HOW DID YOU GET INTO EDITING?

My older brother worked on film productions. While I was in high school, he'd invite me along to help. Film making quickly became a passion and when I realized I could get paid to do it, I was all in.

I did a little of everything while studying film at Chapman. From directing to camera work, what I liked most was how the story came together in the cutting room. Although film sets are very chaotic, for most of the crew it's a lot of sitting around. When I'm in the cutting room editing, there's always work to be done. I'm always tweaking sound, music, effects; trying to make a clean final product. I quickly realized that this form of storytelling perfectly aligns with my artistic ability.

HOW HAS YOUR WORK EVOLVED?

I've been in editing for 28 years. The storytelling has remained the same, but the technology we use to tell the stories is constantly changing. I've had to evolve with the times and learn new equipment. I've watched those who resisted change along the way stop getting work.

WHAT HAS MADE YOU SUCCESSFUL?

Hard work, dedication to my craft, and going the extra mile. I've been able to learn a lot about the different aspects of film making – which has helped get return-hires with directors. In this business, everyone knows you by what you did last. In the early years, a lot of the work I was able to get was because I was willing to work hard.

TELL ME ABOUT YOUR PIKE EXPERIENCE.

No one from my high school went to Chapman; I quickly figured out I was on my own and had to make my own way. Brian Woody '85 was in the film program with me and invited me to start hanging out with the guys. I quickly made friends and figured out they were a group of guys I could depend on.

The one thing that PIKE added to my college life was service. We were very involved in our community - soup kitchens, raising money for local shelters, working with kids. These experiences ended up being a great part of my time at Chapman.

BEYOND FILM AND TV, WHAT ARE YOU PASSIONATE ABOUT?

Cigars, Angels baseball, and music. My passion for the piano has led me to write a few scores that have been included in projects I've worked on.

ADVICE TO STUDENTS WANTING TO GET INTO ENTERTAINMENT:

If you want to be in the film industry, you must work really hard and don't give up. If people know you're a team player and that you'll put in the hours, eventually someone will recognize you.

You must also create a goal of where you want to end up. Along the way, you'll have jobs that don't align with your end goal, but if you keep the long-term focus that you want to write, do camera work, or post production; your winding path will eventually straighten out. In my case, I knew that I liked to tell stories, and editing would eventually allow me to do that.

FAVORITE QUOTE:

"Writing, of course, is writing, acting comes from the theater, and cinematography comes from photography. Editing is unique to film. You can see something from different points of view almost simultaneously, and it creates a new experience." – Stanley Kubrick





The 2019 Academy began smoothly – Pikes shuffled through the registration lines, meeting new people and catching up with brothers they had met at previous conferences. Their aim for the weekend was not only to learn information for their chapters to ensure continued growth and success, but to grow themselves as leaders for the future. This year's Academy featured 17 options for trending topics, 16 sessions of benchmarks that built upon each other in increments of four, and four general sessions. In one heartfelt session, mothers presented on the tragedy that befell their sons through hazing.

With a program-filled schedule, the opportunity for learning was easily and readily available to all who attended.

Three full days of learning new skills and networking with brothers provided the perfect opportunity for focusing on personal and professional success. TRENDING TOPICS

Conquer this Conference

Danny L. Ryan (Missouri S&T, Alpha Kappa '06), Chief Learning Officer

A conference is an opportunity to build relationships with extraordinary people who could have significant impact on your chapter, professional, and/or personal success. The focus of this session was networking and how to navigate the programming effectively. At a conference, it's not only what you know, but who you get to know.

Effective Alumni Relations

This session focused on the roles of the chapter alumni relations program and the alumni association in engaging alumni. In order to be effective, these groups should work in tandem to provide the right opportunities for alumni engagement. The four principles of alumni relations – Identification, Communication, Cultivation, and Solicitation – were covered in depth.

What Can My Advisors Do for Me?

The best of the best in Pi Kappa Alpha have great volunteer support. Topics included what chapters should expect of their alumnus volunteers and why they need alumni advisory boards; how to recruit and organize an alumni advisory board; and how chapters should we work with their boards. Alumnus volunteers in attendance gave inside perspective on how they could be effective for their represented chapters.

Managing Our Chapter House

Attendees discussed ways to improve their house operation. True case studies were presented on past successes and participants could take home plans to improve their current PIKE house.

Social Event Management: Back to Basics

This session was designed to provide participants with the basics not only for complying with the Fraternity *Standards* regarding hosting events with alcohol, but also how to plan for the risks created when alcohol is part of chapter activities or events. Content integrated strategies for successfully adopting new standards regarding hosting events with alcohol and focused on five key areas of event management.

Health and Safety Unplugged

This non-judgmental, open forum for undergraduate men provided an opportunity to ask questions, share concerns, and develop ideas for advancing PIKE health & safety within their chapters. This has become a very popular session at PIKE U events as Kim Novak led the conversation in a direct and authentic way with nothing off limits.

Creating an Upstander Environment in Your Chapter

"If someone had just said something..." is often the afterthought of leadership when an incident redefines the future of a chapter. Doing the right thing necessitates engaging the general membership of a chapter in the reduction of high-risk behaviors and creating an environment where members, not just leadership, will be upstanders and act or speak up.

Professional Recruitment

Kyle N. Pane (Nebraska-Omaha, Delta Chi '14), Director Of Expansion

In this session, attendees learned about the cold call and two-step interview process. Attendees also learned the strategy behind the process and witnessed a mock interview. This session featured a live-action look at this interview process by engaging three of the Fraternity's chapter consultants.

Recruitment Technology: ChapterBuilder

Matt Farrell, TechniPhi representative; Caleb J. Vander Lugt (Adrian, Zeta Lambda '14), Director of Membership Growth

This session dove into an intuitive, recruitment-based software that has the potential to take a chapter's recruitment to the next level. Some of Pi Kappa Alpha's best chapters have partnered with TechniPhi, the creators of ChapterBuilder, to ensure they continue to focus on year-round recruitment.

Recruitment Committee Strategic Planning

Joshua W. Murphy (Arizona State, Gamma Delta '07), Recruitment Advisor

Attendees learned that they shouldn't go into the fall season without an organized recruitment team. Topics included the basics of how to form a committee and get the most out of the team.

How to Run a Judicial Board

David T. Locke (Austin Peay State, Eta Tau '15), Director of Services-East

This session examined the importance of accountability. Attendees were introduced to the updated judicial board program and learned how to utilize the judicial board effectively to promote accountability within the chapter. Attendees also had the opportunity to witness a mock judicial board hearing, staffed by chapter consultants, and learned how to implement and execute an effective judicial board.

Enhancing Business Operations

Andrea White, Membership Reporting & Records Management

Always innovating and helping chapters reimagine how to strengthen and manage business operations, OmegaFi is proud to continue expanding the robust tools and features available for PIKE chapters. Attendees learned more about exciting enhancements and services from OmegaFi representatives.

Developing Friends -Selling Yourself & PIKE

Jacob F. Vanderlugt (Adrian, Zeta Lambda '14), Recruitment Advisor

This interactive session focused on first-time interactions with potential recruits. How do I present myself? How do I make a good introduction? What are good questions to ask? All these questions and more were discussed in this session.

Membership Development: What Do You Want from Your Program?

Chapter leaders must set up brothers for success after their undergraduate membership with Pi Kappa Alpha. This session detailed the value of having continuous member development and gave attendees the chance to discuss how to maximize their Fraternity experience. This session was the



first of a four-part curriculum focused on developing your members throughout their time in the chapter.

Membership Development: Structure Your Program

An effective membership development program comprises many different pieces. By having a framework to enact change and the right men to lead the charge, chapters can set themselves up for success. This session gave attendees the chance to enhance their membership development by outlining a structure for identifying ideal members to serve on the membership development cabinet.

Membership Development: Set the Calendar and Train the Trainer

After establishing an implementation strategy, it's time to set the dates and begin planning sessions. In order to take advantage of each session and successfully educate their members, the member development cabinet must be able to present information and engage in productive discussion. In this session, attendees built a strategy for scheduling and learned how to onboard the member development team.

Membership Development: Your Way Forward

It is important that attendees not only understand the concepts of member development but are also able to take these concepts and implement them at the chapter level. This session motivates and empowers attendees to take the concepts they have learned back to their respective chapters by outlining the changes necessary and providing an opportunity to hear from chapters that have had success with implementation. This session is the last of a four-part curriculum focused on developing your members throughout their time in the chapter.

Recent research has indicated that 70 to 80 percent of all diseases and illnesses are stress related, and is an inherent part of the college experience. This session informed attendees how to effectively manage stress, improve mental health and well-being, and achieve success as a student and leader.

GENERAL SESSIONS


General sessions provided opportunities for attendees to gather and learn from expert facilitators. The values preached in these sessions were some of the most vital, and they are attended by the entire conference. This year's sessions included recruitment, the deadly and horrific dangers of hazing, and a leadership lecture presentation by an esteemed PIKE alumnus.

LEADERSHIP LECTURE

The Academy welcomed Distinguished Achievement Award recipient Stephen C. Reynolds (Arkansas State, Delta Theta '67) to speak to the assembly. His speech captivated the audience with stories of his life ranging from his start as a child with a passion for hard work, and how important family life was to him. Brother Reynolds noted his time in Delta Theta Chapter as some of the most informative of his life. He referred to one of his chapter brothers and eventual advisor as someone he looked up to and who showed caring for everyone and led by example. Reynolds asked a question of the whole Academy, "What is your story, where did you come from?", and in his words, "My family is my story." Hard work does not just come from nowhere, it must be conjured up from the bottom of one's heart and drive. Reynolds left the audience with "20 Leadership Takeaways and Expectations". He mentioned that throughout his life, he was constantly challenged by the world around him, and that we do not walk alone in life. It is important for us, as friends, sons, and brothers, always to have someone behind you ready and willing to help.

Thomas R. Muenger (Toledo, Epsilon Epsilon '66), president of the Foundation for the Epsilon Epsilon Chapter at the University of Toledo, made a special presentation on behalf of alumni from the Epsilon Epsilon Foundation and gave an extremely generous gift of \$100,000 to the Epsilon Epsilon **Chapter Endowment Fund to support their PIKE** University attendance. Epsilon Epsilon alumni have made it a goal to fully sponsor 42 brothers per year to attend PIKE University events (30 to the Chicago Leadership Summit, four to the Chapter Executives Conference, and eight to the Academy or Convention). To reach full endowment. the **Epsilon Epsilon Chapter Endowment Fund will** need \$270,000. This gift brings the current balance to \$156,000, well over half of the goal. Epsilon Epsilon Chapter hopes to raise the remaining amount by the 2020 Convention.

Stephen C. Reynolds receives 2019 Distinguished Achievement Award

Stephen C. Reynolds (Arkansas State, Delta Theta '67) was awarded the Judge Elbert P. Tuttle Distinguished Achievement Award. Established in 1936, the Distinguished Achievement Award is presented annually to the alumnus member who has achieved the most distinguished resume in his vocation. profession or field of public service. It is named after Elbert P. Tuttle (Cornell, Beta Theta 1917), a veteran who served in both World Wars, then as Chief Justice of the Fifth Circuit Court of Appeals from 1961-68. and as a Senior Justice until his death in 1996. Under Tuttle's leadership, the Fifth Circuit became recognized as a leader in the fight against segregation.

Reynolds is president emeritus of Baptist Memorial Health Care, one of the largest not-for-profit health care systems in the United States, following his retirement as president and CEO in May 2014.

When he arrived at Baptist Memorial Health Care as an administrative resident in 1971, the organization had two facilities:


a hospital in downtown Memphis and a rehabilitation facility. At his retirement 43 years later, the organization had 14 affiliate hospitals and dozens of other entities.

Reynolds played a key role in the growth of the health care system. As the system grew, he rose in the ranks of the organization, becoming Baptist's fourth president and CEO in 1994.

Among his notable milestones as president and CEO, three new hospitals opened, new bed towers were added at three other hospitals, and significant investments were made in other facilities bringing high-level facilities and services to underserved communities.

In addition to continued growth, community service marked Reynolds' tenure as president and CEO.

Under his leadership, Baptist made the largest gift in the University of Tennessee's history and facilitated the creation of the UT-Baptist Research Park with the donation of the Baptist Medical Center building and land to the university and the Memphis Bioworks Foundation.

Baptist also established itself as Memphis' largest homeless health care provider with the addition of its signature community outreach program, the Baptist Operation Outreach health care van, and donated millions of dollars to dozens of schools, area nonprofits, and other organizations.

Reynolds has received local, regional, and national accolades for his accomplishments including recognition from the American College of Health Care Executives, Rotary International, Boy Scouts of America, the Tennessee Hospital Association, B'nai B'rith, Arkansas

State University, and Washington University School of Medicine.

Reynolds received his bachelor of science in business administration from Arkansas State University, his master's degree from Washington University, and an honorary doctorate degree from Union University.

Gamma Upsilon Chapter Initiate recognized as 2019 Robertson Most Outstanding Undergraduate

Matthew B. Wells (*Tulsa, Gamma Upsilon* '15) is the 2019 recipient of the Robertson Most Outstanding Undergraduate Award. Brother Wells is a 2015 initiate of Gamma Upsilon Chapter at University of Tulsa. He graduated summa cum laude in May 2019 with a bachelor of science degree in international engineering.

Wells was recognized as a TU Presidential Scholar, the most prestigious academic merit award given by the University. He earned numerous awards for his outstanding academic performance including the Sidney Born Award in Mechanical Engineering and the Steven J. Bellovich Collegiate Honor Medal. Wells was chosen by the Center for Space Nuclear Research (CSNR) to serve as an Undergraduate Research Fellow where he conducted cutting-edge nuclear research at the Department of Energy's Idaho National Laboratory. He was invited to join numerous honorary societies including Mortar Board Honor Society, Phi Eta Sigma, Tau Beta Pi and Order of Omega Greek Honor Society, where he served as president from 2017-18. He was named to the President's Honor Roll seven times, was honored as the 2017-2018 Outstanding Greek Scholar of the College of Engineering & Natural Sciences and served as a TU university ambassador.

Fraternally, Wells served Gamma Upsilon Chapter in numerous leadership positions including recruitment chairman, internal vice president and alumni relations chairman. In 2018, his chapter brothers voted him Pike of the Year and in 2019 he received the Michael J. Fitzgerald Lifetime Achievement



Award honoring the senior that has contributed the most to the chapter over the course of four years of membership. Wells served on the Interfraternity Council and was named Order of Omega Greek Man of the Year in 2018.

Brother Wells has contributed countless hours of community service supporting a variety of causes including the St. Phillip Neri Catholic Newman Center, Foodbank of Eastern Oklahoma, Up with Trees, Cystic Fibrosis Foundation, American Cancer Society and Crosstown Education Center. In 2018, he was honored by the TU community as a Jess Choteau Outstanding Senior, an award that recognizes seniors who demonstrate exceptional achievement in both academic and service endeavors.

Additionally, Wells founded the University of Tulsa Club Golf Team following the elimination of the men's varsity team. Tulsa was the only rookie team represented at the 2016 National Collegiate Club Golf Association National Championship.

Wells was unable to attend The Academy to accept his award in person due to his wedding to Eliza Michaud, which was scheduled for the same day. Instead, he addressed Academy attendees via video at the International Awards Luncheon. Much of Wells' speech paid tribute to long-time Gamma Upsilon Chapter Advisor Bill Vogle '66 – "Ironically, it was not until I began to try to emulate Bill's service to others and his Fraternity that I experienced the most growth. both as a leader and a person. I began to see my responsibilities and the tasks on my to-do list as opportunities to serve others and finally understood what it meant to 'be part of something bigger than myself'."

Wells is the son of Christine and Blake Wells of Wichita, Kansas. He is currently living in Philadelphia while completing an internship with Boeing Aerospace Company. He and Eliza are moving to Spain in August to study abroad for one year.

The Worst Call

In 2017, Rae Ann Gruver and Evelyn Piazza received similar phone calls only a few months apart. Now, they're sharing their sons' stories to make sure no other mom receives the same kind of call.

When Steve and Rae Ann Gruver dropped off their oldest son, Max, at college, on August 5, 2017, they told him they loved him, they would miss him, they were proud of him, and encouraged him to "go shine his light on the world".

Max was excited about the next chapter of his life. He wanted to join a fraternity to meet people, to get involved, and to take on a leadership role. Just 29 days after his parents dropped him off, the next chapter was cut short.

Max died as a result of alcohol-related hazing after new members were summoned to their chapter house for "Bible Study". Over the course of less than two hours, he was forced to take 10-12 "pulls" of 190-proof alcohol, bringing his blood alcohol content to 0.495 – over six times the legal limit.

He was showing obvious signs of distress, and members were monitoring his pulse and breathing, but no one called 911. Instead, he was left alone on a couch overnight.

On January 2, 2017, Evelyn and Jim Piazza family took what would be their final family photo with their son, Tim, included. It was taken in Pasadena, California,

at the Rose Bowl – their final family vacation.

One month later, Tim attended his first new member event, "The Gauntlet". After being forced to consume an excessive amount of alcohol, 18 drinks in 82 minutes, he fell down a flight of stairs into the basement of his fraternity house. After his fall, fraternity members failed to seek help until it was too late. Nearly 12 hours later, someone finally called 911. Tim died as a result of his injuries on February 4, 2017. Since 1961, there has been at least one hazing death a year. Last summer, several families, including the Gruvers and the Piazzas, joined together to form an anti-hazing coalition to spread their message, expanding awareness about the impacts of hazing, and working to stop hazing once and for all.

During the 2019 Academy, the 528 attendees had the unique opportunity to hear Rae Ann and Evelyn speak about Max and Tim, the impacts of hazing, and how to stop hazing. As each mother spoke, an audible silence filled the room, and the audience was moved to tears.

Before addressing the role listeners could play in the prevention of hazing, Mrs. Piazza took the opportunity to remind them that their lives are important to those around them.

"You are very loved. You may not hear it very often but know that you are very loved. Your absence from people's lives would be devastating to them. Now remember, the person next to you is just as loved by their family and friends. Please listen to us, and don't haze."

Hazing is any activity expected of someone joining or participating in a group that humiliates, degrades, abuses, or endangers them regardless of the person's willingness to participate. Hazing does not promote loyalty or offer a sense of accomplishment. In fact, studies show that the opposite holds true and 75% say hazing drove them apart within their new member class and more so in the chapter. Hazing is illegal in nearly every state.

Fraternity establishes partnership with JED Foundation

Discussions about mental health are some of the most crucial conversations happening on college campuses across North America. According to new research published by the American Psychological Association, over one-third of college students are impacted by mental health challenges, and 75% of mental health conditions develop by age 24. Additionally, men are 3.5 times more likely to die by suicide than women.

With over 14,000 undergraduate students, the Fraternity realizes these statistics aren't just numbers – these are our members and their peers. We serve a unique space and have the opportunity to help our members by working to combat the growing mental health crisis.

In an effort to reduce the stigma around mental health problems and to provide members with the tools and resources necessary to help someone in need, Pi Kappa Alpha is proud to announce a partnership with The Jed Foundation (JED), a leading nonprofit that exists to protect emotional health and prevent suicide for teens and young adults. Together with JED, the Fraternity launched the PIKE Lifeline, an online mental health resource center that provides students with information about emotional health issues and the specific resources available on their campus. It also offers a confidential mental health self-screening tool. PIKE Lifeline was made possible by generous donors to the Pi Kappa Alpha Foundation's Blake Nicholas Caummisar Memorial Fund which provides funding for programs and initiatives to promote wellness and a healthy lifestyle for all Pikes.

"This resource is the direct result of the great love and dedication of many people wanting to memorialize our son. Through this service, our tragic loss will be turned into a tangible resource for others who are suffering and don't know where to turn." said Beth and Stan Caummisar, parents of **Blake Caummisar** (Mississippi, Gamma Iota '12).

In addition, for the first time ever at a PIKE University event, attendees at the 2019 Academy had the opportunity to attend a general session about mental health where they heard from Director of Health & Safety Kim Novak and firsthand accounts from members of Mu Epsilon Chapter (California State-Fullerton) and Zeta Chi Chapter (Missouri State).



REGIONAL RECRUITMENT WORKSHOPS

The Ultimate Recruitment Experience

Are you looking to improve your chapter's recruitment program? The International Fraternity offers several recruitment resources to all chapters and colonies, including recruitment-specific handbooks, scripts for interviews and presentations, chapter self-assessments, recruitment visits, and regional recruitment workshops.

Additionally, the director of membership growth oversees 100 recruitment visits

annually to assist chapters with their recruitment programs.

WHAT ARE REGIONAL RECRUITMENT WORKSHOPS?

Three regional recruitment workshops are hosted each year across North America. The goal of a regional workshop is to provide chapters the opportunity to create a chapter-specific recruitment program.

During 2018-19 the International Fraternity hosted three regional workshops in Fullerton, California; Jacksonville, Florida; and Stillwater, Oklahoma. Attendees from the Jacksonville and Stillwater workshops shared some thoughts:

"One of the biggest takeaways was having the opportunity to create a recruitment schedule. We had everything planned out in advance. In addition, we obtained new ideas from the facilitators and attending chapters for generating names. They gave us advice based on their own personal experiences.

I would 100% tell invited chapters to attend and bring as many guys as possible. At a recruitment workshop you're going to get the most relevant, and specific advice. Attending can help bring a chapter to the next level."

– Dakota Ellmore (Central Oklahoma, Lambda lota '17) These day-long recruitment workshops consist of a chapter assessment, discussing PIKE's basic recruitment concepts, creating unique selling points, combatting "no" factors, and role-playing various scenarios. The content is similar to what an undergraduate member would learn at a PIKE University event without having to travel as far.

One chapter serves as the host chapter, and hosts the workshop on its campus. This chapter is very important to the success of a workshop, working closely with the director of membership growth to organize a meeting space. Attending chapters from the surrounding area travel to the host university for the afternoon.

Regional recruitment workshops provide opportunities to create a detailed, chapter-specific recruitment plan that will bring your chapter's recruitment program to the next level and provide an opportunity to practice strategies and skills taught through roleplaying and various other exercises. Be on the lookout for this opportunity, and take advantage of it whenever it is offered.

Whether it is attending PIKE University, requesting a recruitment visit, or attending a regional recruitment workshop, improving your chapter's recruitment program is vital to the long-term success of our beloved Fraternity.

Raised for Philanthropy Every day, countless chapters, undergraduate leaders, and alumni take great pride in fulfilling our mission. The data you see and the stories you read in these pages are proof *we are developing men of integrity, intellect, and high moral character.*

The annual Fraternity and membership statistics remain impressive. Together, Pi Kappa Alpha chapters comprised the following in 2018-19:

- 216 chapters and colonies consisting of 14,304 undergraduate members, initiating 5,677 men, and maintaining an average chapter size of 64
- Seven new chapters receiving their charters
- Brothers raising \$3,245,389 for philanthropy and committing over 297,000 hours of community service
- 3,186 members participating in valuable PIKE *University* programming and 109 chapters completing an official PIKE Work Day project

Pi Kappa Alpha witnessed countless alumni continue to *foster a truly lifelong fraternal experience* with:

- 180 alumni advisory boards consisting of 1,421 volunteers
- 157 alumni associations with over 832 association leaders
- 160 house corporations composed of 793 volunteers

Pi Kappa Alpha sprinted into its 151st year on a high note, having recently concluded its sesquicentennial celebration and inched ever closer to initiating its 300,000th member. While our Fraternity remains unquestionably one of the best fraternities in North America, there remain numerous opportunities for improvement.

The statistics shared above, specifically in terms of number of chapters and colonies, total undergraduate membership, and initiations, fell to their lowest levels in nine years. These are troubling developments, especially in an era when we are seeing more men joining fraternities than ever before.

Two of the drivers for these developments: complacency and self-inflicted wounds.

Complacency – While certainly not all, or even a majority, far too many Pikes are waiting for others to step up instead of taking the initiative themselves. Fraternities were not meant to succeed in a *what's in it for me* environment. Next time, when that call comes – take charge and step up! Set the tone of accountability within your chapter; continue to recruit the most, best men; and provide the alumni guidance our young brothers need to thrive. Don't wait for someone else to do it. Success in the fraternity world is about will, and ΠKAs have never lacked the will to succeed.

Self-inflicted wounds continue to deprive our current members and those desirous of joining our ranks from having a true PIKE experience. Record numbers of chapters have fallen silent in recent years, leaving a residual impact for years to come – be it brothers lacking the support and friendship from which so many of us have benefitted, or leaving alumni without a place to call home.

In an era when fraternities are being challenged in countless ways, including challenges to our single-sex status by high profile universities (including Harvard and Yale), local zoning restrictions, overly punitive and antiquated judicial processes, deferred recruitment, university-imposed Greek taxes, restrictive joining practices, and declining male enrollment, among others – we cannot afford to stand in the way of our own progress.

There is no shortage of issues Pi Kappa Alpha deals with on a daily basis. Some are out of our control, but self-inflicted wounds such as hazing, alcohol abuse, and assault can be addressed by each and every one of us.

As I watch our outstanding young brothers wrestle with and propose solutions to new member education and ongoing development; the elimination of hard alcohol at chapter houses; increased accountability measures; and the demand for additional education through the *True* PIKE *Experience* and PIKE *University* – I am reassured about how bright of a future there is for Pi Kappa Alpha.

Like many of you, when I see those letters ΠKA, I am reminded:

- There is no other experience that develops men, both young and old, as well as we do.
- Of all the great times spent at the chapter house with brothers, winning intramural championships, excelling in the classroom, being leaders on campus, and treating others with respect.
- Of having life altering one-on-one conversations with brothers when they are going through difficult times, and positively impacting that person for the rest of their life and yours.

We should all be continually inspired by chapters such as:

- Delta Nu Chapter at Wayne State, which since 2012, has hosted a memorial 5k in honor of a brother who passed away from brain cancer. Held each May, the race has resulted in a total of \$51,000 being raised for the American Brain Tumor Association.
- Gamma Rho Chapter at Northwestern, which hosted its inaugural charity concert benefiting the National Alliance on Mental Illness (NAMI), the nation's largest grassroots mental health organization. The men raised \$6,700 during this one day event.
- Our Alpha Alpha Chapter at Duke, which hosted its annual Shave for Schreiber, Buzz for Bobby philanthropy event in memory of Brother Bobby Menges. To date, the chapter has raised over \$230,000 for the Menges family's "I'm Not Done Yet Foundation".

On a recent flight, I was sitting next to a gentleman whose brother was a Pike at Western Michigan University, home to our Epsilon Psi Chapter. He shared with me that his brother had passed away from cancer recently, leaving behind a beautiful wife and two outstanding daughters. Not only did he say that the group of men with whom his brother was associated had gone on to tremendous personal and professional success, but that following the funeral, these brothers led by Dan Watkins '93 and Dave Merritt '92 pledged to his widow that their daughters would never pay a dime for college. In the five years since his passing, they have raised over \$90,000 toward that goal.

I know that this and so much more is what Pi Kappa Alpha is all about.

As our wise brother from Presbyterian College once said, Yesterday is gone forever; tomorrow is yet to be; but the destiny of Pi Kappa Alpha rests today with **each and every one of us**.





David Peterson found his vocation through volunteering with Habitat for Humanity projects at home and at Indiana State.

When casual observers look at a Habitat for Humanity house, they may see just a house.

That's exactly what Indiana State senior **David Peterson** (Indiana State, Theta Omicron '16) saw. That is, until the Zionsville native became a volunteer with the organization during high school.

"My parents have always been about giving back to the community. They're both very handy and they do a lot of home projects, so I guess that's where I got my hands-on skills for doing home improvements," said Peterson, a construction management major and president of Pi Kappa Alpha Fraternity at Indiana State. "The first interaction I had with Habitat for Humanity was through my church, which sponsored a house. I was too young to volunteer, but I remember my dad telling me he was going to volunteer. He also told me what Habitat for Humanity was all about."

After graduating from high school, Peterson enrolled at St. John Fisher College in Rochester, New York where he majored in general business. He played lacrosse and was awarded the service scholarship, which required completion of 130 hours of community service his freshman year.

"They required me to pick one nonprofit organization to work with and that's when I picked Habitat for Humanity, because I thought it would be a fun experience and good life skills to learn — working with tools and doing home improvements," he said.

After his first semester, though, he still didn't know what he wanted to do after college. "I knew from taking general business classes that I didn't want to sit behind a desk all day and be stuck in an office. I also knew after doing over 100 hours of community service with Habitat for Humanity, I enjoyed the experience a lot," he said. "I liked building and working on the job sites. My dad and I talked a little bit about construction management and about how there would be a lot of jobs where I wouldn't be stuck behind a desk."

Peterson began looking to transfer to an in-state construction management program when his father, who is an Indiana State alumnus, suggested his alma mater. It was the perfect fit.

"Through the construction management program at ISU, I had the opportunity that fall to go to the Associated Schools of Construction Region III competition in Chicago as part of the design-build team," he said. "Just starting out at ISU, this competition gave me real-life experience working with a team and learning from them through a project that we presented. It was also a great opportunity because there was a career fair there, where got my first interview and internship with Lithko Contracting, a concrete subcontractor based out of Indianapolis."

Since becoming a Sycamore, Peterson joined the Construction Management Club and Sigma Lambda Chi, the honorary construction society. This fall, he turned his summer internship with Weddle Bros., a general contractor in Bloomington, Ind., into a job.

He also connected his service for the Habitat for Humanity in Boone County to the Wabash Valley Habitat for Humanity. Peterson pitched in on two houses south of campus and joined the Wabash Valley board in May 2017 as the Indiana State representative and voting member.

"I have had some experience volunteering on-site since I came to college, but serving as a member of their board is a new experience, seeing the behind-the-scenes of a



nonprofit," he said. "I already know what they produce, but being on the board I get to see how they get there, get the money and select families."

Peterson also helps the Habitat staff work with Indiana State to get volunteers and work with professors on projects, whether it's building a playset or sheds or other small projects.

"When I started with Habitat for Humanity, I was a volunteer working on building a house for a family. You just think about what you're doing to help that one family, but Habitat for Humanity, especially Wabash Valley Habitat for Humanity, does more than just building homes for families," he said. "They're helping develop neighborhoods and communities, especially in the Ryves Neighborhood. They're restoring and doing one-day projects for houses that can really impact families and to build a sense of community that will raise people's spirits."



Fire and Fortitude: The US Army in the Pacific War, 1941-1943

by John C. McManus (Missouri, Alpha Nu '84)

The exploits of the U.S. Marines in the Pacific during World War II are legendary, and deservedly so. Yet the achievements and heroism of the U.S. Army, which actually did most of the fighting and dying there, are almost entirely overlooked, according to John C. McManus, an acclaimed historian of World War II. Now, McManus corrects the oversight with Fire and Fortitude: The US Army in the Pacific War, 1941-1943, which was published by Dutton Caliber in July, 2019 as the first of two volumes.

McManus's gripping and wide-ranging account of the crucial first two years of the Pacific War carries readers from the shock of Pearl Harbor through the Bataan Death March in the Philippines, the massive build-up of American troops in Australia, the savage battles to



take back island outposts occupied by the Japanese, and finally the turnabout at Makin in the Gilbert Islands, with the U.S. Army in the Pacific about to reach its peak fighting capacity.

McManus's engrossing narrative includes celebrated commanders like Douglas MacArthur as well as many rank-and-file heroes. He does full justice to the war's scope and complexity, which goes far beyond military strategy and tactics to include economics, nationalism, colonialism, racism, and morality. In the Pacific, the Army glimpsed many of its future challenges and trends, and the United States made a fundamental geopolitical pivot from Europe to Asia, with profound consequences that endure today.



John C. McManus, Ph.D., is the award-winning author of thirteen previous critically praised books about World War II, including *The Dead and Those About to Die* and *September Hope*. He is Curators' Distinguished Professor of U.S. military history at Missouri University of Science and Technology and is currently in residence at the U.S. Naval Academy as the Leo A. Shifrin Chair of Naval and Military History.

McManus earned a Ph.D. in history from the University of Tennessee in 1996. He earned a master of

arts degree in history in 1991 and a bachelor of journalism degree in 1987, both from the University of Missouri-Columbia.

He received the 2012 Missouri Governor's Award for Excellence in Teaching and was named the 2012 Research Fellow by the First Division Museum at Cantigny Park. In 2007, he was named to History News Network's list of Top Young Historians in 2007 and in 2008 he received the Missouri Conference on History Book Award for Alamo in the Ardennes: The Untold Story of the American Soldiers Who Made the Defense of Bastogne Possible.



Distinguished Senator Thad Cochran enters Chapter Eternal

Seven-term Senator and faithful Brother leaves a legacy of service

Villiam Thad Cochran entered Chapter Eternal on May 30, 2019. Born in Pontotoc, Mississippi on December 7. 1937, into a family of educators, his parents modeled for him lives dedicated to public service. Growing up mostly in the small town of Byram, Mississippi, Cochran was an Eagle Scout, member of the 4-H. high school valedictorian. and student-athlete. Upon arrival at the University of Mississippi, Brother Cochran was initiated into the Gamma Iota Chapter of Pi Kappa Alpha on February 10, 1956. During his tenure, Cochran served the chapter as president and treasurer, was elected vice president of the student body, served as company commander in the Naval Reserve Officers Training Corps, and was selected as Ole Miss' head cheerleader. Following graduation in 1959, Brother Cochran joined the United States Navy before returning to the University of Mississippi to study law. After practicing for several years in Jackson, Mississippi, Cochran was elected to the U.S. House of Representatives in 1972. He served three terms in the House representing Jackson and portions of southwest Mississippi. Cochran was elected to the U.S. Senate in 1978, becoming the first Republican to represent Mississippi in the Senate in nearly 100 years. Brother Cochran served seven terms in the Senate and was the 10th-longest-serving senator in U.S. history. Cochran most recently HAD CO served as chairman of the Senate Appropriations Committee, a position he held from 2005-07 and again from 2015-18. He also chaired the Senate Agriculture Committee from 2003-05. In STATES April 2006, he was selected by Time magazine as one of America's 10 Best Senators.



Thad Cochran (Mississippi, Gamma lota '56)

Thad Cochran was a champion for Pi Kappa Alpha throughout his life. Brother Cochran generously invested and served as honorary chairman for the *Seizing the Opportunity* - Campaign for Pi Kappa Alpha, which culminated in the construction of Pi Kappa Alpha Memorial Headquarters at 8347 West Range Cove in Memphis, Ten-

nessee in 1988. He was a trustee of the Pi Kappa Alpha Foundation from 1979-80 and was a guest speaker at numerous international workshops and conventions.

Cochran is often referred to as a statesman, exhibiting the virtues of patience, integrity, and compassion while at the same time employing both his wealth of accumulated knowledge and his native rationality to lead his decisions. A devoted father, husband, music lover, tennis player, friend, and PIKE, he leaves a legacy of public service to all whose lives he's touched.

"With Senator Thad Cochran's passing, Mississippi and the nation lost a giant public servant, and Pi Kappa Alpha lost a terrific brother. Without question, Pi Kappa Alpha helped shape Thad Cochran as a man and a leader. His undergraduate experience as treasurer and president at Gamma Iota Chapter taught him valuable lessons that he carried into public service later in life. He understood fraternity and brotherhood as highest ideals, and he championed them throughout his life. During my service as his chief of staff, we often discussed the Fraternity, its mission, and our various experiences. He loved Pi Kappa Alpha and genuinely valued his membership. Throughout his five decades on Capitol Hill as both a House and Senate member, he was always very generous in making time to host, address, and attend alumni and chapter events, especially Congres-

sional Founders Day in Washington, D.C. And he welcomed the opportunity to greet PIKE undergraduates and alumni alike when they would visit Capitol Hill. I will always cherish his support and encouragement of my service as Pi Kappa Alpha national president – that happened to coincide with the time I served on his staff. Thad Cochran was, indeed, a very special brother in Pi Kappa Alpha. He is truly one of our legends," stated Past International President William N. LaForge (Delta State, Zeta Beta '96).

Cochran is survived by his wife, the former Kay Bowen Webber; one brother, Nielsen Harris Cochran; two children, Thaddeus Clayton Cochran and Katherine Holmes Cochran, and three grandchildren.

Dr. Robert H. McGaughey III entered Chapter Eternal on June 14, 2019. McGaughey was professor emeritus and retired chairman of the Murray State University's Department of Journalism and Mass Communications.



As a student at Murray State, he was a member of the Murray State ROTC, a student athlete, and an active member of the staff of the Murray State News. After graduation he began his master's degree studies

in journalism and became the first master's graduate of the journalism program. He received his doctorate in mass communications from Ohio University.

An honor graduate of the MSU ROTC program, he served two years on active duty, including a tour in Vietnam and 18 years with Kentucky's 100th Army Reserve Division, from which he retired in 1985 with the rank of major.

His nine ribbons and medals include the Meritorious Service Medal, the Air Medal, and the Vietnamese Service Ribbon. He received the Minaret Award for the publication *The News of the Century* (100th division) as one of the top newspapers in the Fifth Army area.

In 1969, he joined the faculty at Murray State University as adviser to *MSU News* and as a journalism instructor. He became chairman of the department in 1974.

He has been published in more than 40 publications or presentations, including national conferences of the Association for Education in Journalism and Mass Communications, the Broadcast Education

PAT BOWLEN (Oklahoma, Beta Omicron '63)



Pat Bowlen, legendary owner of the Denver Broncos, and Pi Kappa Alpha Distinguished Achievement Award recipient, entered Chapter Eternal on June 13, 2019.

Bowlen's passing came less than two months before he was inducted to the Pro Football Hall of Fame on August 3. During Bowlen's tenure, the Denver Broncos, one of the NFL's most successful franchises,

won 333 regular season games, third in the league behind New England (346) and Pittsburgh (334) and recorded a .598 winning percentage, fifth-best in American pro sports. The team won 13 AFC West titles, posted 21 winning seasons and reached the playoffs 18 times, and won three Super Bowls, 32, 33, and 50, under Bowlen's leadership,

Bowlen was a passionate hands-on owner who was beloved by his players and employees. He donated more than \$30 million to Denver area charities. He stepped away from running day-today operations of the club in 2014 due to Alzheimer's disease. "Pat Bowlen had a competitive spirit with a great sense of humor," the Bowlen family said in a statement. "We will forever remember his kindness and humility."

In 1999, Bowlen was interviewed for the Shield & Diamond. Thinking back on his days at Beta Omicron Chapter, he said, "The things I learned as a member of the Fraternity, with all those different guys with all those different agendas, help me to this day. Looking back on the business career I've had, a lot relates to the experiences I had as a college student and a member of Pi Kappa Alpha. What I learned is that you've got to have an agenda. You 've got to decide what you want to do with your life and stick with that." His father, Paul D. Bowlen, was initiated into Pi Kappa Alpha at Beta Omicron Chapter in 1935.

In 1988, Bowlen was inducted into the Pi Kappa Alpha Foundation's Order of West Range, and in 2000, he received the Fraternity's Distinguished Achievement Award.

Bowlen is survived by his wife, Annabel, and their five children, Patrick Dennis III, John Michael, Brittany Alexandra, Christianna Elizabeth, and Annabel Victoria; his first wife, Sally Parker, and their two children, Amie Klemmer and Beth Bowlen Wallace; his brothers Bill Bowlen and John Bowlen; and sister Mary Beth Jagger. During his years as chair, the department grew from 45 majors to more than 400 and received accreditation from the ACEJMC. The department provided 16 percent of all seniors selected to Who's Who in American Colleges and Universities at Murray State.

McGaughey received several recognitions and awards for his work at Murray State. In 1984 he was named Max Carmen Outstanding Teacher of the Year by the Student Government Association. He was named Distinguished Professor of the Year by the Murray State Alumni Association in 1990. He served on Epsilon Lambda's alumni advisory board and house corporation, and the International Fraternity awarded him the Volunteer of the Year Award for 2015-16.

He was selected 8 times to attend the International Radio and Television Society (IRTS) faculty-industry seminar in New York City. In 1987, he was named the Frank Stanton Fellow of the IRTS as the distinguished broadcast educator in the U.S.

Active as an advisor to student organizations and media organizations, he received several recognitions from groups such as Pi Kappa Alpha Fraternity, including the Pi Kappa Alpha Distinguished Alumnus in 1977, Omicron Delta Kappa Advisor of the Year; and the Kentucky Press Association Distinguished Service Award in 1989. He served for 10 years as executive director of the West Kentucky Press Association, and two terms as education representative on the KPA board of directors. In 2012, he was inducted into the Kentucky Journalism Hall of Fame.

He was named the Boss of the Year by the Murray Chapter of Professional Secretaries International in 1989. He retired as chair in 1997, but continued to teach, write and speak, often with his long-time associate professor Robert Valentine. Together they were known as "The Communicators" or, to their fans, "Dr. Trey and Dr. Vee."

He was co-head of MSU's Elizabeth Residential College from 2000 to 2002 but continued to serve on the faculty of Elizabeth College and presented his last program there in March 2019.

Patrick Smith entered Chapter Eternal on May 28, 2019. He possessed a love and commitment to the State of Nevada, the Las Vegas ommunity, and the University of Nevada Las Vegas. Smith earned
