out the fatal flaw in that approach: "If success is not on your own terms, if it looks good to the world but does not feel good in your heart, it is not success at all." Maybe that's why so many athletes and celebrities turn to drugs in the first place.

My wife and I have tried to teach our daughters a different definition of success. We have encouraged them to search for their great passion in life and pursue it with everything they've got. Albert Schweitzer, the Nobel Peace Prize winning philosopher and explorer, said, "Success is not the key to happiness. Happiness is the key to success. If you love what you are doing, you will be successful." Pulitzer Prize winning historian, David McCullough, author of an excellent biography of my hero, John Adams, agrees. He said, "Real success is finding your lifework in the work that

you love." So if you want to win a Nobel or Pulitzer Prize, find something you love and pursue it with all your heart.

It's the second part - pursuing your passion with all your heart - that brings us to failure. How you deal with failure will determine whether you will succeed. Will fear of failure prevent you from confronting life's challenges or will it drive you to try harder? Robert Kennedy once observed that "Only those who dare to fail greatly will ever achieve greatly." When you do fail - and you will fail - will you be discouraged and quit or will you try harder? Winston Churchill, whose indomitable spirit inspired England to victory in World War II against overwhelming odds, argued that, "Success is the ability to go from one failure to another with no loss of enthusiasm." Will you learn from your mistakes or keep repeating them? Our brother and President's Council member, Dr. Stephen Covey, teaches: "When you make a mistake, admit it. Correct it. Learn from it. Immediately."

Pi Kappa Alpha is dedicated to helping you succeed. The True Pike ideal and Pike University programming are designed to help you explore your values, discover your passions and acquire the tools you need to pursue them. In the laboratory of your chapter, you can dare to follow your dreams, knowing that your brothers are there to support you and help you learn from your mistakes. The thing that inspires me to keep working with undergrads over 35 years after my own initiation is the Fraternity's incomparable ability to inspire men like you to take on tasks that you know are impossible. When you succeed - and you will succeed -- you will lose forever your fear of failure and be well along the path to success.

I said at the start that I am proud of my failures. Let me explain. If I had not almost failed seventh grade, I might not have learned the study habits that served me well throughout my academic career. A bad performance review in my first job made me realize that I needed to leave the law firm to pursue my dream of doing international work, a decision that led me to a wonderfully fulfilling and rewarding career. Most importantly, the lessons I learned in many unsuccessful relationships enabled me to achieve the greatest success of my life – my almost 20-year marriage to my wife, Ellen. All of these dreams once appeared impossible.

So, brothers, let me conclude by wishing you lives that are rich in true success – and many wonderful failures.


Pike University's 2007 Summer Highlight Recognizes Unprecedented Success

A t the 2003 Officers
Leadership Academy, Pi
Kappa Alpha unveiled its vision
for the future of leadership
programming, Pike University.
Four years later, what started
out as a revolutionary idea
has become the envy of the
fraternity world. On July 26,
2007, over 300 Pi Kappa Alpha
undergraduates found out why.

As undergraduates began pouring through the doors on Thursday, July 26, you could feel the energy mounting at Whispering Woods Conference Center in Olive Branch, Mississippi. Some undergraduates had been driving straight for 21 hours. Others were just arriving in shuttles from the airport. Despite their long travels, no one seemed tired. Seasoned Pike University veterans and first timers alike were alive with anticipation. They had made it. They were at the 2007 Academy.

Right out of the gate it became clear to everyone that this was to be an event for the record books. At the first session, after a rousing speech by International president Kevin G. Knaus (Kansas State, Alpha Omega '82), over 60 chapters were recognized and given awards

for excellence in individual aspects of programming. Chapter after chapter got up from their seats to collect their hardware at the front of the room. First Theta chapter, then Nu, and with each chapter called, the remaining men inched closer to the edges of their seats, hoping their chapters would be called next. To close the first awards ceremony, Executive Director Justin Buck (Southeast Missouri State, Epsilon Iota '96) challenged the chapters that didn't win awards to seek out those who had, and learn from their success.

That night after dinner, during the first general session, Finance and Insurance Officer J.R. Parsons (Wyoming, Iota Alpha '01) set the tone with a presentation on New Member Education. Next, undergraduates met their new chapter consultants. The last event of the evening, a breakout session, followed.

Each breakout session gave attendees a chance to choose from a variety of topics. In this case, the choices were recruitment, continuing education and alumni relations. Immediately upon stepping into the recruitment break out session, it was easy to predict that it would be a favorite of the undergraduates. In his standing room only sessions, Director of Growth and Marketing Tom Olsen (Illinois,

Beta Eta '02') kept his listeners energized and entranced as he passionately challenged them to take recruitment in their chapters to the next level, and then outlined the skills to do so. One of the attendees, Joshua Nichols (Wyoming, Iota Alpha '05), said that after Olsen's presentation, he understood where his chapter should be headed for recruitment, and felt empowered to take it there.

The next morning started bright and early with breakfast at 8 a.m. The rest of the day was packed with programming covering all facets of fraternal operations. Olsen gave another inspiring presentation on recruitment, while Parsons did the same for finances, and

Buck on judicial hearings. Other topics covered throughout the day included conflict resolution, public relations, and a session on how to determine your leadership style. In the 15-minute time slot between sessions, undergraduates and staff were usually seen in small groups discussing the presentations, or sharing ideas for programming with each other. After witnessing one such enclave, Parsons remarked, "The quality of the

at these Pike University events reaffirms my belief that Pi Kappa Alpha is, and will continue to be, the preeminent fraternity in North America".

Friday afternoon featured the Excellence Awards presentation. First up were the Real Estate awards, then Educational Foundation awards, followed by individual awards for Pike University attendance. As Director of Pike University Rick Burt (North Georgia College, Psi '00) finished recapping this year's True Pike Challenge, Buck came to the podium to announce the names of those chapters that for the next year would be able to refer to themselves as "Excellence Chapters". The 43 jet black obelisks that lined the head table not only stood testament to each chapter's hard work, but more important, it meant that they were still in

the running for the most coveted award: the Smythe.

While much of the time at the Academy is spent on business, there are plenty of opportunities to have fun. One event that continues to grow in popularity year in and year out is the community service project. This year, 18 undergraduates and several staff members took the afternoon off from the conference, and dedicated their time to the Ronald McDonald House. Project Coordinator Sandra Newsom said, "This year there was so much interest that we literally had to turn people away. All 18 participants sent in requests to do the project before it was even announced publicly."

After the community service projects, all staff and Academy participants took busses to downtown Memphis for a Redbirds baseball game and to enjoy the evening. At the game, Pikes made their presence known. Everyone was wearing letters, and Pikes took up an entire section. Supreme Council members and newly initiated alike cheered for the Memphis team and enjoyed the game.

2007 Judge Elbert P. Tuttle Distinguished Achievement Award

Congressman Pete Sessions (Southwestern, Alpha Omicron '76)

As a Pike, a community leader, and a public servant, United States Congressman Pete Sessions has been selected by Pi Kappa Alpha as the 2007 Distinguished Achievement Award recipient.

Pete Sessions entered the Greek system in 1976, joining the Alpha Omicron Chapter of Pi Kappa Alpha as a result of its unparalleled academic, community, and leadership development opportunities for men at Southwestern University in Georgetown, Texas. In addition to serving as rush cochairman, Pete Sessions joined his Fraternity brothers in making Alpha Omicron the top chapter on campus.

After graduating from Southwestern
University in 1978, Congressman Sessions
worked for then-Southwestern Bell
Telephone Company for 16 years, serving at
the internationally renowned Bell Labs in New
Jersey and as district manager for marketing
in Dallas. As a businessman, he served as
chairman of the Northeast Dallas Chamber of
Commerce.

Thanks to his private sector experience,
Congressman Sessions understands the need
to fight bureaucracy and to utilize marketdriven solutions to solve problems effectively
in our communities and in government. First
elected to Congress in 1996, Congressman
Sessions was re-elected to the House for a sixth
term in 2006, representing Texas' thirty-second
Congressional District.

In 2007, Congressman Sessions began his ninth year as a member of the House Rules Committee, which serves as the gatekeeper for legislation that will be considered by the House of Representatives. House Republican Leadership selected him to serve on this committee based on his commitment to conservative principles, the United States military, and the free enterprise system.

Pete Sessions is a leader in Congress on issues affecting fraternities and sororities across America. Since 2004, Congressman

Sessions has served as co-chair of the Congressional Fraternal Caucus, which was established to encourage dialogue and legislative solutions to ensure that fraternities and sororities continue to have a vibrant presence on college campuses throughout the country.

More specifically, the Caucus supports initiatives to:

- Reform federal tax law to encourage charitable contributions to sustain not-forprofit student housing
- Improve student safety and housing
- Protect freedom of association rights of students
- Fight hazing and substance abuse on campus
- Support improved funding for student loans and other financial aid
- Educate Congress and the executive branch about the key role fraternities and sororities play in student life

With over 150 Greek members in Congress, the Greek system has long served as valuable training grounds for America's future leaders. Consequently, the Caucus works to ensure that fraternities and sororities can continue to provide invaluable opportunities to students, particularly in the areas of personal and professional development, charitable activities, and the development of leadership skills.

Congressman Sessions' work has earned him accolades locally and nationally. He is one of only three members of Congress to have ever received the North-American Interfraternity Conference Silver Medal. Congressman Sessions has also received the North-American Interfraternity Conference Award of Distinction.

He is a ten-time recipient of the Spirit of Enterprise Award from the U.S. Chamber of Commerce. Other awards include the U.S. Oncology Medal of Honor Award, the Wireless Industry Achievement Award, and the National Distinguished Eagle Scout Award. Congressman Sessions has also received an Honorary Doctorate from Dallas Baptist University.

Congressman Sessions continues to be active in his community, where he is an honorary East Dallas Rotarian and an Adopt-A-Shoreline Team Leader volunteer in the effort to maintain and conserve White Rock Lake in Dallas. He currently serves on the Board of Trustees at Southwestern University and as advisor to the president of Special Olympics Texas. Congressman Sessions is also a member of the executive board of the Circle Ten Council of the Boy Scouts of America.

Pete Sessions, his wife, Nete, and their two sons, Bill (18) and Alex (13), reside in Dallas, Texas.

As the conference progressed, it picked up momentum and Saturday was the busiest day of all. After a full day of sessions, International Historian Dr. Jerome V. Reel (*Tulane, Eta '57*), a Pike University icon, gave a presentation on the history of the Pi Kappa Alpha ritual in the way that only he can. Another Pike U favorite, Darius Sidebotham (*Florida Tech, Zeta Sigma '94*), finished off the educational portion of the conference with an in-your-face motivational presentation on recruitment.

Saturday night was the culminating event anticipated by everyone, the International Awards Banquet. When all was said and done, just under 400 undergraduates, alumni, and staff packed the banquet room. The Distinguished Achievement Award recipient, Congressman Pete Sessions (Southwestern, Alpha Omicron '76), got the party started when he showed up minutes before the banquet began with an entourage of Pikes from his chapter in tow. His speech that night was both motivational and touching.

Perhaps the most moving speech of the evening was made by Fred Cook (Virginia Tech, Epsilon '04) who recounted the shootings that took place at Virginia Tech on April 16, 2007, during which he was forced to jump from a second story window to escape the gunman. With uncanny composure he recounted the events of that day, and then told the story of how Pi Kappa Alpha brothers had been there for him in his time of need. His active brothers and the chapter alumni had rallied together in support of the campus, and each other. Epsilon Chapter had an alumni event planned for the weekend after the shootings, which Cook had considered cancelling. When he brought it up, the message he heard from his alumni was strong and without hesitation, "We need to come together now more than ever."

The rest of the evening featured a star studded cast. Justin Ptacnik (Nebraska-Omaha, Delta Chi '03) received the Robertson Award for Most Outstanding Undergraduate (see story on page 53). Congressman Sessions was the recipient of the Distinguished Achievement Award. The Loyalty Award was presented to Tommy Turner (Texas Tech, Epsilon Gamma '67) who was the only one at the head table, including his wife, who didn't know that he was going to receive it. In fact, he had come to the banquet with a speech prepared, thinking that he would

be presenting the award to someone else. Colorado State University and Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute brought home the Harvey T. Newell Award for Most Improved Chapters. Indiana University, Rogers State University and Clemson were called up to the stage to receive charters on behalf of their former colonies.

Finally, as the new chapters walked off the stage with their charters in hand, the lights began to dim, and the room was instantly silent. Chapters waited with baited breath as Executive Director Buck read off the names of the Smythe winners one by one. Seventeen chapters were awarded Pi Kappa Alpha's highest honor, the Robert Adger Smythe Award.

Combined, these chapters had raised over \$300,000 for philanthropy, worked over 80,000 hours for community service, and almost all of them were first on their campus in size and recruitment. In closing, International President Knaus and Executive Director Buck challenged the undergraduates to take their respective chapters to the next level. Leaving this year's Academy, the undergraduates came away better educated and inspired to meet that challenge.

The True Pike Challenge

uring the week of June 17, 2007, the second annual True Pike Challenge took place at the Boulder Outdoor Survival School (BOSS) in Boulder, Utah. Twenty brothers had been selected to participate in Pike University's outdoor leadership experience. Much like their predecessors, the 2007 True Pike Challenge delegates possessed little knowledge of the rough terrain they would travel. Yet these men sought to explore a unique outdoor leadership experience in which they tested their fraternal commitment and the True Pike membership standard.

These Pikes underwent one week of ultra-light travel through the mesas and canyons of southern Utah, mostly with nothing more

than a blanket, poncho and knife. Some of the skills they acquired included the ability to navigate the desert with minimal technology, construct a shelter, and identify desert ecology. Along the way, these men had to push themselves to the limit both physically and mentally in order to accomplish their task. The goal of BOSS is to take a person from a world of convenience and comfort and put him in a situation where he must go 'just a little bit further' – past the false limits the mind has set for the body. gained the necessary skills to adapt to the constant changes. The trip to the desert proved to be challenging in a different way for each of the gentlemen chosen. Here are some of their stories:

Yesterday was a very challenging day. I woke up with only eight ounces of water left, which didn't last very long in the desert sun. My water was gone pretty quick and I had no idea when we were going to find more. I have no idea how long or how far we hiked in the morning, but if I had to guess I would say

about five hours. With my water gone in the first two hours, the hike we made was very challenging. I quickly became dehydrated and was using all my energy just to keep up. After a few hours of no water, we finally found some around noon. We sat near the water, in the shade, for the next two hours because it was too hot to keep hiking. After it started to cool down we started hiking again. The morning was the hardest, climbing up to the top of Boulder Mountain.

So far the True Pike Challenge has been a very unique adventure and has been one of the most physically and mentally challenging things I have ever done. I have had to overcome many difficult situations and need the drive to continue to the next. We have walked through the desert, canyons, and mountains, have eaten very little, run out of water multiple times, and slept outside on the ground. We have been hiking so much that most people have blisters on their feet, I have five.

I have not slept well any of the nights; it is very cold and uncomfortable.

The Red Castle

From a wealthy man's palace to a convent, this legendary house was once home to Gamma Eta Chapter at the University of Southern California. The Pikes who lived there call themselves "The Red Castle Gang", and although they occupied the residence for only eight years, it left an indelible mark on them and subsequent PiKA's who have stood in its majestic presence.



This 30-room mansion at 2421 S. Figueroa Street was clearly intended to be a place of prominence, built in 1893 by lumber baron Thomas Douglas Stimson at the then cost of \$130,000. According to a book titled The Stimson Legacy, Architecture in the Urban West by Lawrence Kreisman, T.D. Stimson was a self-made multi-millionaire. He started out in the lumber and millwork business in northern Michigan and eventually settled in Chicago, where he expanded his empire. Stimson moved to California with the intent of retiring in a more temperate climate, and continued to diversify his investments - ultimately becoming a banker, developer and capitalist with extensive ventures in the Chicago, Los Angeles, and Seattle areas. The family's nationwide philanthropic support persists today through the Stimson Miller Foundation based in Portland, Oregon. The Stimson Lumber Company has also



continued operation, primarily in the northwest United States.

The neighborhood on Figueroa Street became known as "Millionaires Row" in the 1890s, a title that did not



survive the evolution of the area. The neighborhood, along with the USC campus, was connected to downtown Los Angeles in 1890 by a horse drawn street car which was converted to electric in 1900. The massive masonry house was a stark contrast to the wood frame houses which dominated the neighborhood at that time. Although a bit eclectic, the architecture is predominately Richardsonian-Romanesque, which typically includes rough finished stone masonry exterior walls, with rows of windows (either arched or rectangular in shape), and an overall fortress-like quality. Clearly influenced by Stimson's roots, the Richardsonian style was more commonly found in the upper Midwest at the time. The four-story Gothic tower is this house's most prominent characteristic. A third floor balcony sits beneath a gabled arch, and another stepped gable contains a Palladian window. A porch with carved stone columns encircles the first floor. While the red sandstone exterior may seem ironic for a lumberman, the interior is smothered in a large variety of woods within its inlaid floors, paneled walls,


elaborate trim, crown molding, and wood beamed ceilings. Each room on the first floor is finished in a different wood and the doors are two sided to match the wood in the room on each side. Other details include stained glass windows along the main stairway, marble fireplaces, engraved door hinges, and unique cabinetry. The basement contains a wine cellar and a labyrinth of rooms with arched doorways.

The grandeur of the house

has attracted Hollywood over the years. It has been a setting for, among other things, television commercials, the movies "House II" and "After Midnight", two mini-series, "Testimony of Two Men" and "Captains and Kings," and an episode of "The Bionic Woman" entitled "Black Magic," which featured the late Vincent Price. Price liked the spookiness of the house's acoustics so much he returned later to record some productions of his own.



The Red Castle changed hands numerous times during its history. T.D. Stimson died in 1898 and his wife Achsah followed in 1904. A civil engineer by the name of Alfred Solano, the adopted son and business partner of the prominent City Surveyor of Los Angeles George C. Hansen, owned it from 1907 to 1918 when Beer Meister Edward Maier, of the Maier Brewing Company, bought the house. Following Maier's death, the Pikes purchased the home in the summer of 1940 for \$20,000. Prior to the Castle, the Pikes had rented two different houses since their 1926 chartering, this was the first house purchased by Gamma Eta Chapter. Correspondence from the era indicates the chapter was getting a bit overwhelmed by the cost of maintaining such a building, and the location was admittedly far from campus and isolated from other Greeks. Therefore, when the sale price of \$75,000 was agreed upon with a wealthy neighbor in 1948, it was too difficult to turn down. The Pikes then immediately purchased a house at 707 W. 28th Street in the "heart of the USC fraternity row". It is believed that this neighbor who bought The Red Castle, Carrie Estelle Doheny, widow of the oil magnate Edward L. Doheny, was tired of the Fraternity's noisy parties and thus created a permanent solution: Buy the house at a price they can't refuse and then give it to a convent. Mrs. Doheny



campus. The Sisters of St. Joseph of Carondelet had founded Mount St. Mary's College in 1925 in the hills of Brentwood; other than a period of time when the Doheny campus needed the house for a women's dorm, The Red Castle is still occupied by some of the Sisters today.



The Stimson House, as it is publicly known, has been featured in local news articles and is frequently referenced in commentary of LA history. In 1996, the Sisters graciously allowed the "Red Castle Gang" to have a 50-year reunion at the house, which was covered by the Los Angeles Times. A number of Pike stories were shared in the ensuing article. During the 1994 renovation, an old UCLA banner was discovered in the elevator shaft, which had been snatched and hidden there by the Red Castle Gang 50 years earlier. Pike alumnus Dev Leahy (Gamma Eta '44) admitted to the reporter that he was the one who knocked out a floor board by jumping on a pogo stick; one of many stories evidently included in a scrapbook about the house maintained by the nuns. Vince McDonough (Gamma

The past year was one which saw significant transition and continued success for Pi Kappa Alpha. Completing its first fiscal year under the new modernization structure allowed the Fraternity to identify other opportunities for

improved operational efficiency in the future. With a solid structure in place, the Fraternity will be primed to increase its focus on areas such as recruitment, quality, and overall chapter excellence.

The Memorial Headquarters Staff experienced its greatest turnover in several years with new people taking the helm as executive director, director of services, director of expansion, director of Pike University, director of chapter resources, and real estate assistant. These new faces helped bring a different perspective and renewed energy to the International Fraternity and to all of Pi Kappa Alpha.

The Supreme Council affirmed its commitment to the Fraternity's recruitment and expansion efforts, which permeated throughout the chapter ranks. As evidence of that commitment, the Fraternity saw an increase of 14% in initiations from the previous year, reaching its second highest level in the past ten years. Pike University programming was also stressed and attendance reached its highest level since the programs inception. Risk awareness and insurance continue to be significant issues for the fraternal movement and the Supreme Council was considering major initiatives in those areas as the year came to a close. The following reports provide detailed accomplishments and information in the operational areas of the international organization.

Leadership Programs

Pike University celebrates another successful year of providing superior educational programming for the members of Pi Kappa Alpha Fraternity.

Snapshots of Chapter Health — A Directory of Chapters and Colonies begins on page 26.

A total of almost 2,200 undergraduates attended at least one of the ten Pike University events in 2006-2007.

The year began with the International Convention in Orlando, Florida, where nearly 650 alumni, student leaders, volunteers and guests convened for the Convention. One of the main items of legislation adopted related to how the Fraternity protects its name, symbols, trademarks, insignias, and promotional materials.

There was a 21% increase in attendance at Pike University Leadership Summits during 2006-2007. More than 1,300 undergraduates participated in one of the seven Summits, targeted for Pi Kappa Alpha's newest members. The Summits were held in Atlanta, Dallas, Chicago, Philadelphia, Kansas City, Costa Mesa, and Seattle. The alumni receptions held in conjunction with the Summits were also well-liked as more than 300 alumni attended.

A record total attendance of 405 undergraduate chapter presidents, recruitment chairmen and chapter treasurers attended the annual Chapter Executives Conference, held in Memphis, Tennessee. This represents a remarkable attendance adjustment since the event was reorganized in 2005 to include the chapter treasurers. The expanded programming of this event was first-class and provided chapter leaders with a complete set of tools and knowledge for great success!

The third Volunteer Forum was held April 13-15 in Memphis, Tennessee. More than 60 alumni volunteers participated in this biennial event. Plans have already begun for the 2009 Volunteer Forum.

The second annual True Pike Challenge was a great success! Eighteen Pike University certified undergraduates wrestled the unknown terrain and elements of Southern Utah for life learning experiences of primitive living. This seven day outdoor leadership event was made possible through the support and generosity of individual alumni sponsors and the Pi Kappa Alpha Fraternity.

Pike University also witnessed a monumental use of the Pike University Scholarship Program during the past year. More than \$75,000 was awarded to undergraduates to help offset the cost of attendance at Pike University events in 2006-2007.

Lastly, because of the time and talents highly experienced and professional corps of volunteers, the Fraternity is thriving and Pike University continues to be successful. A special thanks to all those who served this past year as faculty at the

many events, specifically the International Educational and Recruitment Advisors: Shad Williams (Oklahoma State, Gamma Chi '90), J.J. Arnold (Indiana State, Theta Omicron '96), Mike Hayes (Indiana State. Theta Omicron '82), Darius Sidebotham (Florida Tech, Zeta Sigma '94) and Jared Averbuch (Michigan, Beta Tau'04).

Chapter Services

The International Fraternity's services department is charged with providing Pi Kappa Alpha's chapters with specific developmental support throughout the academic year. This support includes chapter consultant visits, developmental visits, and recruitment visits. In addition, the chapters can access sample handbooks and other valuable resources through the International Fraternity's website, www.pikes.org.

The 2006-2007 year brought several important changes to chapter resources. Many new initiatives were implemented, including a revised Consultant Visitation Summary that focused more detailed attention to the Cornerstones and recommended Fraternity programming.

The Cornerstones is a format in which chapter programming is divided into four areas: Membership, Operations, Brotherhood, and Leadership. Chapters receive a score at the end of a consultant visit depending on how their management practices align with this recommended format. Also, the consultants' visits were extended to provide additional support in all areas of chapter programming to ensure a fluid transition with the Cornerstones initiative.

Eight chapter consultants began traveling in August for tactical recruitment visits to chapters needing help in that area. A total of 26 recruitment visits were completed before the regular visit schedule commenced. The standard consultant visits this year were targeted towards providing recommendations and advice in the areas of membership education, recruitment, financial and real estate management, risk awareness, alumni relations, management strategies, and a continued emphasis on the best practices of overall chapter operation.

The services department is also responsible for assisting chapters as they deal with issues that demand more attention from the International Fraternity. Most of these visits focus on addressing behavioral concerns and mediating disputes with universities.

All chapters and alumni are encouraged to contact the services department to request any assistance in areas of chapter management and operations. The chapter consultants specifically, can provide the support needed in these areas.

Chapter Finances

The 2006-07 year marked a period of renewed financial responsibility for many chapters. In the wake of Hurricane Katrina, Eta Chapter at Tulane University retired a debt of nearly \$18,000 in less than seven months. Likewise, Epsilon Kappa Chapter at Lamar University converted a debt of nearly \$17,000 at the end of January into a \$1,100 credit balance by the close of the fiscal year. Mu Chapter at Presbyterian College achieved a zero balance for the first time in five years.

Expanded financial resources and a more consistent billing structure may be partially responsible for the positive trends demonstrated by chapters; however, the greatest factor remains the culture of financial responsibility established by chapter officers and members. Chapters that have made individual and collective financial responsibility a priority continue to find themselves among the most successful chapters in Pi Kappa Alpha, compiling award after award.

In the upcoming year, there will be additional resources available to all members. The new chapter dashboard function (http://dashboard.pikes.org) will allow undergraduate members and alumni to view their chapter's aged balance online anytime. Online payment options are also being explored. The success of the 2006-07 year bodes well for Pi Kappa Alpha, which remains the most efficient fraternity among all of its competitors in terms of the overall cost for individual members.

Recruitment

Pi Kappa Alpha has long been recognized as a leader amongst all North American fraternities in the area of recruitment. Time tested philosophies and techniques, combined with excellent

education and training emphasizing recruitment of the most best men on each campus, helped Pike chapters recruite 5,545 new members during the 2006-2007 academic year. This represents a 2% increase over the previous year. Even more exciting is the fact that Pike chapters initiated 4,534 of these young men into our brotherhood. Not only is that an 82% retention rate, but also a 15% increase over the 2005-2006 academic year and one of the highest initiation totals in recent memory. The recruitment success experienced by our chapters nationwide has contributed to Pi Kappa Alpha's ranking as the leader in average chapter/ colony size among all inter/national fraternities.

As quality growth is a constant focus of the Fraternity, six new colonies were established and three new chapters installed during 2006-2007. Pi Kappa Alpha will continue efforts towards aggressive growth with an anticipated minimum of six new colonizations during the 2007-2008 academic year.

The Recruitment Department continues to work with undergraduate members, alumni, universities, area chapters and existing colonies to support the addition of viable new chapters to our existing ranks and to increase the overall size, influence and prestige of Pi Kappa Alpha and our chapters.

Real Estate

In one form or another, "housing" has been a part of the social, college, fraternity experience since the mid 1800s. Housing types vary greatly from campus to campus. On some campuses, Greeks have no facilities of any kind; while a designated room in a university building is the standard on other campuses; and yet at some schools, buildings with self sufficient apartment style units are the norm in their Greek system. Of Pi Kappa Alpha's 204 active chapters, some form of identifiable Greek housing is a relevant issue on 160 (78%) of those campuses. However, history has taught us that having housing for the sake of

housing can also be a detriment. Having a facility and having great facility are two entirely different animals. The International Fraternity has developed a grading system that measures the quality of the Pike housing stock. Each facility is judged in three main areas:

- 1. Location
- Viability in the Student and Greek Housing Market
- 3. Curb Appeal

Various factors are considered within each category and more weight is placed upon issues believed to be more important. The competitive standing of housing in the entire fraternity system is believed to be generally mediocre, falling behind particularly in the area of keeping pace with the demands of the student housing market. However, Greek properties are usually blessed with one of the most difficult factors to correct - that of being well located. Converting the grading values to an academic 4.0 scale, on the 160 campuses where some form of housing is an issue, the Pike housing situations achieved a 2.63 overall grade point average. The "same store" analysis is graded at a 2.64 GPA, both of which are a slight improvement over the year before. Success in Greek housing is achieved in two primary parts:

- Acquiring competitive, quality housing where housing is a factor
- Effectively managing the housing in a manner that preserves and grows the equity while enhancing the organization's image in the community



An active expansion program brought three chapters into the fold of the Fraternity during 2006-2007. The services and programs of the Fraternity's real estate department are all focused on assisting chapters and house corporations at accomplishing these two main objectives.

The real estate lending operation is the most tangible program of assistance in the Fraternity's tool box to help chapters and house corporations achieve these objectives. A variety of lending programs are available to qualifying groups. The policy limit for the maximum real estate loan was increased this year to \$400,000. The loan fund, commonly known as the Chapter House Fund, was established at the 1907 Convention in Richmond, VA. It was initially funded by a per member head tax billed to chapters. This fund has evolved, but continues today as a valuable source of capital for groups that have maximized their attainable local financing yet need additional funding to achieve their real estate endeavors. An article about the 100th anniversary of the Chapter House Fund will appear in this winter's issue of the Shield & Diamond.

In the last ten years many additional programs have been developed to augment the lending operations, all with the intent to better assist groups with both the acquisition of competitive, quality real estate, and the effective management of these valuable assets. In recent years, house corporations and chapters have been providing data to the real estate department, which has helped immensely with:

 Understanding the overall scope and condition of the organization's housing stock

Seeing the changing realities in the student housing market

3. Improving assistance for chapters and house corporations with their effort to plan for and adapt to the evolving market place

Measuring progress as initiatives and programs are implemented



From the President of the Educational Foundation

My return to active duty in the service of Pi Kappa Alpha after more than a decade on the Board and then as president of the North-American Interfraternity Conference has given me the opportunity to view our beloved fraternity as both an insider and an outsider. Among my conclusions is this: by virtually any standard one selects, Pi Kappa Alpha has risen to the small handful of the most successful fraternities on the continent. Even a cursory review of the fraternity's annual report contained elsewhere in this publication gives evidence of that conclusion.

The quality of the fraternity's staff, its programs, its volunteers, and most of all its chapters, is exemplary. As all of us who have worked with chapters know, a strong chapter can occasionally grow seemingly by strength of its own will. But – a *consistently* strong chapter will invariably be characterized by systematic and unwavering alumni support and financial assistance.

The same is true for general (inter)national fraternities. 

Pikes in Print

An Uncommon Friendship

by Bernat Rosner (Cornell, Beta Theta '51) and Frederic C. Tubach

Holocaust survivor and novelist Bernat Rosner's novel, An Uncommon Friendship is a double memoir written with his close friend Frederic Tubach, the son of a Nazi officer. More a pair of parallel memoirs than the anatomy of a friendship, this unusual book recounts the stories of two friends.

"I suspect most people have seen the cadaver-like bodies of those who emerged from Auschwitz alive. I was one of them," Rosner says. He recounts being taken to Nazi concentration camps with his family as a healthy 12-year-old boy and then suffering through brutal beatings, typhoid, malnourishment, and cold.

He notes that he believed his survival at Auschwitz was a combination of luck, age and a natural survival instinct.


"I was young and my body .didn't require as much nourishment," he said. While 80 percent of his survival was chance, his will to live kept him going.

"I lived one-fourth of a mile away from the crematorium and even with the smell, we still couldn't bring ourselves to accept that death was the end," he said.

Along with delving into his past, the book also illustrates the present relationship between two of the least likely friends. It details the bond between Rosner and Tubach, despite fundamental differences in their upbringings.

Rosner and Tubach met in California in 1983 and slowly exchanged stories of childhoods in their respective European villages. With time and trust they were able to divulge the particulars of a deeper and more troubling kinship. As teenagers during World War II, they struggled on opposite sides of the Holocaust, Rosner as his Jewish Hungarian family's only survivor at Auschwitz and Tubach as the son of a German Army intelligence officer and a member of the Jungvolk, a pre-Hitler youth organization. Eventually they chose to explore their pasts together through the double memoir.

The book's structure is unusual, with both authors contributing to each chapter in alternating sections. Tubach's sections are written in the first person, while



Rosner's are written in the third person. Rosner said he chose to write the book in the third person because it helped him cope with a past he spent decades trying to forget. "I needed to separate myself from that 12-year-old boy."

Rosner, who moved to the U.S. shortly after the war, became general counsel of the Safeway Corp. in Oakland, California, a job from which he retired in 1993. He had lived his life trying not to talk or think about Auschwitz. Tubach also emigrated to the US after the war and became a professor of German at the University of California-Berkeley. He is now a professor emeritus.



Pike Academics Achieve Distinguished Posts

Past PiKA International President Appointed Interim Dean of Students at University of Virginia



Allen W. Groves
(Stetson, Delta Upsilon
'79), a University of

for the division of student affairs at U.Va., has been named interim dean of students, effective Aug. 6.

Groves will work with the current dean, Penny Rue, who will become vice-chancellor for student affairs at the University of California-San Diego in September, during the transition period in the Office of the Dean of Students. Groves will serve until a permanent dean is in place after a national search has been conducted.

Groves is a 1982 graduate of
Stetson University in Florida and a
1990 graduate of the U.Va. School
of Law. While he was in law school,
Groves served as an area coordinator
in residence life for two years. After
graduating, he spent the next 16 years
as a practicing attorney in Atlanta, 11 of
them as partner in two law firms, most
recently Seyfarth Shaw LLP.

"I am confident that Allen's commitment to students and to the University and the breadth of his leadership and managerial experience will contribute to the direction of the Office of the Dean of Students and to the student experience," said Patricia Lampkin, U.Va.'s vice president for student affairs. "He loves this place, and he loves the students. That's why he came back."

"I'm incredibly excited about this opportunity," said Groves. "U.Va. should offer the best undergraduate student experience in the country, and everything we do in the Dean of Students' office must measure up to that standard."

Since returning to U.Va. in May 2006 to develop and spearhead student affairs' cultivation and fundraising initiatives, he has also worked on policy matters related to student governance systems, including serving as a member of the Sexual Assault Board, and has been closely engaged in student

affairs planning and student leadership development.

Groves served for nine years on the Supreme Council including serving as international vice president, legal counsel and international president during 2004-2006. He was Pi Kappa Alpha's executive director before he entered law school, and currently serves as a member of Pi Kappa Alpha's Risk Awareness Foundation.

Utah Alum E. Gordon Gee Retakes the Helm At The Ohio State University



E. Gordon Gee (Utah, Alpha Tau '63) left his position as Vanderbilt University's Chancellor after seven years to return to The Ohio State University as president, a position he held from

1990-1997.

Gee has held more university presidencies than any other American. Prior to his appointment as Vanderbilt's chancellor on February 7, 2000, Gee was president of Brown University from 1997 to 2000, The Ohio State University from 1990 to 1997, the University of Colorado at Boulder from 1985 to 1990 and West Virginia University from 1981 to 1985.

Gee attended the University of Utah and graduated with a B.A. in history in 1968. After earning doctorates in law and education from Columbia University in 1971 and 1972, respectively, specializing in education law, Gee clerked for Supreme Court Chief Justice Warren Burger for one year.

After clerking for Justice Burger, Gee accepted a position as professor and associate dean at Brigham Young University in Provo, Utah. He became dean and professor at West Virginia University's law school in 1979 and the university's president two years later. At 37, he was one of the youngest chief executives in academia at the time.

After successful administrations at WVU, Gee moved on to the University of Colorado in 1985 then to the Ohio State University in 1990.

An Eagle Scout and recipient of the Distinguished Eagle Scout Award, Gee sits on the Board of Directors of Massey Energy, where he is a member of the Public and Environmental Policy Committee.

News of Bygone Days

125 YEARS AGO ... Only three chapters were active in 1882, Alpha (Virginia), Gamma (William and Mary) and Theta (Stewart College, formerly Southwestern at Memphis, now Rhodes College).

100 YEARS AGO ... From the June 1907 Shield & Diamond, in a letter from J. Graham Sale, Grand Historiographer: "For every one who was so fortunate as to be in Richmond there was one impression in common, and that was the fact that the Convention of 1907 was the greatest the Fraternity has ever held.... Could anyone have seen those prominent and busy men, distinguished in business and professional lives, give up their valuable time for our benefit and pleasure, and for that of the Fraternity, and not be impressed with the truth that Pi Kappa Alphaism at least lasts after graduation from college? Some of those men had not been actively connected with the Fraternity for a generation, yet they all gathered around the banner of the Garnet and Old Gold when she was unfurled in Richmond."

75 YEARS AGO ... From The October 1932 Shield & Diamond, in a message from William Alexander, the only living founder at that time: "We can never gather grapes from thorns or figs from thistles, and we are all to be congratulated upon our identifications with an organization whose fruits have been so rich and abundant - a society that has not impaired the loyalty of any member to his Alma Mater, but has, on the contrary, strengthened the bond that unites him to the college at which he has been educated, and at the same time cements and develops friendship not only with those of his own chapter, but with the great body constituting the entire membership of a nation-wide fraternity."

50 YEARS AGO ... On March 23, 1957, Epsilon Epsilon Chapter held their annual Suppressed Desires party at the house. Rooms were decorated to simulate different South Sea islands. Decoration included grass rugs on the floors, trees hanging from the ceilings, and several eight-foot bunches of bananas. Calypso music was piped to all the rooms. Food for the party included lobster on the half shell and punch served in coconut shells.

25 YEARS AGO ... In the September 1982 Shield & Diamond, Bobby Bowden was quoted as saying: "When I leave Florida State – about a hundred years from now – I'd prefer to be remembered more for building character in young men than for winning the national championship. But I believe we can do both. I believe that character is built through the hard work and perseverance that's required of young men playing on a quality football team."

LEGEND OF THE ALPHA THETA BELL

A tale of West Virginia days gone by.

Founders Day 2007 -Alpha Theta Chapter (West Virginia University)

hat a great Founders Day we had this year, the 139th anniversary of the Founding of Pi Kappa Alpha at 47 West Range, University of Virginia, Sunday Evening, March 1st, 1868, "For the establishment of friendship on a firmer and more lasting basis...." About 35 Alpha Theta Pikes were in attendance "to promote brotherly love and kind feeling," just as purposed 139 years ago. At least 15 alumni and over 20 from the undergraduate chapter were in attendance. The afternoon TV broadcast of the WVU-Cincinnati game turned out to be rather unexciting, as the Mounties ran away with it from the very first. But this just added to the fellowship, giving more opportunity for conversation, and for the actives, pledges and alums to really get to know each other. The alumni were very impressed with the fine group of young men now guarding the flame of Pi Kappa Alpha and of Alpha Theta at WVU. Very enthusiastic. Very bright. And very motivated to make and keep PiKA #1 at WVU.

The Bell

The highlight of Founders Day was undoubtedly the recounting of the mysterious origins of the Alpha Theta PiKA Bell by Brother Clyde Robert Cattrell '39. For the larger audience of PiKA International, let me put things in context by telling you a bit about the large, pure brass locomotive bell which is legendary on the WVU campus. The "PiKA Bell", as it is known at WVU, attended nearly every home football game for over 50 years, clanging out its victory cheers for each Mountaineer advance, and then leading a spontaneous "Victory Parade" for major wins down four blocks of High Street, then a block east, and then four blocks north on Spruce, and back to the dorms where the throng would break up and return home. The bell announced and led the Friday night pre-game celebration, held with a huge bonfire on the ROTC armory drill field directly across the street from the main campus dorms, women's hall and men's hall, and within a couple of blocks most of the sorority and fraternity houses. The Bell, by taking a couple of turns past the dorms and Greek houses, could spark a spontaneous gathering of thousands within minutes.

Indeed the PiKA Bell is powerful and is a legendary symbol of West Virginia University spirit, treasured not just by Pikes, but by a worldwide community of WVU alumni and by the citizens of Morgantown, This is attested to by John Samsell, a columnist in the Morgantown Dominion Post, who makes frequent nostalgic references to the Bell in his column, particularly during football season. Mr. Samsell is not a Pike. He is simply expressing the sincere appreciation of the thousands of WVU alumni and the citizenry of Morgantown who treasure the proud tradition of the PiKA Bell. Sadly, the bell has been missing from the campus for the past few years - stolen from the house during the chapter's absence. Both the actives and the alumni are seeking aggressively to return the Bell to its traditional role by this fall.

That said, you understand how excited we are to have Bob Cattrell's story, which had been lost from the memory of all for at least a couple of decades.

A Brother's Tale

Fighty-six years young, Brother Bob told the tale as only a master story teller could, but all the while preserving the secret of the identity of the trio who actually obtained the Bell from a mysterious individual called "Trane".

The story begins at Carnegie Tech in Pittsburgh, Brother Bob and Brother Art Weeks '38 paid a visit there while in town to buy shoes at a place known to be the best bargain for the fashionable wingtips of the day. The Carnegie Pike chapter had a large brass locomotive bell in the house. They used it for their dinner bell. Bob and Art were immediately seized by a fit of longing for just such a bell for Alpha Theta. Upon returning to Alpha Theta and telling their story of the Carnegie Pikes' bell, one of their brothers told them of a place where he believed such a bell might be obtained. An expeditionary force of six was soon formed, and they took off in a '36 Packard. For those who don't recall, this was the Cadillac of its day.



Bob says that he drove, and with him were Bill Phelps '35, Paul Dan Williams '38, Mike Montesinos '39, Dick Unbehaun '39, and a sixth whose name is being researched and will be writ "down in our book of memory". Well, sad for our crew, the expedition that night proved fruitless. But the idea did not perish. A few nights later, three of the original six sallied forth once again.

It was a cold, foggy, March night not long after Founders Day in 1940, when these three young men drove through pitch blackness and fog, this time in a capacious '39 Plymouth business coupe.

They took blankets to wrap the bell, rope, and two huge wrenches suited to their quest. They parked at their destination, made their way through the darkness, and succeeded, not without some difficulty, in acquiring their bell from one known simply as "Trane".

The temperature had dropped significantly since the trip down, and the return trip was through an ice storm. Two had to get out and push the trusty Plymouth over the highest hill (and in West 'By Gosh Virginia a "hill" is a small mountain), but they finally arrived at the chapter house, then located at 445 North Spruce Street, at about 2:30 a.m., where the entire chapter celebrated the bell, clanging it loudly, until cooler heads prevailed and they desisted before neighbors summoned Morgantown's finest.

Brother Bob has at least a couple of sequels to this tale, but they shall await another day. What shall remain forever sacred, never revealed to other than Alpha Theta initiates, never spoken above a whisper, are the names of the Noble Three who purchased the Bell. These and other mysteries shall remain buried. known only to the Loyal Order of The Keepers of The Bell of Alpha Theta.

The Evening Concludes

nd this, my brothers, has been the tale of the Bell, told by Brother C. Robert Cattrell at the Alpha Theta Founders Day Dinner, celebrated on March 3rd, 2007. Kudos and credit to Brother Jerry Hamill '57 who led the writer to Brother Bob and this wonderful contribution to the history of Alpha Theta, and many thanks to legacy initiate William R. Cattrell '67, Bob's son, for bringing his father to Founders Day so Bob could share his story. Many thanks also to Brother Mike Shook '77, who made all the arrangements.

McDonough also recalled a visit by singer Frank Lane, promoting his latest record. Herb Brown '38 married his wife, Mabelle, in the house in 1942. Many of the members went off to fight in WWII and some of them never returned. The names of a few Red Castle Gang members can still be read in a sidewalk... an indelible mark on a home that did the same for so many.

Hardy M. Graham (Mississippi, Gamma lota '30)



Former Union City, Tennessee Mayor Hardy M. Graham entered Chapter Eternal on June 17, 2007. In addition to his service to the community he had claimed as his home since 1946, he will also be remembered as a respected

businessman, veteran, farmer, philanthropist and attorney.

Union City Mayor Terry Hailey said Graham had a farreaching impact on this area and its residents.

"To me he was a true Southern icon whose generosity has benefited our parks and our schools with everything from scoreboards to scholarships," he said. "He's also the person who had the Southern accent against which all other Southern accents should be measured. As to his work ethic, I think I can sum it up best with this illustration: on the hottest, most humid day of the year, when even the people who mow yards professionally had gone inside, Hardy, when he was 80 years old, was mowing his own yard with a push mower."

He was born Oct. 21, 1912, in Meridian, Mississippi, graduated from high school in 1929 and attended "Ole Miss," the University of Mississippi, receiving both his bachelor of arts and bachelor of law degrees at the same time in 1934. As a senior, he was business manager of the Mississippian newspaper, while completing his dual degree requirements.

Graham was admitted to the practice of law in June 1934 in Mississippi, joining his father in the firm of Graham and Graham that same month. He enjoyed an active practice with his father for nine years and appeared before the U.S. Court of Appeals, the U.S. District Court of Mississippi and the U.S. Supreme Court in 1943 before taking the Civil Service exam for law in the state of Mississippi. He earned the highest grade on that test and went on to Washington, D.C., as an attorney for the Federal Trade Commission for almost a year before joining the U.S. Navy with the rank of lieutenant junior grade. He served in Europe as a gunnery officer

on a troop ship during World War II. Three days after the surrender of Japan, he was sent back to Washington as the legal assistance officer in the U.S. Naval Officer Separation Center until he was discharged in April 1946 as a full lieutenant.

He continued in the practice of law as a member of the law firm of Graham and Graham until he moved to Union City that same year and became the operating partner of the Union City Coca-Cola Bottling Co.

He was admitted to the practice of law in Tennessee soon after moving to this area.

Graham was the Union City Jaycees'Young Man of the Year for 1948 - the first member selected for that honor – and he began the Radio Appeal Program, an annual Christmas project of the Jaycees that was later renamed the Chimes for Charity fund raiser. It continues to meet the needs of needy citizens of this area during the holidays.

He was elected president of the Senior Chamber of Commerce in 1948 and held that office until he was elected mayor of Union City in June 1950. He served eight years in that capacity and was also named city judge.

He was both vice chairman and chairman of the Union City School Board for eight years and received an honorary life membership in the PTA. He is survived by his wife of 68 years, the former Cora Lee Poindexter, At his funeral, pallbearers were his grandsons: Richard Graham (Mississippi, Gamma lota '66), Stanford Graham and Hardy P. Graham Jr. (Mississippi, Gamma lota '85), his grandson-in-law, Emmett Morphis; his great nephews: Tom Hooper and Graham Butler; and family friend Allen Nohsey Jr. Honorary pallbearers were members of Union City Rotary Club and Danny Wall, Kenneth Cheatham, Robert Wood, Nick Dunagan, Richard James, Allan Nohsey Sr., Jim Thompson, John Warner and Tom Wade (Tennessee, Zeta '53).

Robert Dodd Pearson (Millsaps, Alpha lota '44)

Dr. Robert Dodd Pearson, prominent New York internist and Jackson, Mississippi native, entered Chapter Eternal on Thursday, June 21, 2007. He was 86 years of age.

He was born in Jackson on September 23, 1920, graduated with honors from Central High School in Jackson in 1939, and attended Millsaps College on a full academic scholarship. At Millsaps he was a member of Alpha lota Chapter of Pi Kappa Alpha, the Millsaps Singers and Alpha Epsilon Delta. He graduated with honors from Millsaps in 1943 with a bachelor of arts degree.

Following his graduation from Millsaps,
Pearson entered what was then the two-year
medical school of the University of Mississippi
then located on the Oxford Campus. He finished
at the head of his class at the Ole Miss Medical
School and thereafter transferred to the
University of Pennsylvania Medical School in

Philadelphia. He graduated from the University of Pennsylvania Medical School in 1946.

Following his graduation, Pearson served a rotating medical internship at the Presbyterian Hospital in Philadelphia. He also worked at the Camden General Hospital in New Jersey and the Pennsylvania Children's Hospital in Philadelphia. During his internship in Philadelphia, he was privileged to work with some of Philadelphia's most outstanding physicians, including Dr. Everett Koop, who later served as Surgeon General of the United States. Pearson completed his internship at the Presbyterian Hospital in June 1947.

In October 1947 he was ordered to active military service in the United States Army. His initial military assignment was to attend the U.S. Army's Medical Field Service School in San Antonio, Texas. Following graduation from the Medical Field Service School, he was assigned to the U.S. Army of Occupation's Tokyo Quartermaster Depot where he was in charge of a 24-bed dispensary. Following his promotion to captain in 1948, he was assigned to the 49th Tokyo General Hospital as the associate director of the Department of Internal Medicine. During that period he was one of three U.S. Army physicians assigned to provide medical care to Commanding General Douglas MacArthur and his staff and family, as well as other American military personnel being evacuated to Japan from China and the Phillipines.

Pearson was honorably discharged from the Army in July 1949 following two years of active military service and returned to the U.S. where he began applying for residencies in internal medicine. While awaiting acceptance to a residency program, he worked for a year in Jackson on the staff of the VA Hospital.

He was accepted for a residency in internal medicine in 1950 at the Bronx VA Hospital in New York where he completed a three year residency program in 1953. While completing his residency in New York, he worked at various times at the New York Hospital, Bellevue, Columbia Presbyterian Medical Center and Montifiore. Following the conclusion of his residency in 1953. Dr. Pearson established his practice in internal medicine at Scarsdale, New York, in Westchester County. He became a board certified internist in 1955. During a long and distinguished career in medicine, he served on the staffs of the White Plains Hospital, the Albert Einstein Medical Center in the Bronx (where he also served as a member of the faculty) and the Lawrence Hospital in Bronxville, New York.

Pearson was elected as an associate of the American College of Physicians in 1956 and in 1961 was named a Fellow of the American College of Physicians (F.A.C.P.).

He was an avid opera fan and a supporter of the Metropolitan Opera in New York City. Beginning in 1975 he served as the physician on


